## 1. The Elder Scrolls Online

Set years before the events of Oblivion and Skyrim, The Elder Scrolls Online has expanded into several territories to cater to longtime players. At the beginning of the game, you will be led back to Tamriel, where the player will begin to perform system tasks. You will be free to experience the vast world of Elder Scrolls, with countless monsters and dangers lurking.

## 2. Crossout



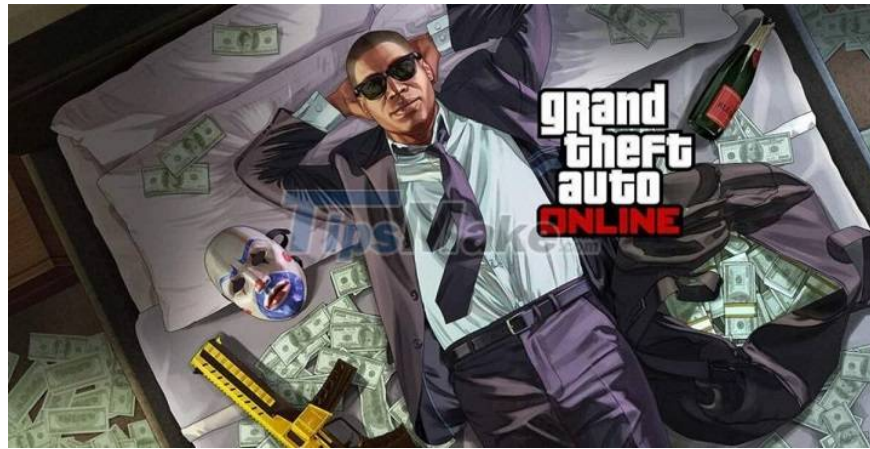
If you like Mad Max-like games with a desert wilderness setting, then Crossout could be an excellent alternative. As a free-to-play racing action game, Crossout tasks you with crafting combat chariots, armed with a variety of weapons from melee to machine guns. The game uses an enhanced damage model, which affects the vehicle's performance based on where it is hit. Auction and trading systems allow you to swap gear with other players.

### **3. Guild Wars 2**



Despite being almost 8 years old, Guild Wars 2 continues to update new content through the 'Living World' system, encouraging players to keep playing, doing quests, and participating in new events. Guild Wars 2 does not have many races and character systems like other games, and it forces players to take on quite traditional roles. You can play as a Warrior or a Thief, each system has its own way of upgrading abilities with a rich equipment system.

### **4. Grand Theft Auto Online**



Like the previous game, GTA V also has a separate online game mode called GTA Online. The game features open-world session systems with maps similar to GTA V. Players can travel and interact around the map, participating in organized activities including fighting gangs, other, robbing money trucks, etc. You can also participate in buying and selling real estate, vehicles, clothes, weapons and other equipment.

## 5. Warframe



This game is different from most of the others on the list, as its RPG element revolves around futuristic guns and cannon weapons, rather than swords and shields. Along with that, Warframe has a very detailed character customization and stat management system, enough to rival the best multiplayer games.

Most missions can only be completed with up to 3 other players. But developer Digital Extremes has been constantly rolling out new content that allows users to gather in large areas for missions together.

## 6. DC Universe Online



If you've ever wanted to play a DC superhero, look no further than DC Universe Online. The game has been around for many years and it still gets additional updates to bring you more content to experience. You can play alone or with a group of 'superhero' friends. The world of DC is inherently colorful and filled with supernatural elements, making you always excited and can play every day.

## 7. World of Warcraft



WoW inspired many games that came out later, but Blizzard's original version still holds its place in the hearts of fans. The game is constantly evolving with new gameplay experiences, new storylines, and plenty of lore for dedicated Warcraft enthusiasts. The latest expansion Shadowlands, due out, brings with it a completely revised leveling system, along with many other exciting updates.

## 8. Destiny 2



Destiny 2 launched in 2017 with a great campaign mode, challenging totals, and lots of fun activities for the online gaming community. But things slowed down considerably in 2018. And that's completely changed since the first Forsaken expansion released, adding a brand new campaign and activities, and a bunch of character updates. and skills. And so far, this game is still going strong.

## 9. Final Fantasy XIV



Video games rarely get a second chance, but Final Fantasy XIV has completely changed since the first version, the publisher has made it a title worth playing again. Taking place after the events of the original game, the reboot is filled with quests and regular events. Fans of the series will find even more new things in FFXIV, and even newcomers will quickly fall in love with the world of Eorzea.

## 10. Star Wars: The Old Republic



Believe it or not, The Old Republic has survived and is healthy all these years. The developer still holds some monthly in-game events, and they still boast an active player base. And things have improved even further since the game launched on Steam and received a steady stream of new players.
