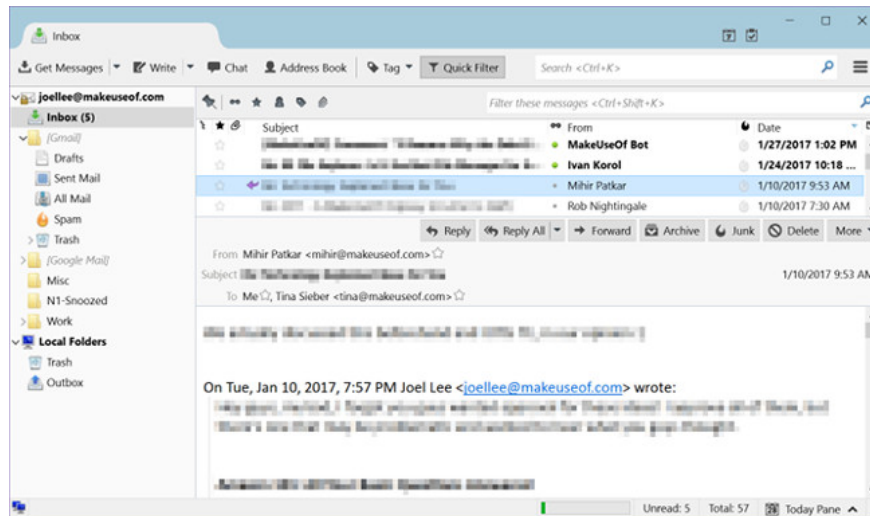

1. Thunderbird

Available for Windows, Mac and Linux.

Thunderbird is a free email client application developed by the **Mozilla Foundation** . Thanks to the handy and outstanding features, this application software is one of the most popular and popular email clients today.

Although Thunderbird's development was discontinued in 2012, it still received maintenance updates so don't assume it's "dead". In fact, the stable update was released earlier this year. This client will not receive any new features but it is still fully usable.



Thunderbird is a free application and open source email client application On the desktop really worth using. Other open source clients still exist, but they are entangled in issues such as cumbersome interfaces, inconvenience, unstable performance and lack of advanced features.

If you don't want to spend money and switch to a web-based client, Thunderbird is the best app for you. It can do a lot of things you need, including setting up automatic email message and reply filters, including other tweaks and tweaks.

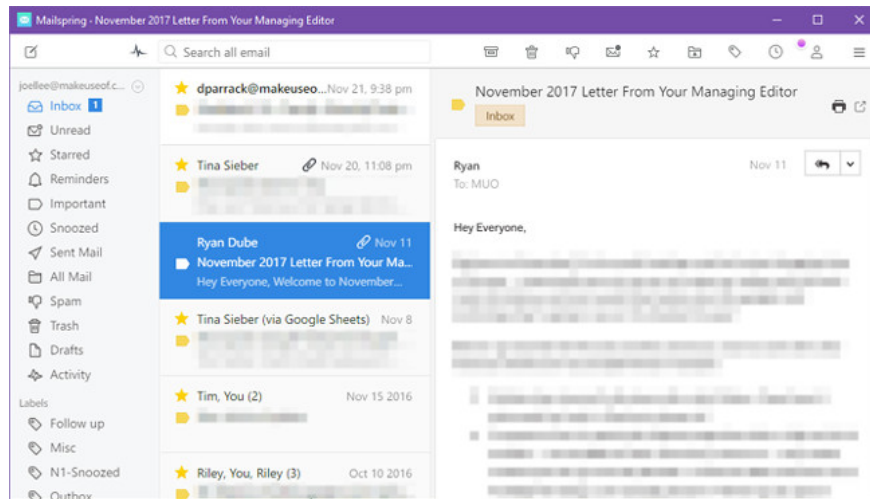

2. Mailspring

Available for Windows, Mac and Linux.

From 2016 onwards, **Nylas Mail** has appeared as a desktop email client "beating" all email client applications on another desktop. But then in August 2017, the group announced that they no longer worked on Nylas Mail and opened up the source for everyone.

