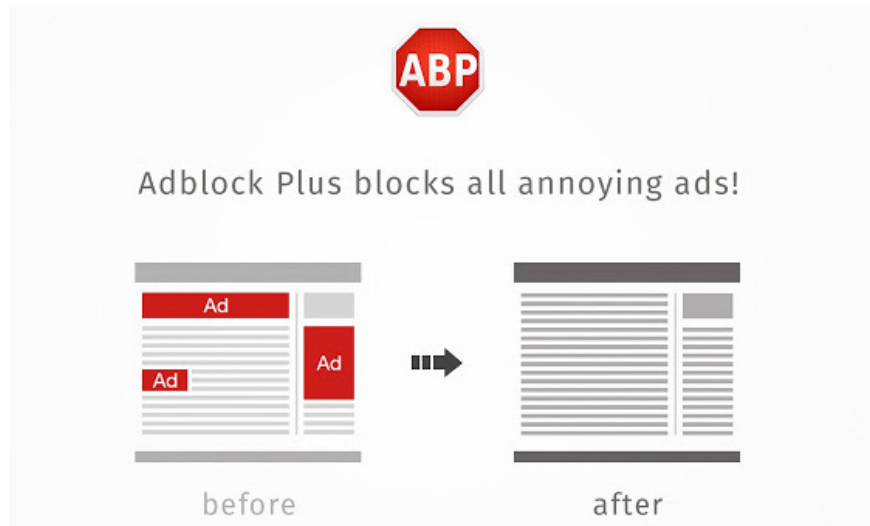

1. Adblock Plus (Free)

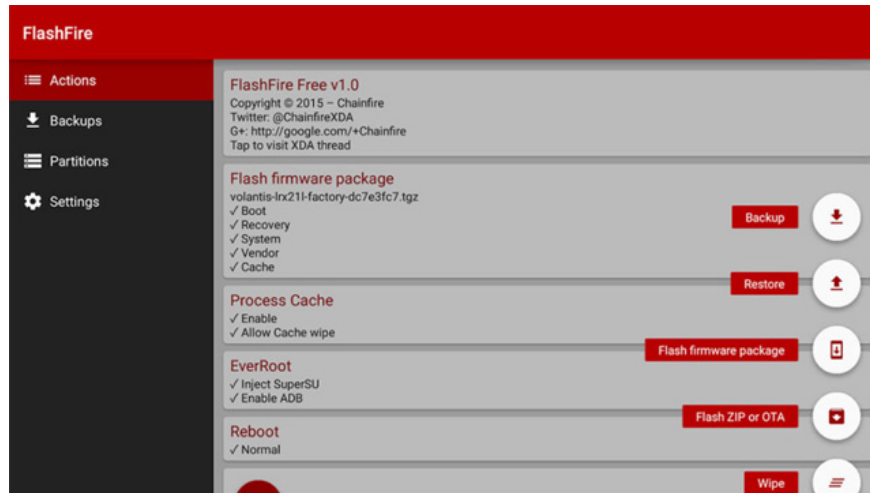
Adblock Plus is a free, open source application that removes ads from devices. This is definitely one of the best root applications.

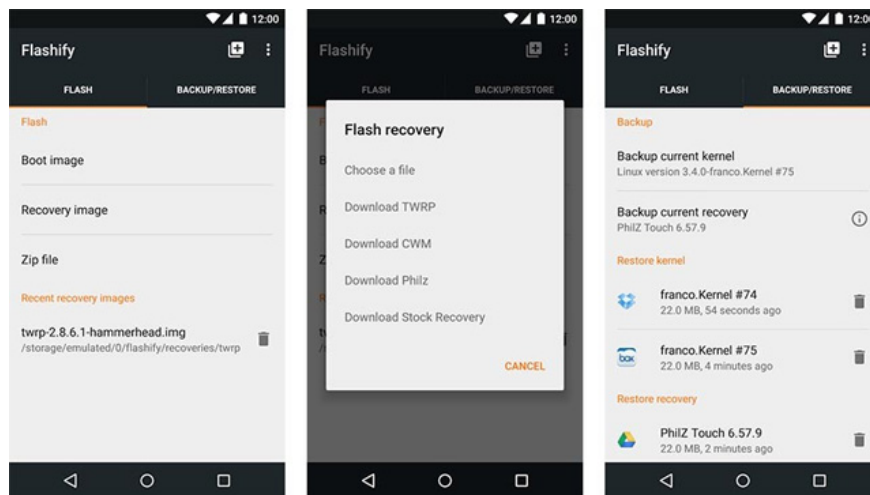
2. FlashFire (Free, \$ 3.15)

