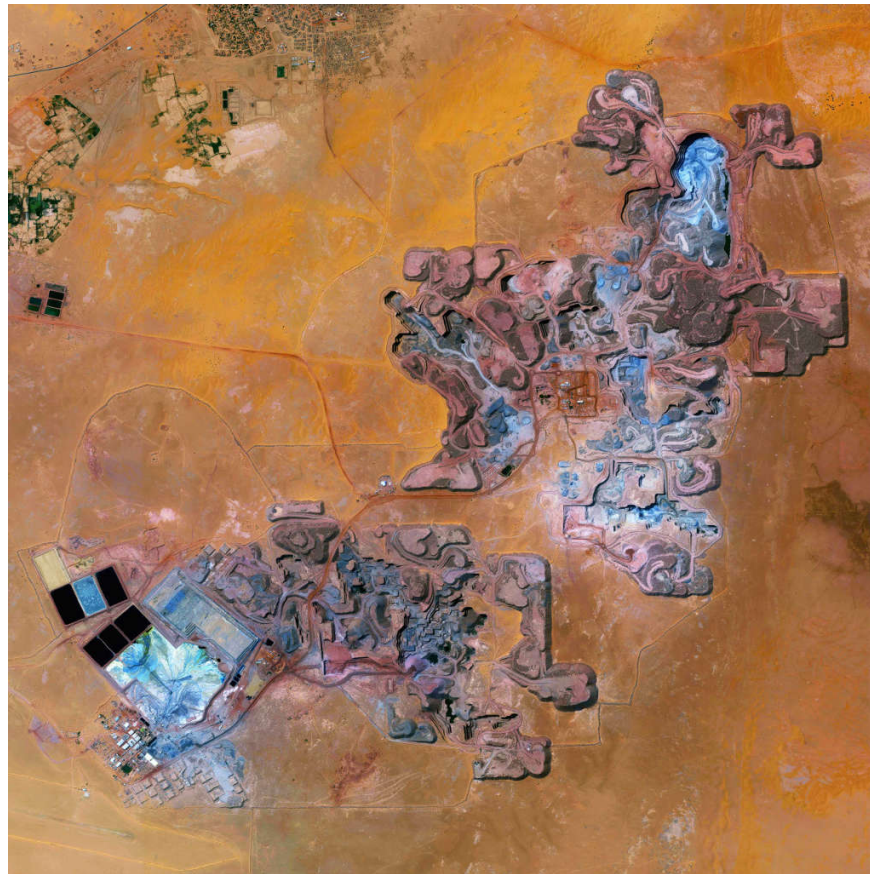

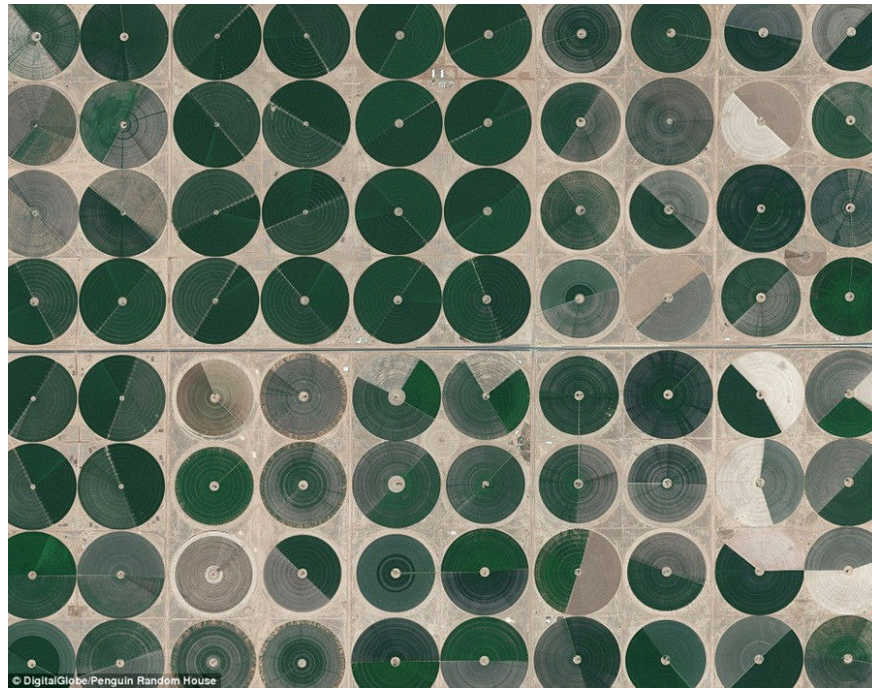
From above, the image of the Earth has a fantasy color, completely new compared to what you have ever seen.

