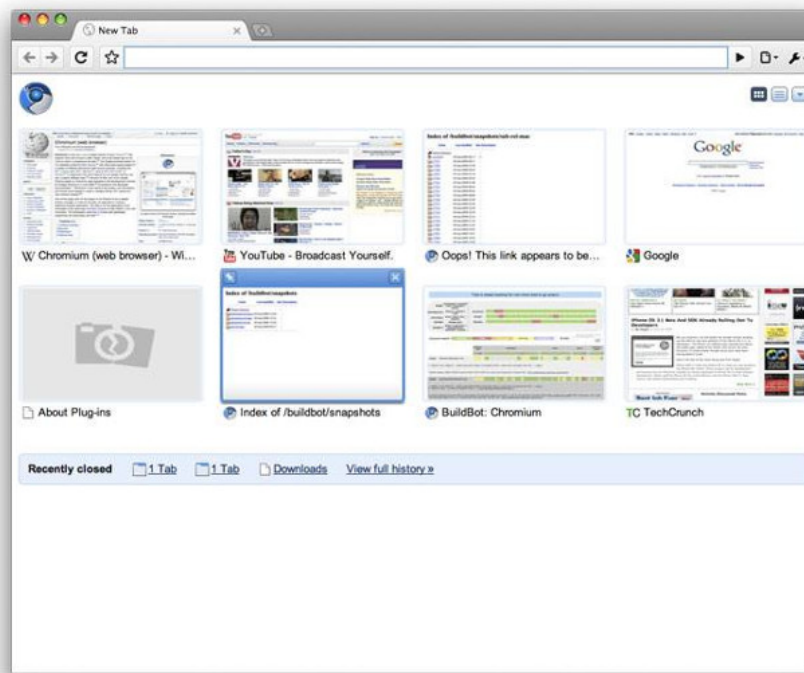

1. VLC Media Player

For years, this is the best music and video player app for both Mac and Windows, thanks largely to its special compatibility with most codecs. Having this application in USB means that whenever you want to watch a video, just plug it into your Mac and you can enjoy it right away.

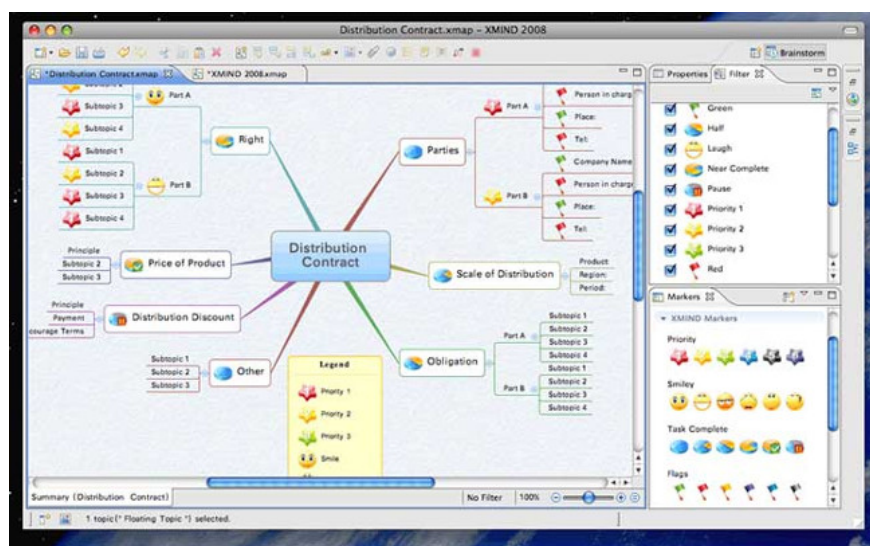
2. Chromium

Having a portable version of Chromium is very handy if you don't want to leave "footprints" at Internet cafes or on computers used by others. Because this application will run from USB, it does not store cache data on the computer and cookies will remain on the USB.

