1. Should you take your computer or laptop for repair unless it's impossible to fix?

2. Save important data.

3. Choose a reputable repair center.

Authorized service and repair centers are the first places to consider when your computer or laptop is still under warranty. However, if your device is out of warranty, you can research reputable and trustworthy repair centers based on recommendations from family and friends. It's advisable to ask experienced people for advice to find a reliable and reasonably priced service center. Avoid situations where you take your device in only to have it taken away without repair. In such cases, your device is very likely to have parts replaced with inferior ones or be tampered with, leading to more serious problems.

4. Be observant when getting your computer or laptop repaired.

When you go to reputable repair centers, you'll likely feel more secure. However, you still need to be discerning. If you hand your device directly to a technician at a center, it's not guaranteed that your device will be repaired according to the company's policy. The technician might take your device and repair it for personal gain. Therefore, always request a receipt and all relevant documents from the person receiving your device.

5. Sign your name on the device's components.

This is considered a crucial and necessary step that most computer repair centers are now implementing. After you report the computer's condition, the technician will open the machine and have you sign your name on several components such as the motherboard, hard drive, RAM, CD/DVD drive, wireless card, monitor, and other parts if requested.



6. Carefully check the receipt.

After diagnosing the problem and signing off on the computer components, you need to carefully check the receipt to ensure it lists all the components you submitted, along with information about the device's condition, the problem to be repaired, and any related terms and conditions.

7. Repair or replace

Sometimes, when taking your device for repair, you forget to consider whether to repair your broken computer or laptop or replace it with a new one. That's why you need objective and accurate advice from the repair service. For example, if your device has faulty RAM, a bad HDD, or a damaged laptop screen, it might be better to replace it with a new one rather than repair it. Seek advice from others to determine what repair costs are acceptable for your device and whether the long-term usability is feasible. Avoid situations where the problem recurs after a short time following the repair.
