In the world there are many strange traditions and sometimes even different from other cultures. In the United Kingdom, some washbasins are very bizarre: **up to 2 taps, one for hot water, one for cold water**. The Bright Side page decided to find out why two British faucets were used on the British sink. What makes people curious is why they didn't combine them? The reason will be revealed immediately below, please consult with us!

The first reason: History

Most British houses were built in the nineteenth century and early twentieth century. During that period, modern faucets and valves capable of mixing hot and cold water were not yet born. At that time, the water system simply pumped cold water directly from the factory to the households. Later when there is hot water, it is added through a separate pipe. So the dual water system has been created!

Reason 2: Respect the law

In the United Kingdom, there is a law prohibiting the use of mixing pipes of two types of hot and cold water in old system houses. In fact, the country does not have central heating, if you want to use hot water, the households have to take care of themselves.

Moreover, in long-term homes, cold water tanks will be placed on the mezzanine floor, after which water will be heated through a heating system to supply water to the entire house. According to the design of the heating system, there is a mandatory structure that must be a water container. However, during use, the water can be rusty, causing the water to smell and not suitable for drinking.

Therefore, by 1999, the British government had enacted a law banning the use of two-water mixing pipes with old-system homes to ensure that the water was not contaminated and protected people's health. .

Reason 3: Cost savings



With 2 hot water taps and cold water separately, the water will be mixed right in the tub with perfect proportions. Meanwhile, if you use a single tap, you will take time to adjust the temperature accordingly (*because the middle level is not always warm water*), the water will continue to discharge until the user chooses the right temperature. This costs more water than using a 2-way washbasin.