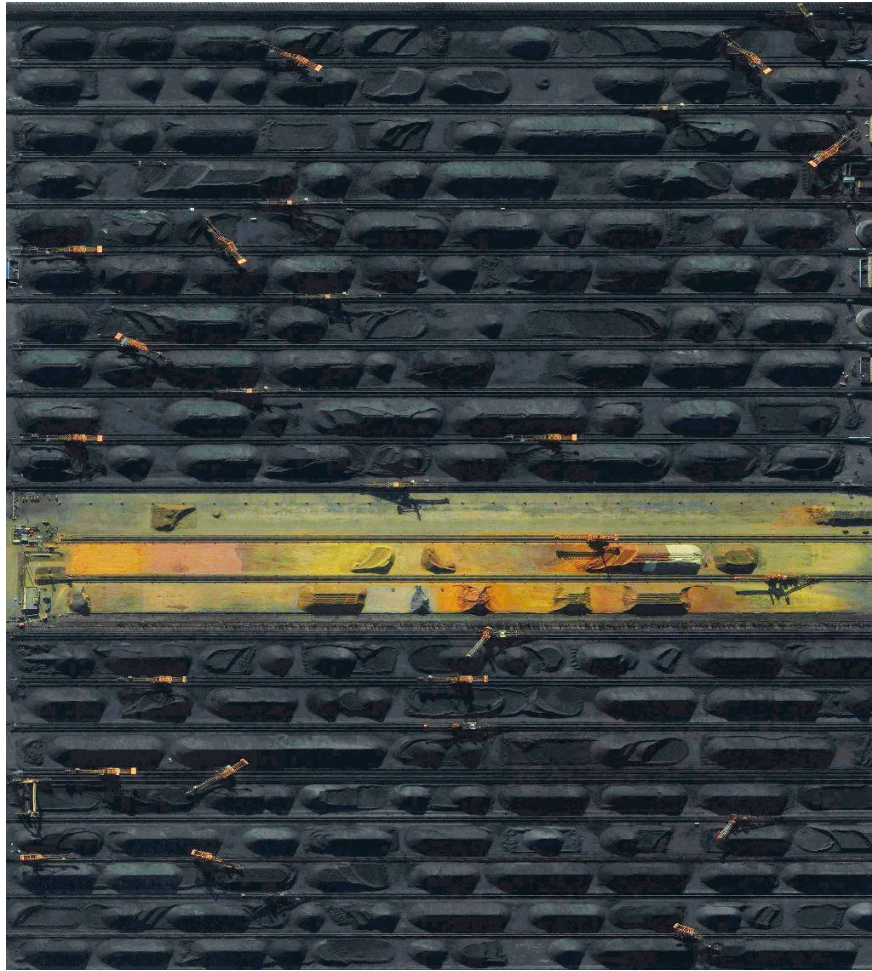
Opened diamond mining mine Mir, Siberia, Russia. The mine was deactivated after 44 years of diamond exploitation and became the second largest artificial pit in the world with a depth of 525m and a diameter of 1,200m.