FlashFire is one of the root applications that people should try. This is a flash firmware application that includes firmware from the manufacturer, OTA updates, etc. Chainfire calls this app the spiritual successor of Mobile Odin because it has many similar features, but is effective. More and have some advanced features in the paid minutes.



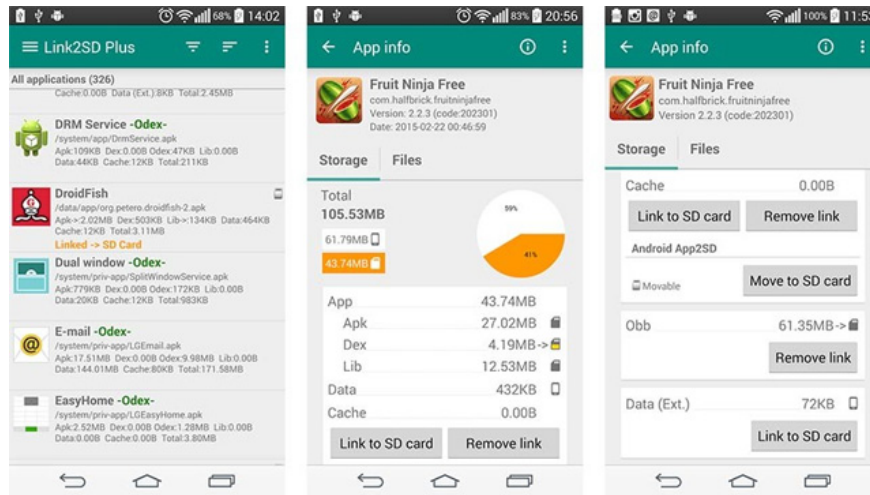
3. Flashify (Free, \$ 3.99)

Flashify is another flash tool, it can flash almost everything like recovery (both TWRP and CWM), zip file, operating system kernel, GAPP and even root recovery (only for pro version features)). Users can also backup and restore the operating system on Google Drive or Dropbox. This application has been updated for a long time but it works on many recent devices, especially for those who don't like ADB or Fastboot.



4. Link2SD (Free, \$ 2.35)

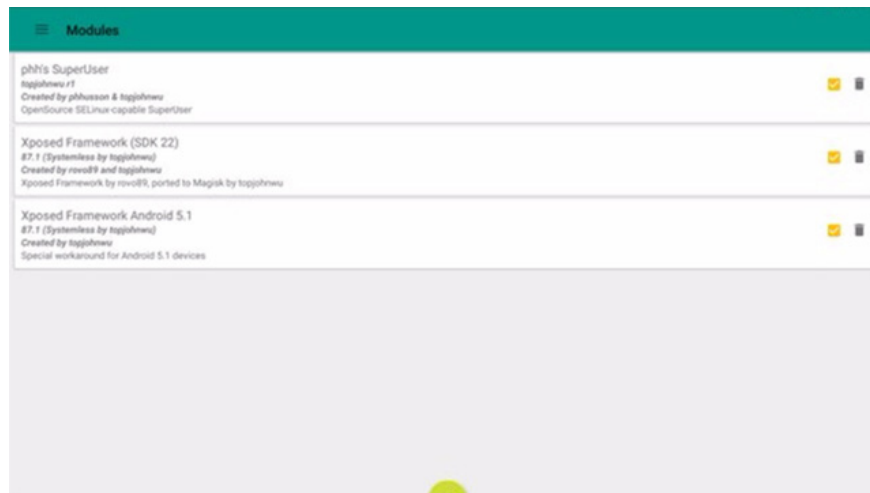
Link2SD is a tool that allows users to move apps to SD cards. It creates a link for the device to believe that it actually exists on the device to operate the normally inactive Apps2SD applications. This is a great way to take advantage of SD card storage. Although it is not as great as Android's Adoptable Storage, however, this method does not occupy the entire SD card. Note, moving apps will load more slowly.



