5. Facebook is making money from services

Rumors like this seem reasonable when you consider the arguments that Farhad Manjoo, Slate's journalist, posted in 2008. Manjoo points out that if 5% of Facebook users agree to pay For \$ 5 a month for this service, Facebook can earn hundreds of millions of dollars a year with fees from members only.

Fortunately, this company currently has no plans to collect money for its services. According to Business Week's interview with Facebook CEO, Sheryl Sandberg, Facebook is still doing profitable business and profits are increasing rapidly based solely on the advertising power of the company. Therefore, it is difficult to talk about the future and affirm how Facebook's business model will be. So, Facebook lovers can still keep their money in their wallet every time they log in and are comfortable using Facebook services.

4. Facebook founder stole the idea to set up this site

Mark Zuckerberg, the founder and general manager of Facebook, was announced by Forbes Magazine as the youngest billionaire at the age of 24. However, before creating Facebook, Zuckerberg went on renting a code for some friend at Harvard to create a website called Harvard Connection. This website is designed to connect student information together, similar to Facebook. The last part of the story depends on who you will ask. Harvard connected students believe that Zuckerberg has deliberately neglected his job to create his own website. On the other hand, they claim that his Facebook idea is very similar to Harvard's Facemash, his previous website. Facemash used very simply when connecting Harvard students together, allowing them to compare and comment on each other's photos. The rapid success of this website helped Zuckerberg to think of connecting friends and acquaintances. From there, Zuckerberg said he felt very interesting at the social network at the time and the idea of Facebook also stems from his old job.

So, what is the real story? After a long battle between Zuckerberg and the founder of Harvard Connection (now called ConnectU), the case had to be addressed by the court. According to a statement from defense counsel for Harvard Connection, Facebook agreed to pay \$ 61 million in cash and shares to end the case. It was a big sum, but it was still nothing compared to Facebook's income for a day, which explains why the next rumor is listed.

3. Company X is preparing to buy back Facebook



For many people, a billion dollars can be a big money, but for Facebook's general manager, Mark Zuckerberg, this money is still nothing. After two years of running Facebook, Zuckerberg began negotiating with Yahoo!, discussing the resale of the company. Facebook and MySpace rivals sold for \$ 580 after only one year of operation and had more users than Facebook at the time. So Yahoo! made a \$ 1 billion offer to buy this Web site. However, Zuckerberg thinks differently. He wanted to keep the right to run the company and run the company himself.

This turns out to be a precise step for Zuckerberg, only a year later, Microsoft priced Facebook at \$ 15 billion. Granted, Microsoft has a unique reason for paying such a high price for this site, especially it can ensure that no competitor can buy Facebook at that price. However, pricing in early 2009 for Facebook reached nearly \$ 4 billion, much higher than the \$ 1 billion Yahoo offered. However, rumors about the acquisition of the company have ended since then. In an interview with Time magazine, Zuckerberg claimed that selling Facebook was not the company's main goal. Instead, he thinks that Facebook is very busy working on finding the best way for people to connect online with each other.

2. Facebook loses your social skills



There's no denying that Facebook makes connecting with friends and relatives far easier, but this convenience can cost a lot. West London Mental Health Trust Himanshu Tyagi, a psychologist, warned that because social networking makes communication so easy, people can influence the real world.