One of the original authors divided the project and reopened Nylas Mail as **Mailspring** . In addition to maintaining the project, he optimized and improved many internal components, resulting in faster synchronization, less RAM usage, faster boot times and more.



Thunderbird can be a client for those who want high reliability and endurance, and **Mailspring** is a client to use if you want something fresh, interesting and full of potential in the future. Mailspring is free to use indefinitely with some advanced features locked after registration.

Notable free version features:

1. Sync with Gmail, Office 365, Yahoo, iCloud, FastMail and IMAP.
2. Unlimited email accounts and inbox consolidation.
3. Undo sending email within a certain period of time.
4. Support themes, layouts and emoticons.

Featured Pro version features:

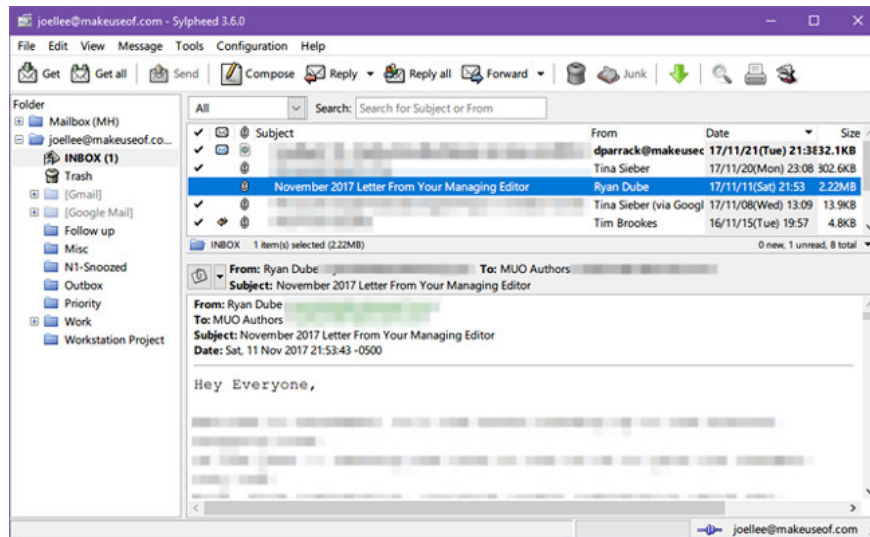
1. Abundant template strongly supports productivity.
2. Keep track of whether the email has been opened and whether the link is clicked.
3. Set up time to send email.
4. Hide emails and create next reminders.
5. Share email topics with others using a web link.

3. Sylpheed

Available for Windows, Mac and Linux.

Sylpheed is an email client application that has been in use since 2001. Although time is somewhat outdated when compared to modern email client applications, it is not bad at any feature. In fact, Sylpheed's old interface and email management approach can be really useful if email users have a habit of causing excessive stress.



The most special thing about Sylpheed is that it knows it is: **an email client application** . It does not care about tons of extraneous features. Sylpheed is simple, light and full-featured.

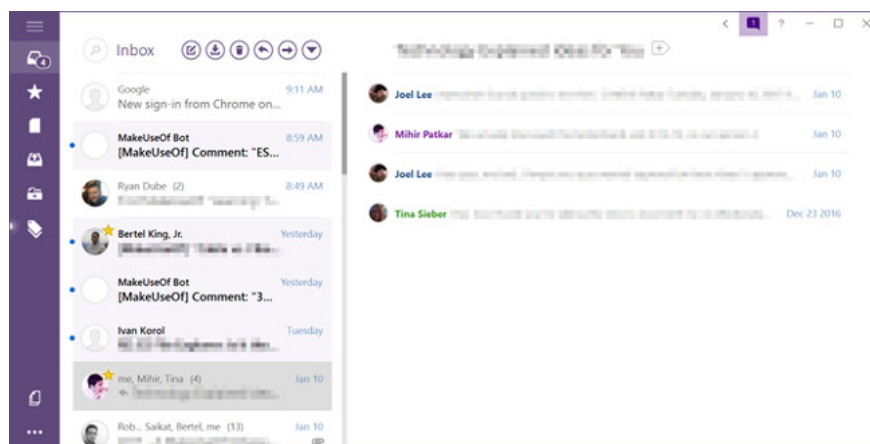
Notable features include fast launch and overall performance, advanced email filtering and search, effective spam control, encryption and expansion through plugins.