5. Magisk (Free)

Magisk is one of the most powerful and popular root tools, it is relatively new. Magisk's main function is to allow users to hide root very effectively like watching Netflix or playing Pokemon Go. This application is not available on Google Play, so users will download the APK file from XDA-Developers.

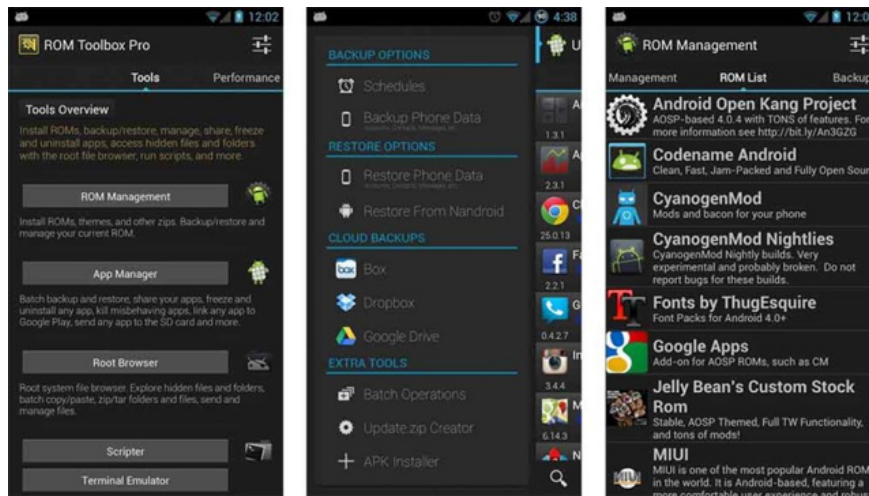
6. Quick Reboot (Free)

Quick Boot is a completely simple and useful application. In most versions of Android, the power menu is only used to power off and restart the device. Quick Reboot fixes this error by allowing users to boot to restore and bootloader. It also works on specific devices such as Download Mode for Samsung devices or quick launch on certain devices. This tool is fast, simple and enhances the power menu's capabilities.



