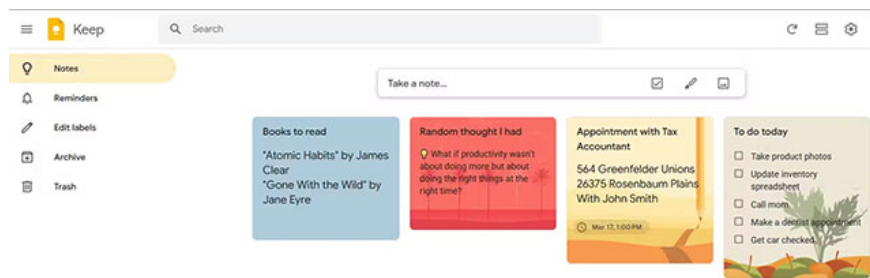


Three note-taking apps that make a perfect combination: Google Keep, Notepad, and Obsidian

Notepad: Simple and convenient

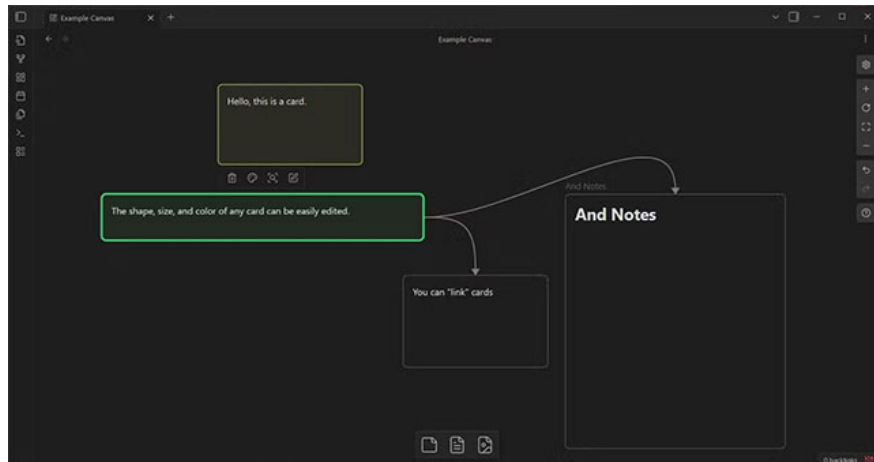


As your workload increases, taking notes directly in Google Keep can become a hassle. This is where **Notepad**, the default note-taking app on Windows, comes in handy.