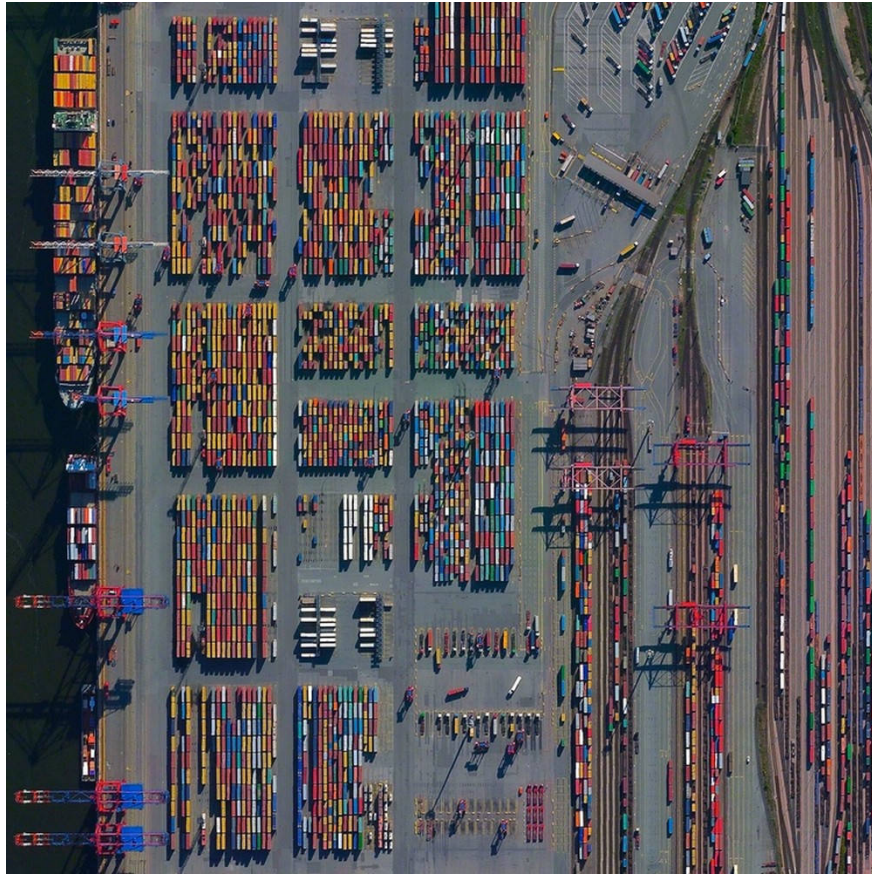
Neves-Corvo mine in Castro Verde, Portugal with giant water holes formed by copper and zinc mining.

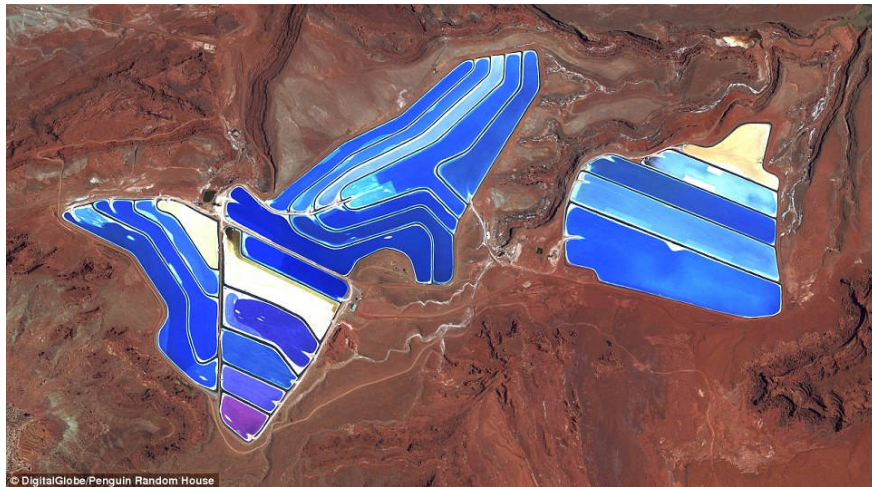

Jeongwang-dong, an industrial park in Ansan city, South Korea. The green of the factories is made of aluminum to save costs and prolong the life.