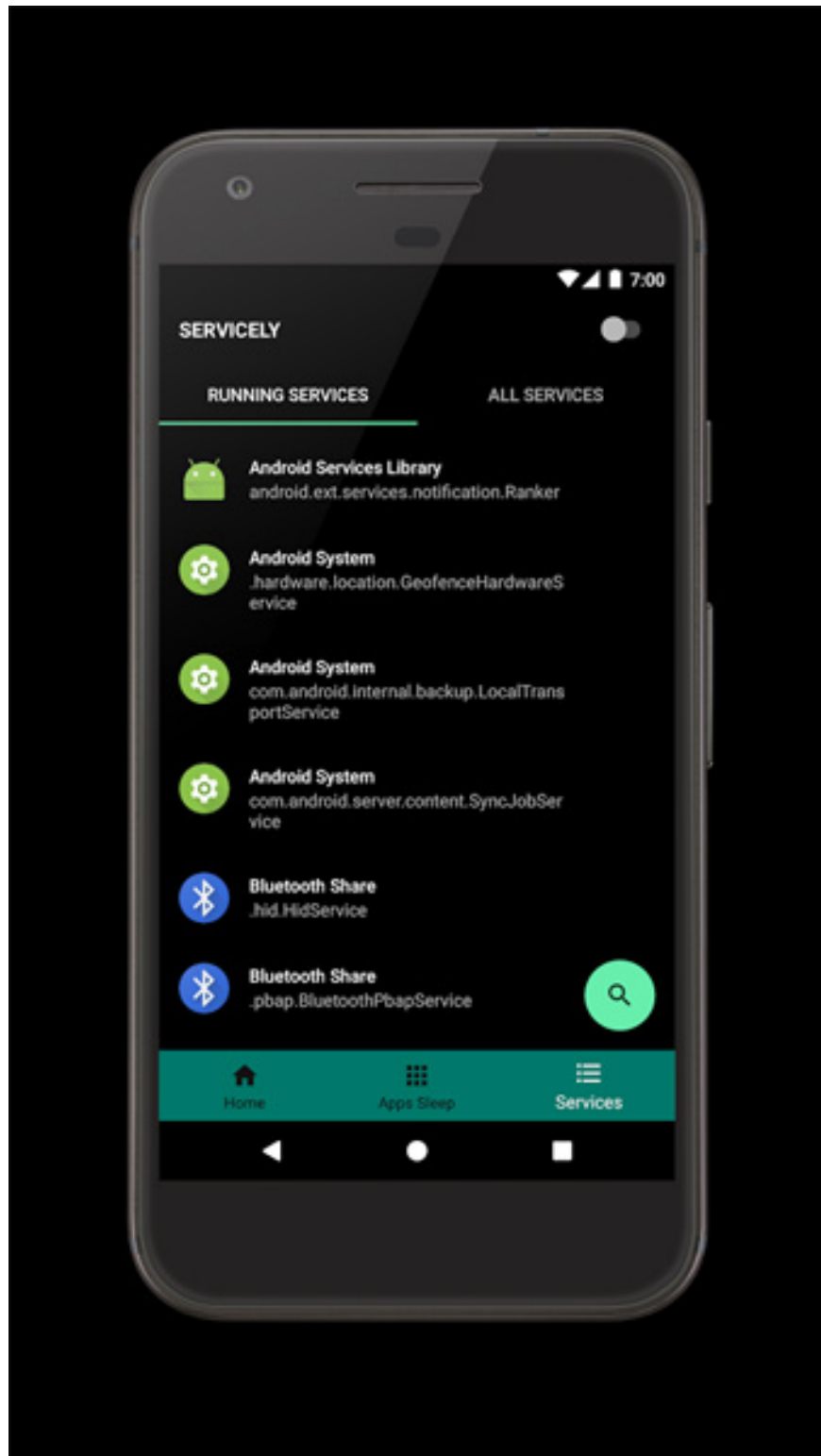
7. ROM Toolbox (Free, \$ 9.99)

This is one of the very few all-in-one solutions for root users that still works. It has a wide range of features such as integrated file browser with root, application manager (system application uninstall, etc.), ROM management (nandroid backup creation), script writing, font installer and more. On some devices, users can even change boot animations, themes and status bar icons.



