1. Windows 10

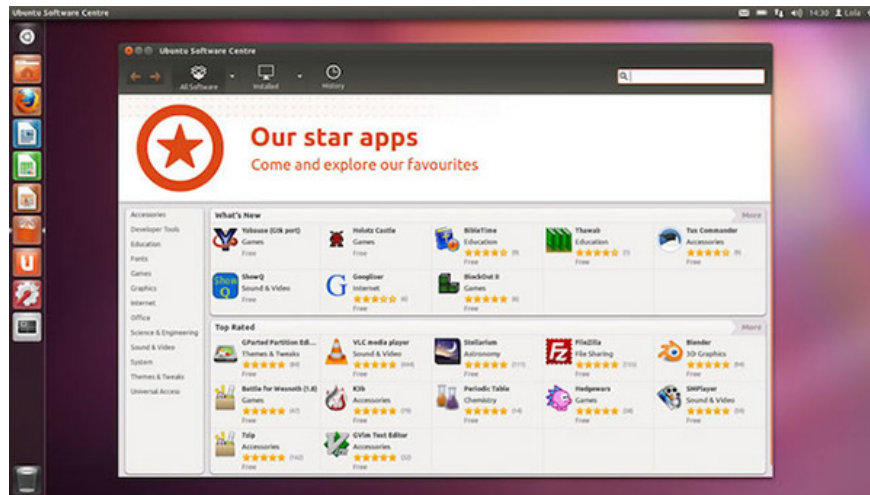
The best operating system that can replace macOS is Windows, which many users have abandoned to switch to apple products. Windows 10 is the newest operating system and is the best version so far.

3. Linux Mint 17 Cinnamon

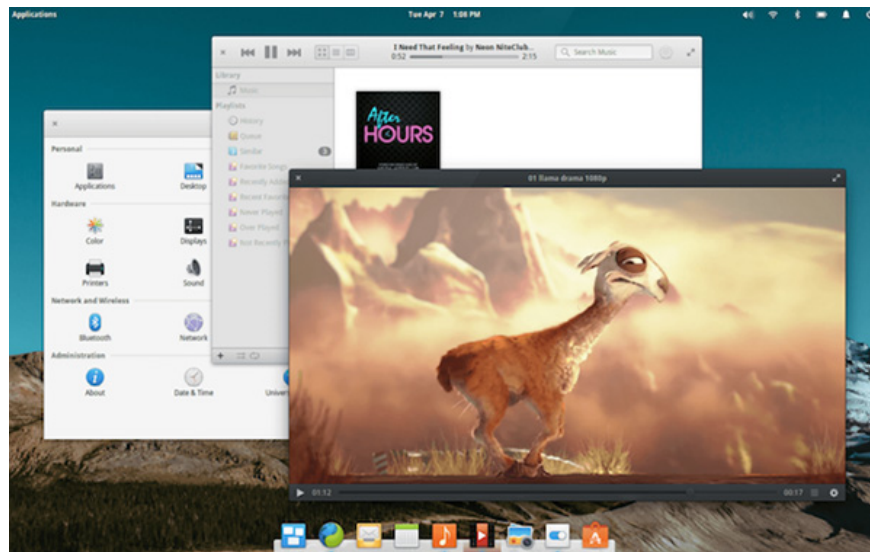

4. Elementary OS

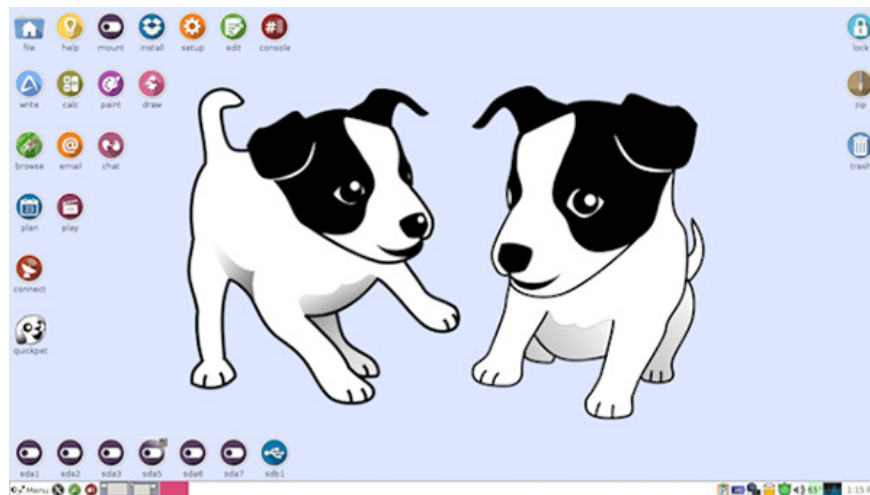