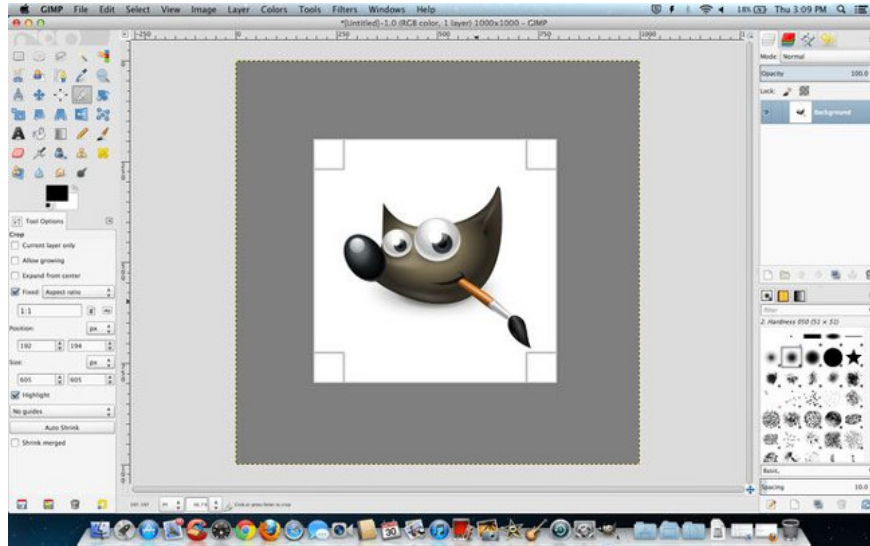
3. XMind



This is one of the great portable applications for mind mapping and drawing for Mac. You can access this powerful toolkit anywhere.

In addition to thinking, XMind also allows you to design clean, neat presentations and have a 'sophisticated' user interface that helps you work more organized and scientific. A lot of thought patterns and maps are available for you to choose from for a variety of purposes or you can "craft" your own chart.

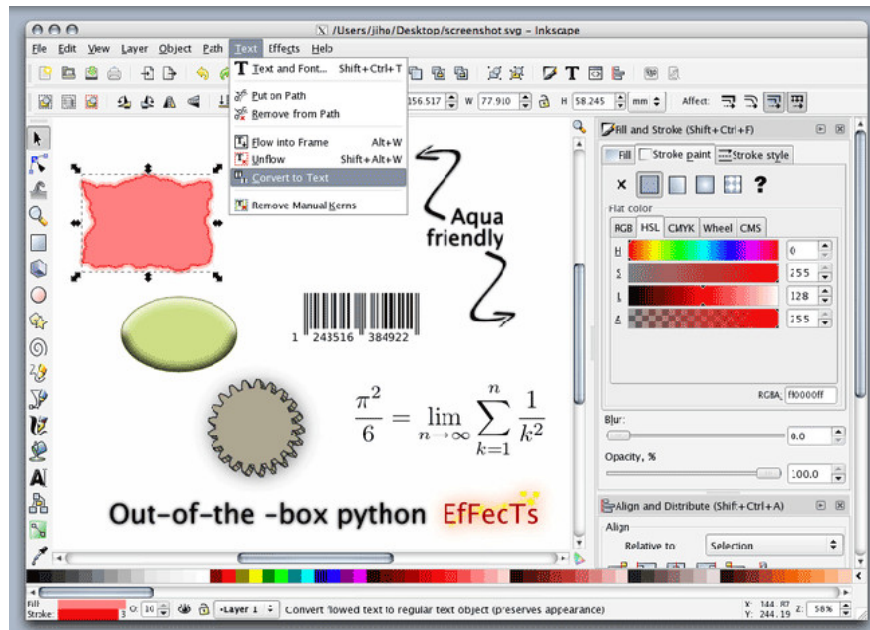
4. Portable Gimp



GIMP is a wise choice, if you want to own an application with most of Photoshop's features without losing a single fee. This is a free, open-source photo editor that for a long time is the number one alternative for Photoshop.

The interface is like a lighter Photoshop version, allowing you to create and edit images with a layer-based system. With its in-depth feature, GIMP is aimed at professional users so your USB with this GIMP application is very convenient.

5. Portable Inkscape



If GIMP is a version of Photoshop, Inkscape is a graphics software similar to Adobe Illustrator. This is a perfect vector drawing program, built for business users to create logos, illustrations, charts, diagrams, statistics tables and similar figures. This application has made many leaps and bounds since it was first launched in 2003 and at this time, it is handy in all areas - from CMYK color system to high quality graphic texture.