8. Servicely (Free, \$ 4.49)

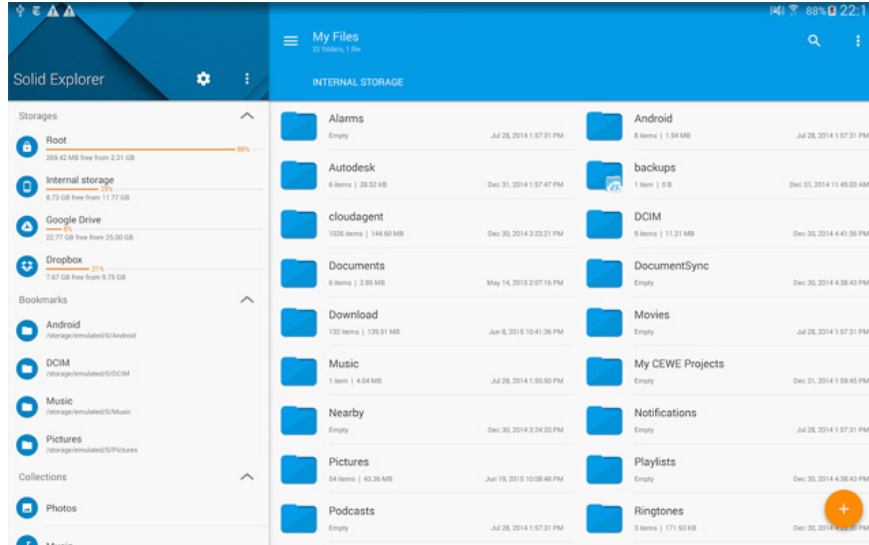
Servicely is an application that controls background services such as the Facebook pane running in the background while the device screen is off. The application can even improve performance and battery life depending on the services that stop running in the background.



9. Solid Explorer (Free, \$ 1.99)

Solid Explorer is a great file manager, it works without root. The application can perform common tasks like copying and pasting, extracting files, supporting cloud storage and network storage devices. In addition, it also has the option to enable root in the application. There are many good file managers with root, however, Solid Explorer is a clean application, works well for a low fee for no ads.

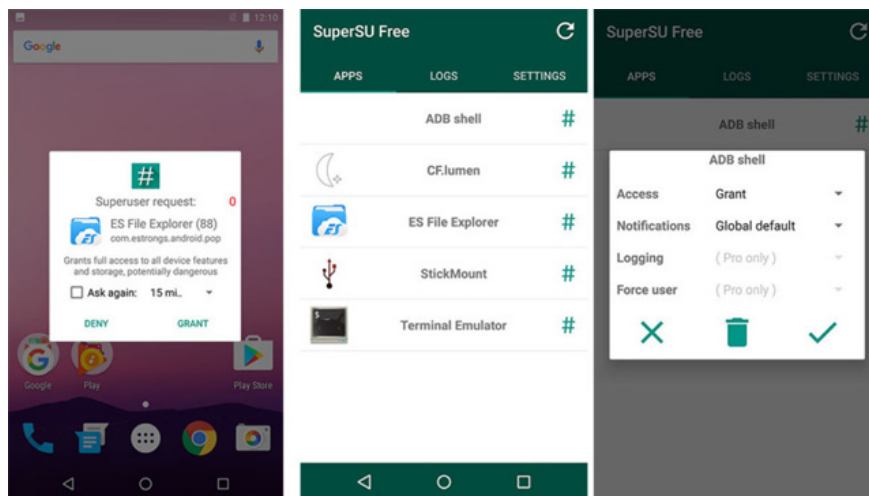

10. SuperSU (Free)

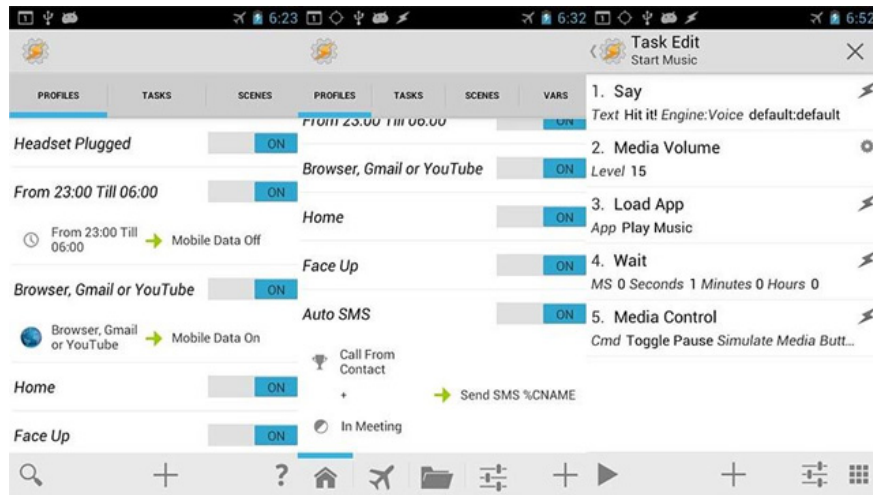
SuperSU is one of the most popular root applications. This is a great root application with a range of features. Users will have a list of all root applications, which can easily unroot the device, save logs, etc. This is one of the root applications that everyone should own.

