Set up your Windows version to disable the Autoplay feature for all system devices. The fastest way I know to accomplish this result is to set up a group policy for the computer.

Below is a video tutorial of turning off Autoplay on Windows 10, Windows XP and Vista, please follow:

Enter **gpedit** in the search bar to open the Group policy editor.

Next in the left panel of the Local Group Policy Editor window, go to the following order:

Computer Configuration > Administrative Templates > Windows Components > AutoPlay Policies

Look to the right, find **Turn off Autoplay** and double click on it. Select **Enabled**, in the Options box, select **All drives** to turn off on all drives, or just turn off CD drives and removable drives.
