

Tips to find villages in Minecraft 1.18.2

The village is one of the best built structures in Minecraft. It is filled with villagers and resources, opening up a lot of options for the player.

Gamers can gather all villagers to create a trade and exchange farm or let them work in the fields, to provide an abundant food source. Chests in the villagers' houses are also filled with valuable loot.



However, the reality of finding a village is not that simple. In this article, let's discover useful tips and tricks that will make finding villages in Minecraft 1.18.2 easier.

Find the right biome

Villages occur naturally in plains, savanna, taiga, snowy tundra, and desert biomes. Furthermore, in Bedrock Edition, they are also found in snowy taiga, sunflower plains, and snowy taiga biomes.

It's best for the player to learn how to pinpoint the correct biomes from a distance for a higher chance of exploring a village.



Since biomes of similar temperature are often placed side by side, players should use mechanics to locate their required biomes. For example, if snow is discovered, gamers should wander around looking for snowy taiga or tundra, which can lead to villages.

Using the location command

Gamers who have cheats enabled in their world can find biomes using the locator command. This method can also be applied to many biomes and structures in Minecraft.

Just open the in-game console using / and enter the command `/locate_structure_name`. This command can also find different types of villages. Typing `/locate village` will display every village type in the game (denoted by their biome type).



By choosing between options, the player gets the coordinates of the nearest village, which can be compared with his current coordinates to find his way. However, gamers can simply click on the coordinates themselves to teleport to that location.

Search near water source

Water is an important resource in Minecraft. While the player character and the NPCs do not need to drink water to live, but it has many utilities such as fish, using buckets to store water, .



Villages have a higher chance to spawn near a water source. This allows the villagers to grow various plants that require water such as sugar cane and melons. Therefore, the player just needs to walk along the nearest riverbank and sooner or later will find a village.

Avoid mountains and jungle

Villages are large structures and need a lot of space to develop. Therefore, it usually does not appear in biomes such as mountains and forests.



These areas are also dark and have the potential to spawn monsters that villagers can't deal with. If you see these types of biomes while trying to find a village, skip them to save time.

Increase Render Distance

Players can try the classic way to locate anything in Minecraft, which is to get to a really high position to look around. If there are no mountains or hills, the player can build a simple tower and climb to the top to observe.



However, for this to work, the player also needs to increase the render distance in the options. With this, remote locations will be revealed, allowing the player to easily explore a village. Once the village has been found, disable the feature afterwards, as high Render Distance will degrade device performance.