11. Tasker (\$ 2.99)

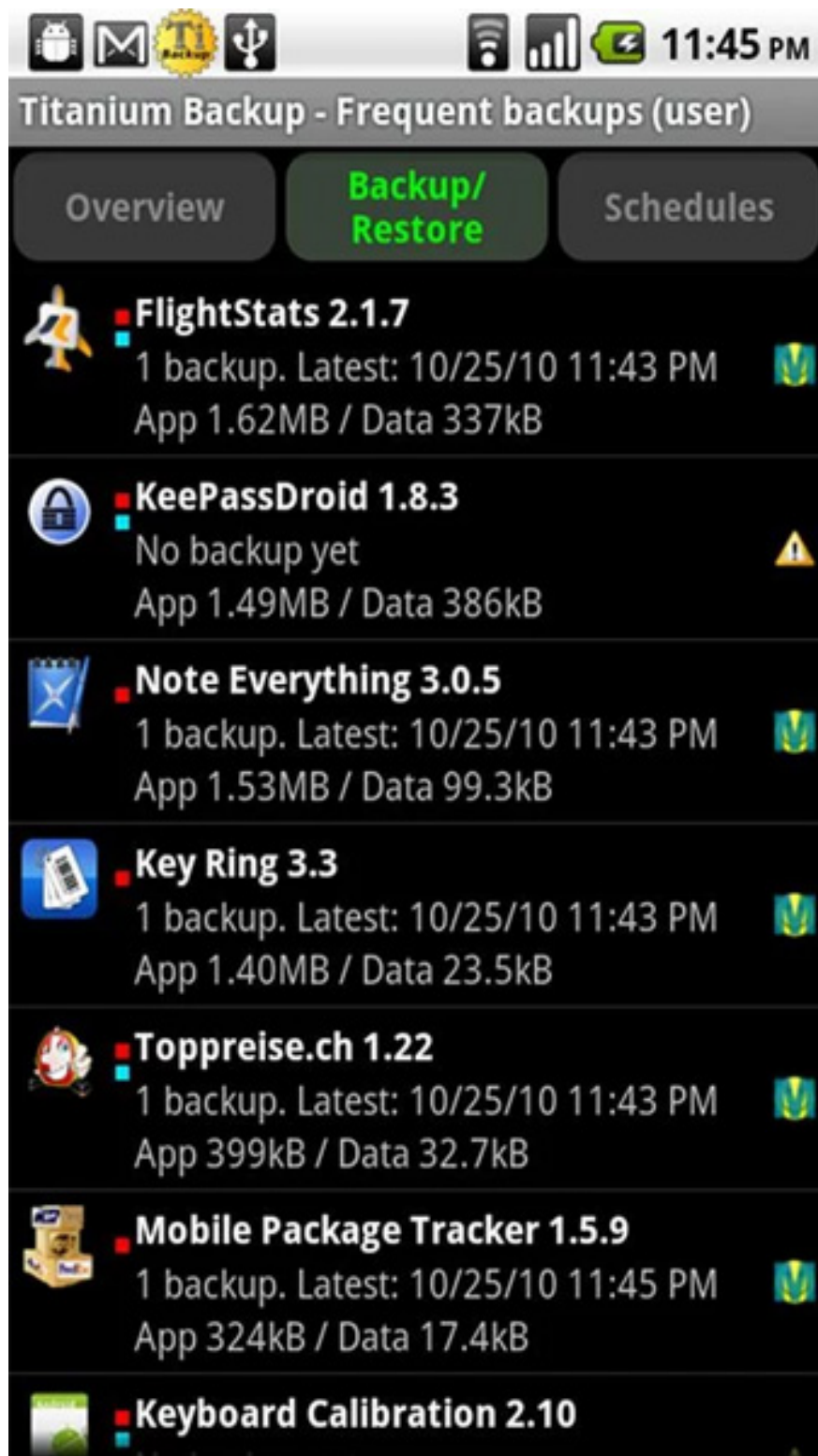

Titanium Backup is a tool used to uninstall bloatware software, applications that freeze and back up applications and application data on the device.

