

Thief Simulator: Tips to become a professional thief

As the name suggests, Thief Simulator is a theft simulation game combined with action elements. Participating in the game, everyone's task is to steal things, sell them to have money to buy advanced technology items to become the best thief.

The game requires people to carefully observe the strictly guarded houses to find the opportunity to break into it. Besides, the game also requires careful planning so as not to be caught and steal many valuable items.

When starting out as a young, inexperienced thief, stealing from players can be difficult. Don't worry though, as the following helpful tips will assist everyone on their way to becoming the most successful thief in Thief Simulator.

Thief Simulator stealing tips

Understand the homeowner's operating cycle

The first and most important thing to remember for an amateur thief is to minimize the risk. The easiest way to achieve this is to make sure that any house people try to break into is empty.

Cautiously approach a house while crouching and peering through several windows. Placing people low will reduce the risk of detection if someone is at home.

When the owner is at home, the player can aim at them and click the Mark button to record their habits for that time of day.



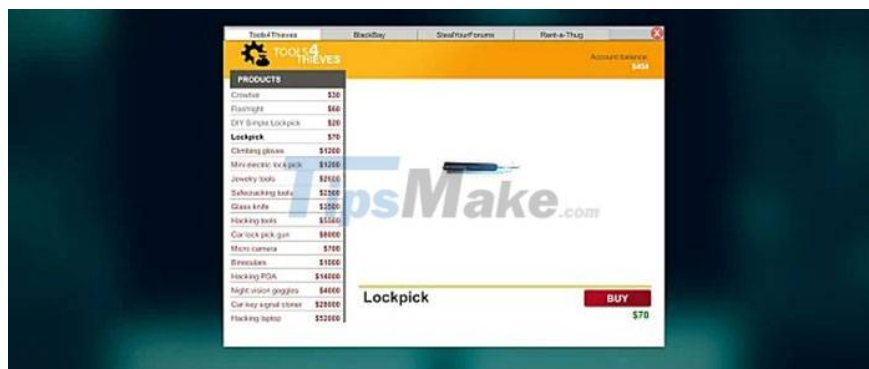
Recheck that area several times over a 24-hour period to see when the house is empty. When all the arrows at the top right of the screen are in the blue part, then no one is at home.

Later, once you have some upgraded abilities, you can confidently destroy occupied houses, but play with caution when starting out.

In addition, if there is a lot of cash to spend, the player can buy information about many houses on the computer in his hideout. This will reveal a lot of useful information without the need for self-discovery and investigation.

Plan carefully

There's nothing worse than carefully planning a burglary and realizing you've left your tools at home. Gamers can purchase keychains, climbing gear, and other useful kits at Tools4Thieves on their home computer.



Make sure you carry the right tools for the job (and also keep an eye on the weight as most tools take up space in a backpack, leaving less room for other things).

Lockpicks can break, so bring a few spares. Higher tier locks cannot unlock lower tiers, so bring a few of each when breaking in.

Practice at home



Some tools will take a while to get used to. For example, there are several different types of snap locks and they all work differently. Practice with fake locks at home before breaking into the real house. Standing in front of someone else's house at 2 a.m. and confused about what to do to break in is something a professional thief never does.

Night is not always better

People often think that stealing is something to do at night, but sometimes it is more appropriate during the day, when the homeowner is at work. However, getting in and out of a house during the day is more difficult because there are more people on the street.

On the other hand, nighttime burglaries are often more beneficial when the gamer has achieved a few ranks in each of his basic skills, allowing sneaking into inhabited houses without waking the owner from sleep. . The street at night is also less crowded, so it will be easier to get in and out.



In short, stealing during the day is easier and safer, while doing the work at night offers greater rewards.

The player still has to escape from the house after getting the loot. Pick a parking spot close to your targets but out of sight to make escaping easier.

Position the vehicle towards your intended exit and leave the hatch open and ready space for large items to be loaded. This will save precious seconds when escaping, making a significant difference between a successful heist and being caught in battle.
