Monkey face or monkey orchids (*Dracula simia*)

Monkey Face Orchid, also known as monkey face orchid, "*Monkey Face Orchid*" only grows on slopes of an elevation of 1000-2000m of dense dark forests in southeastern Ecuador and Peru. Monkey face flowers have the scientific name "*Dracula simia*", in which "*simia*" means monkey in Latin and "*Dracula*" is a genus in orchids, but two long spurs of the sepals look like the Vampire fangs in fantasy movies. Phytoplankton bloom throughout the year and carry a ripe citrus scent. Although there are many places in the world to transplant and plant "*Lan Lan*" flowers, this flower is still very rare.

Naked Man orchid - Naked Man orchid is an orchid Italic species called Italian Orchid commonly found in the Mediterranean, shaped like a naked man. These "spread" flowers are a combination of bright pink and white and they often grow in groups. Especially with this strange shape makes it known to many people around the world.

Hooker's Lips - Hooker's Lips (Psychotria Elata)

While many are still skeptical of this flower as an exaggerated description or a joke, *Psychotria Elata* (*also known as Hooker Lips or Kissing Lips*) is completely real. Hooker's lips live in tropical rain forests of Central and South Africa. Two blossoms, due to the transformation of leaves, are bright red and the shape makes people think of the sweet, sweet red lips of a woman. By the time it bloomed, the lips would turn into a star-shaped flower.

Dancing girls - Dancing Girls (*Impatiens Bequaertii*)

Orchids Dancing Girls (t : *dancing girls*) or Impatiens Bequaertii are often white, sometimes light pink, many people associate the image of a charming ballet girl in a dress. white spread is fun, dancing. Besides, petals are usually light brown and white and purple.

Orchids Bumble Bee orchid - Bee orchids (*Ophrys bombyliflora*)

This is a kind of orchid flower that looks pretty cute, like a small bee sitting in the middle of a flower branch. Bee orchids (*scientific name: Ophrys bombyliflora*) always make the most of bee-like appearance and scent like female bees to attract male bees to pollinate. Perhaps, bee orchids are the cutest flower in the world with a picture of a smiling little boy in the middle.

Swaddled Babies orchid - Swaddled Babies orchid (*Anguloa Uniflora*)

With the scientific name of *Anguloa Uniflora*, Swaddled Babies orchid has a rather complex structure, looking like a baby in diapers, growing in the Columbian Andes. The most striking feature of *this "baby diaper" flower* is the large size flowers, creamy white and waxed. Its structure is relatively complicated, in a certain flowering period, when the petals are not yet blooming, the top of the flower is still joined together, looking like babies are wrapped in diapers, very enlightened cute and lovely. In particular, each root of the blossoms only hatches a single flower.

Parrot flower - Parrot flower (*Impatiens Psittacina*)

At first glance this flower does not look impressive, right? However, if viewed from the side, these flowers look like a flying parrot. This is an extremely rare flower, which grows only in Thailand, Burma and some parts of India in very small numbers. Parrot orchids are a plant with great aromatic resin with the scientific name *Impatiens Psittacina*, purple and vermillion. This flower has an eye-catching shape of a flying parrot with pink and light blue "feathers". However, parrot orchids are facing the risk of extinction because this species of parrot flower is difficult to grow, requiring soil to have alkaline (pH) suitable.

Snapdragon flower-shaped dragon tree - Snapdragon (*Antirrhinum*)

Antirrhinum - also known as dog snout or dragon flower (*Antirrhinum* or *snapdragon*) - a fairly common plant in Western home gardens. As the name suggests, the flower part of a fresh plant has a very similar shape to a

dragon's head but when the tree dies, the flower part wither and what remains of the tree can cause " *confusion* " for many people, because they shaped quite like a skull.

Dragon flower plants are also associated with many meanings and legends. In ancient times, people used to plant dragon flowers in the garden because they thought they had supernatural powers, could protect their families from scammers, curses or magic. Besides, there are rumors that people with dragon flowers will become charming and eat dragon flowers that can be young for a few years . but no one has yet to verify.

Flying Duck Orchid - Flying Duck Orchid (*Caleana Major*)

Scattered in South East and South Australia, with a harmonious combination of red, purple and " *small* " shapes, the flying ducks (*Caleana Major*) are named as one of the best camouflage orchids. The reason it is called duck orchid, because the middle wing of the flower is like a flying duck with advanced wings. In particular, the upper

petal resembles a duck's beak. Flowers are usually reddish-brown and in rare cases it is green with dark spots and a single leaf near the flower stalk.

"Alien" flower - Happy Alien (Calceolaria Uniflora)

This flower with the scientific name *Calceolaria Uniflora* is one of the perennial flowers that originated in South America. This flower usually grows on mountains, about 10cm tall. Each flower is a combination of three colors white, yellow, sepia - it looks quite strange like an alien.

Flower angel - Angel orchid (*Habenaria Grandifloriformis*)

As one of the rare and precious orchids in the world, angelic flowers originated in the high grasslands of southern India. Many people believe that the flower called angel by covered in white coat, petals arranged like an angel wing.

Dove orchid - Dove orchid or Holy Ghost orchid (Peristeria Elata)

The Pigeon Orchid (*scientific name: Peristeria Elata*) is a orchid species commonly found growing in most of South America, along Panama, Trinidad and Costa Rica. Looking inside this pure white flower will see the hidden inner structure like the shape of a small pigeon. Specifically in the center of the petals is a pigeon with raised wings and pink small dots and a tiny gold mine.

Ballerina Orchid - Ballerina Orchid

This flower from Australia looks like a graceful ballet girl in a white spread dress. Petals are usually light brown and white and purple. Orchid is actually a spider flower that lives on land, growing alone or in groups in different parts of the Australian islands. This flower has a creamy white base, with maroon patches, however, the petals and petals are quite dark in color. The petals looked like a young girl dancing in a white flared skirt, forming a virtuoso ballet dance. Lan Vu female is loved by many people as well as her beauty, this is also a favorite dish of many rabbits and kangaroos. Therefore, grazing these two animals in developed areas poses a great threat to these orchids.

White stork flower - White Egret orchid (*Habenaria Radiata*)

With the scientific name *Habenaria Radiata*, white stork flower - White Egret orchid is one of the endemic flowers in China, Japan, Korea and Russia. This flower reminds people of the image of white storks flaring their wings to soar into the sky. When budding, the flower bears the shape of a perching bird . and when it blooms, the flower is like a flying bird. This flower has a very peaceful and pure beauty.

Darth Vader orchid (*Aristolochia Salvadorensis*)

Although growing in the humid climate of Central America, this Darth Vader (*Aristolochia Salvadorensis*) can still thrive in greenhouses in Japan. When hatched, the size of this flower only increased by about 5cm and only bloomed about a week and then withered. Because of the face of Darth Vader - a famous Star Wars character, people used to call them "*Darth Vader flowers*".