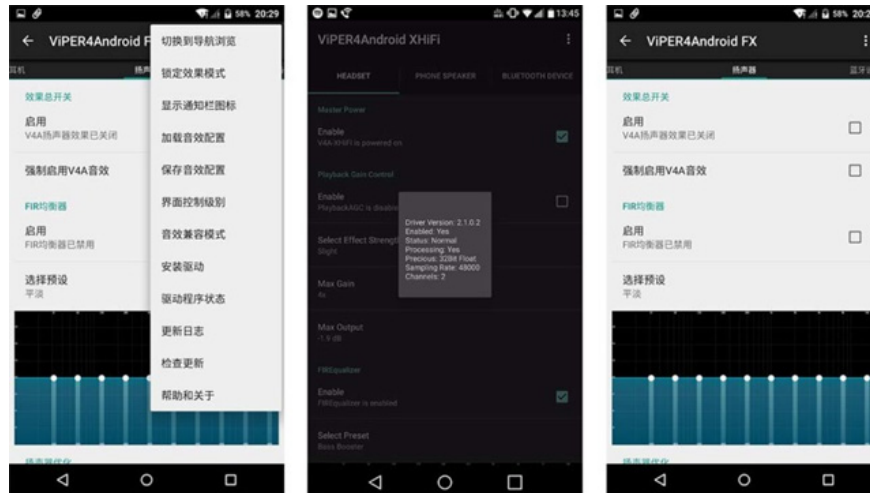
1. Backup and restore Android phone with Titanium Backup