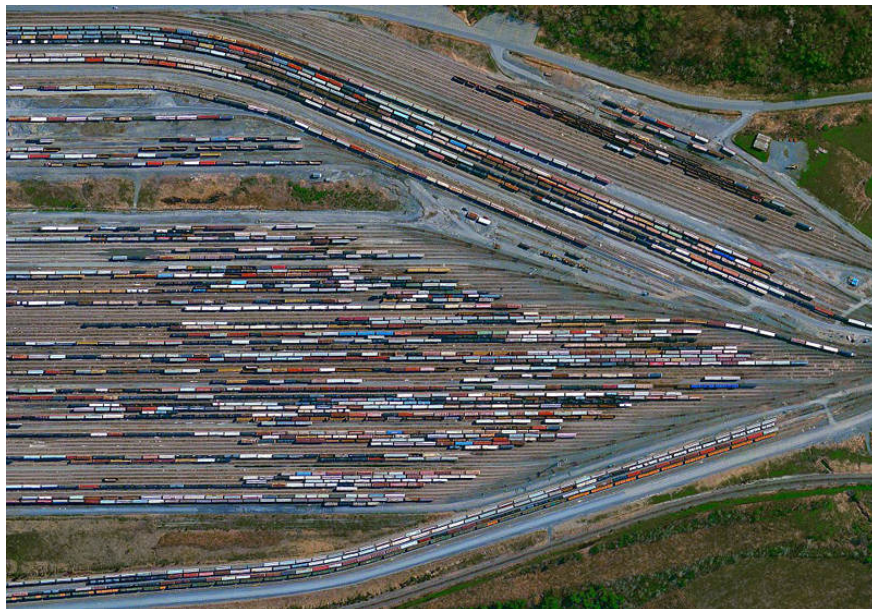
Roads to the Plaza Del Ejecutivo shopping center in Mexico City, Mexico.



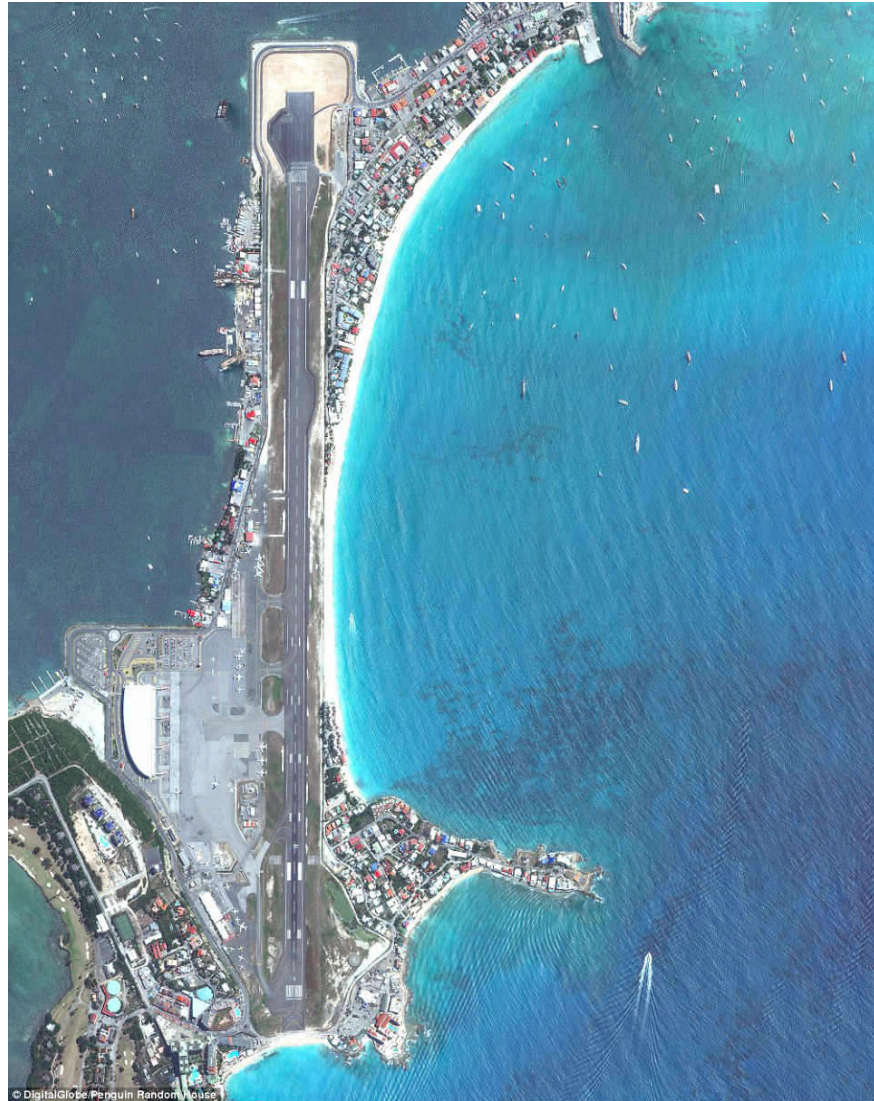
Potassium carbonate mine in Moab city, Utah, USA with different color reservoirs.



