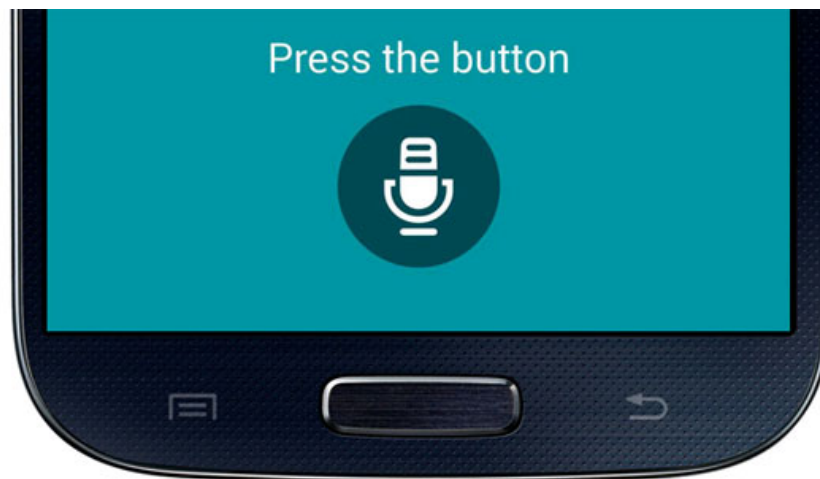


# Tips for speeding up Samsung Galaxy crickets

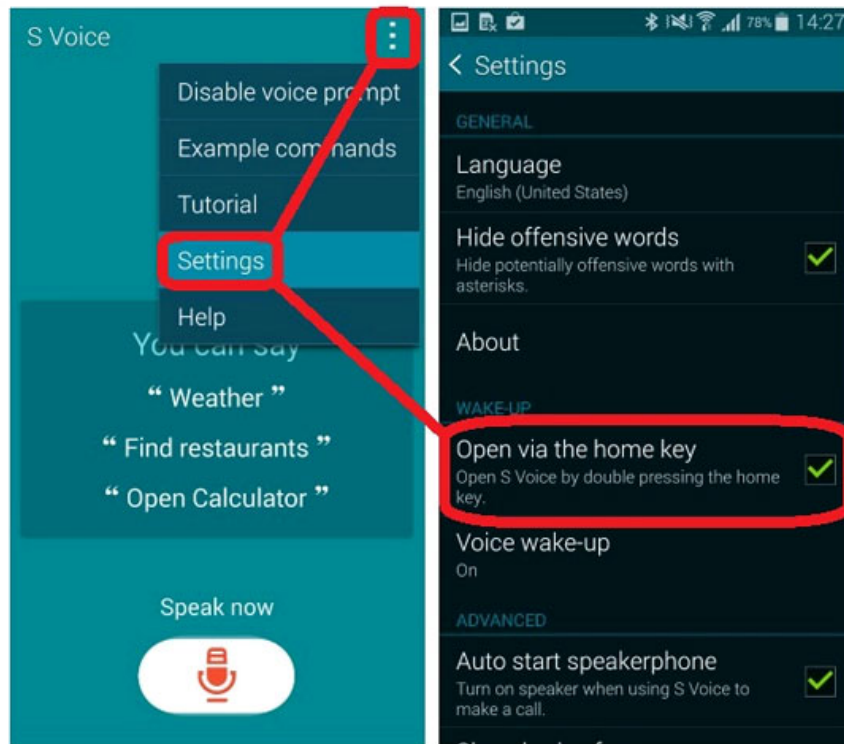

Galaxy smartphones still have a rather uncomfortable weakness: TouchWiz interface has too many features causing heavy machines and unnecessary. Luckily, you can improve the performance part on Galaxy S4 or Galaxy Note 4 by customizing *S Voice*.

S Voice is a virtual assistant on Galaxy devices, which is also the answer for Apple's virtual assistant Siri. You can access Samsung's virtual assistant by pressing the Home button on Galaxy models 2 times in a row.

But the problem is that this shortcut (*pressing the Home button twice*) will slow down the look of the Galaxy S and Galaxy Note. You may notice this sluggishness when pressing the **Home** button to return to the main screen.



Fortunately, this undesirable way to remove annoyances is quite simple: open S Voice, access the customized screen (*Settings*) of this application and remove the "Open via the Home key" option (*Click active via the Home button*).

After you have made this custom, you will see the **Home** button " more *sensitive*" than before. In case you need to use S Voice, you can activate this pretty . ungainly virtual assistant through normal application shortcuts.