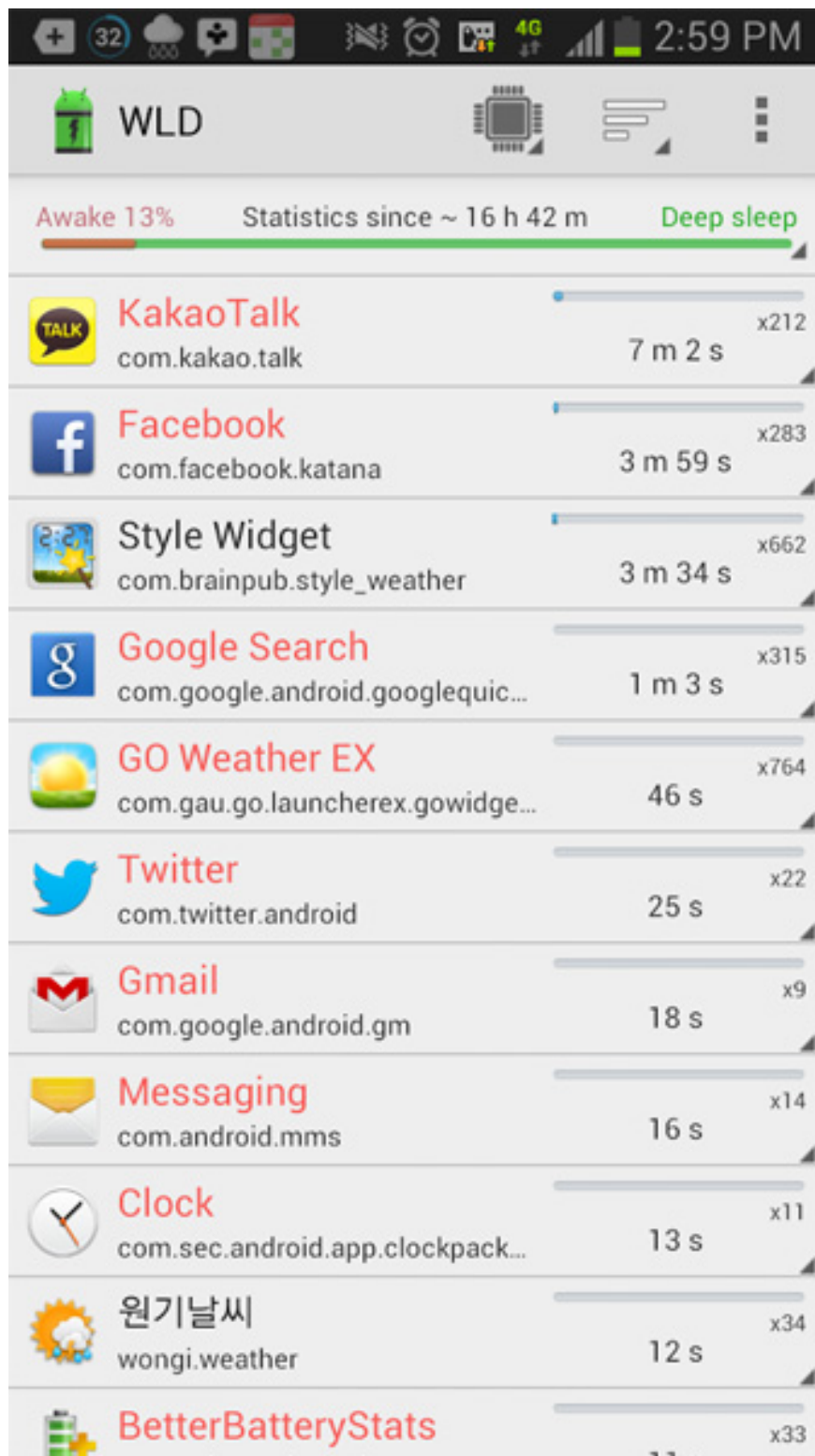
instructions.



14. Wakelock Detector (Free, \$ 1.99)

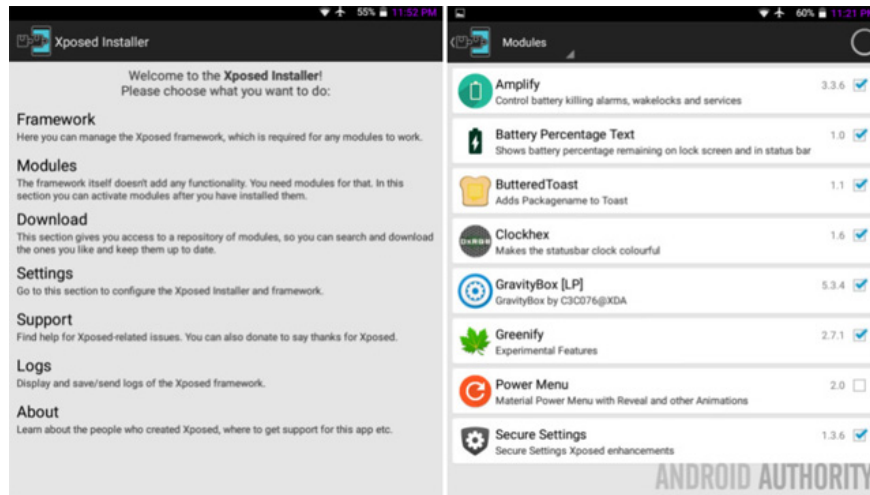
Wakelock Detector performs exactly the same as its name, detects applications that drain the battery so users can take the necessary steps to prevent it. This is one of the essential root applications for battery life.

15. Xposed Framework (Free)

Xposed Framework has replaced the ROM installation, the modules created within the framework perform tasks such as editing the user interface, modifying images, editing buttons and many other features.