4. Mailbird

Available for Windows.

If you have never used an email client for the desktop before, you may like **Mailbird** . If you move from another client, you will feel there are some familiar parts, other bits will impress you, but there are certainly features you don't like.



All we can suggest is to try it. It will definitely be interesting and modern, there are many things for you to enjoy. Note that it's a basic free application, so the free version is limited in several ways.

Notable free version features:

1. Beautiful and minimalist design interface.
2. Sync with any IMAP or POP email service.
3. Quick search and indexing.
4. Integrate with Dropbox, Evernote, Google Docs and more.
5. Support up to 3 email accounts.

Featured Pro version features:

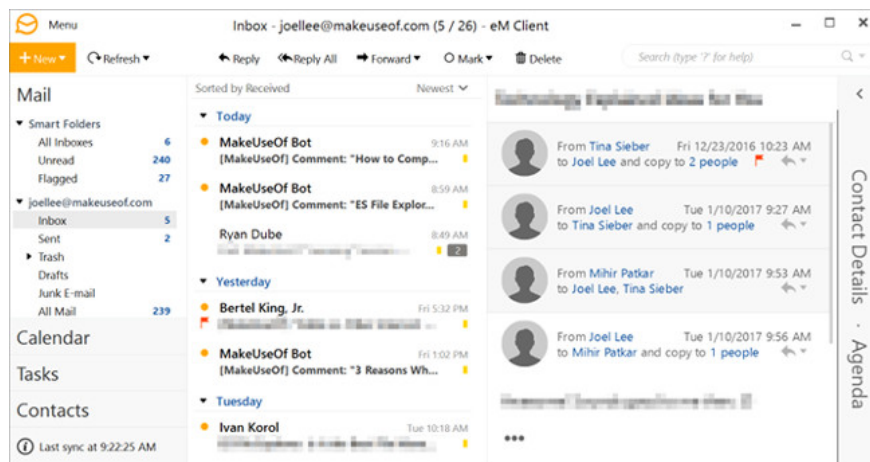
1. Unlimited email accounts and inbox consolidation.
2. Hide emails and set up reminders.
3. Speed ??up reading for email.
4. Quickly view email attachments.

5. eM Client

Available for Windows.

eM Client is an **all-in-one solution** to meet office and communication tasks. It is primarily designed for email but also integrates schedule, task management, contact organization, even **chat support** - and the free version has only one limit (albeit large) you have See below.



This was once considered a perfect alternative to **Microsoft Outlook** . A few years ago, the eM Client also released a special version for Windows XP and Windows 7 operating system that received a lot of positive feedback.

This multifunctional emailing software **supports all popular free email services** like Hotmail, Yahoo and Gmail or even Exchange, iCloud . In addition, it also has other **handy features** like : scheduling, daily work, contact information .

Notable free version features:

1. Slick Modern UI interface is suitable for Microsoft applications.
2. Sync with Gmail, Exchange, iCloud, Office 365 and Outlook.com.
3. Discussion view for email topics.
4. Integration with all popular chat services, including Jabber.
5. Support up to 2 email accounts.

Featured Pro version features:

1. Support an unlimited number of email accounts.
2. Can be used for commercial purposes (eg, use of business offices).
3. VIP support and troubleshooting.

If these clients seem too complicated for your email needs, you can use the preinstalled Mail application on Windows 8 and Windows 10 (some say it is **bloatware**; although others give it that Windows 10 Mail is worth using. If you're using a Mac, **Apple Mail** is full (especially with these tips and tweaks).