Jwaneng diamond mine in Botswana. This is the mine with the largest diamond reserve in the world, with an output of about 15.6 million carats / year.



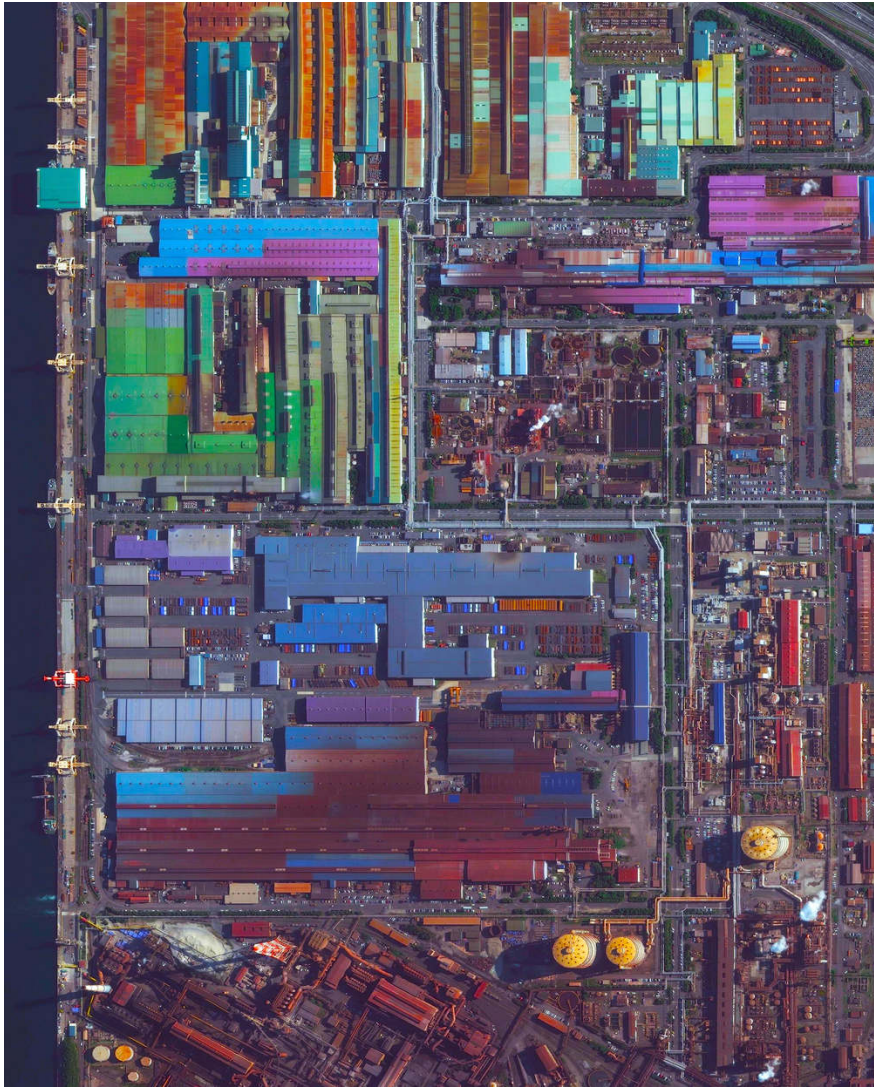
Selkirk - Railway cargo terminal in Albany, New York, USA. With modern equipment, this port can handle about 3,200 freight carriages every day.



