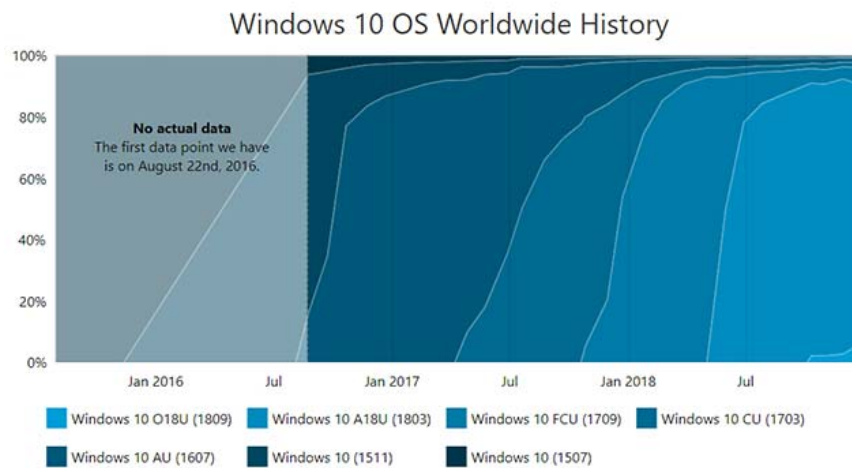


# The Upgrade Assistant feature may soon return to Windows 10

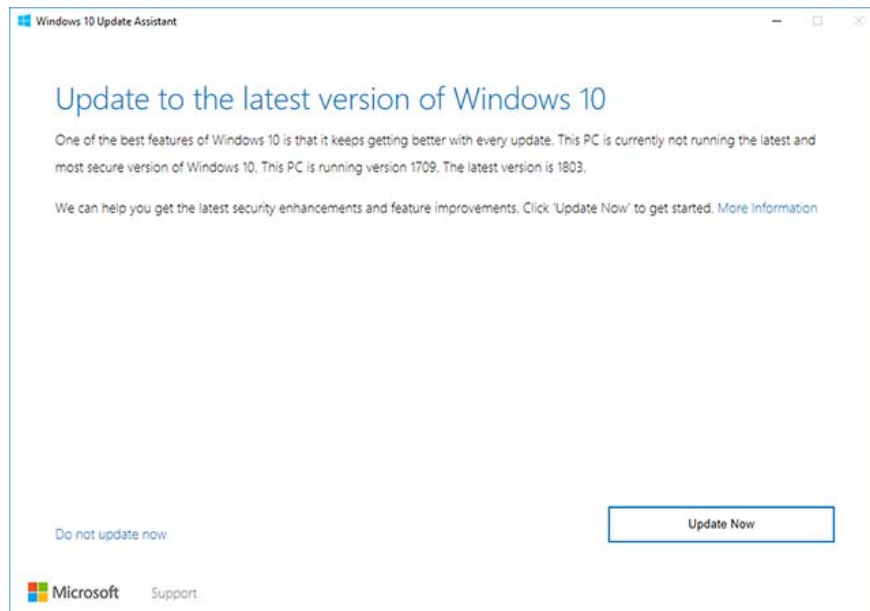

According to analytics site AskWoody.com, Microsoft may be ready to create a boost in supporting users to switch to the latest version of Windows 10, after the site found Microsoft updated the KB article. 4023814 on December 24, 2018, in which the description contains a notice that will assist users to install the latest version of Windows 10. Specifically, the information stated in the article is as follows:

*'If you are currently running Windows 10 version 1507, version 1511, version 1607, version 1703 or version 1709, your computer will automatically be connected to Windows 10 Update Assistant. You can then receive a message stating that your device must have the latest security updates installed and then your device will be updated to the new version. '*

Microsoft has been accused of using 'Dark Patterns' in update announcements, and Windows 10 Upgrade Assistant may make it most difficult for users to realize that they can reject an update to the session. New version of Microsoft. Some people have expressed concerns about switching to Windows 10 October version, while this version still contains too many errors from simple to serious, including causing data loss in the system. .



However, according to Microsoft representatives, the Windows 10 October update has now been extensively tested over a period of several months, making it one of the safest, most valuable versions available at the moment. And perhaps it is better that users should switch to using this update instead of trying to wait for the 19H1 version to be officially released in April next year.
