

Trick to turn off notifications from Facebook on Chrome browser

On-screen notification feature is a convenient feature of new browsers, especially **Chrome** . You can update new messages, new emails or new notifications . from incoming websites even while working.

However, getting too many messages can make you feel annoying, especially if you are spammed and advertised. The best way for you to avoid hassles is to turn off notifications from these websites.

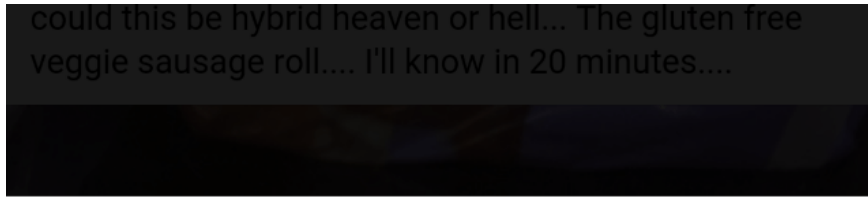
1. Enable the feature to receive notifications directly from Facebook on Chrome browser



The feature of receiving direct notifications from websites as well as social networking sites with **Chrome** browser on **Android devices** is a new feature. **Android** users can update new messages, notifications .

To activate this feature on your **Android** device, first on the **Chrome** browser toolbar , tap the 3 dots icon. Scroll down to **Menu** select **Setting => Site Setting => Notifications**.

On the **Notifications** screen, you will see the default **Ask first option** . This option allows you to choose to receive or block notifications from the websites you want.

Tap the circle icon lightly on the slider, drag to the right to activate the notification feature.

2. Turn off the notification feature from Facebook on Android Chrome browser

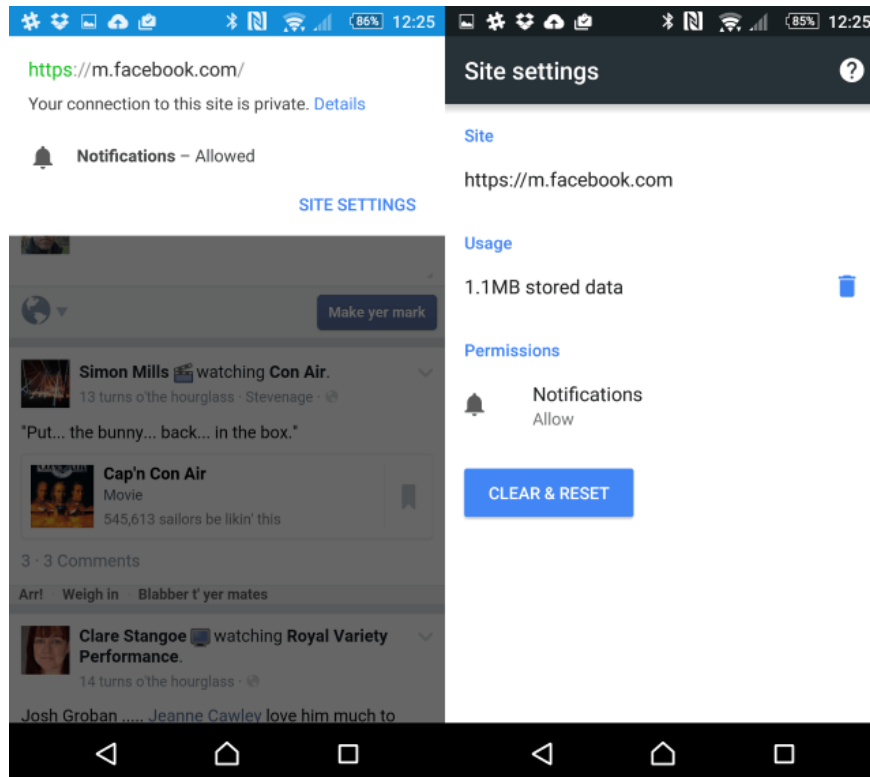
If you are logging into **Facebook** with **Chrome** browser on **Android devices** , you can completely receive notifications from **Facebook** without having to install the **Facebook** application.

In case if **Facebook** notifications make you feel annoying, especially if you get spam and attack ads. The best way to solve this problem is to open the **Chrome** browser on your **Android** device to set off notifications from these sites.

On your address bar, touch the 3 dots icon. Scroll down to **Menu** select **Setting** => **Site Setting** => **Notifications**.

On the **Notifications** screen, you will see the default **Ask first option** . This option allows you to choose to receive or block notifications from the websites you want.

Tap the circle icon lightly on the slider, drag to the left to turn off the notification feature from the page.



3. Turn off notifications from Facebook on Chrome computer browser

Step 1:

To turn off notifications from websites or social networks on your computer **Chrome** browser, first open your **Chrome** browser, click the icon (?) on the top right, then select **Settings** .

Alternatively, you can type **chrome: // settings** into the address bar and press **Enter**.

Step 2:

Scroll to the bottom of the page and click **Show advanced settings** (show **advanced settings**).

Step 3:

In the **Privacy** section, click on **Content settings** .

Step 4:

Scroll down to **Notifications** (notice)

Notifications

- Allow all sites to show notifications
- Ask when a site wants to show notifications (recommended)
- Do not allow any site to show notifications

Step 5:

Select **Do not allow any site to show desktop notifications** (do not allow any website to display notifications).

Step 6:

If you want to allow certain websites to send you notifications, click on **A** while **when a site wants to show desktop notifications** (ask when the **site wants to show notifications**). The websites you allow will be sent notifications.

Step 7:

Click **Manage exceptions** to see a list of websites you allow to send notifications. To the right of each **URL** of each page there is an option to allow or block the dialog box. You can block sites that do not want to receive notifications here.