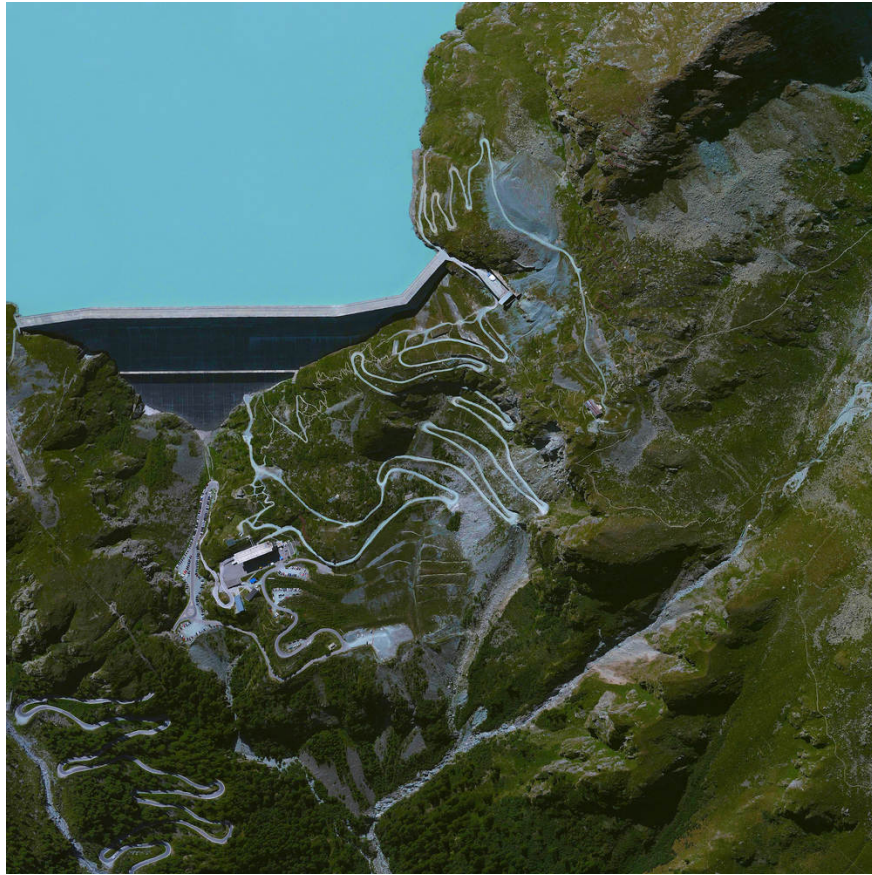
Princess Juliana International Airport. This is one of the airports with the most dangerous landing strip in the world due to the runway running along the island of Saint Martin in the Caribbean.

The Tahoe Keys community with 1,500 houses built on canals connecting Lake Tahoe in El Dorado, California, USA since the 1960s.



Salt fields in the city of San Francisco, California, USA. Their large red colored ponds are due to the color of *Dunaliella* algae.



A unique traffic intersection built in the suburb of Doha, Qatar. This design helps vehicles join traffic on the highway intersection without stopping.
