

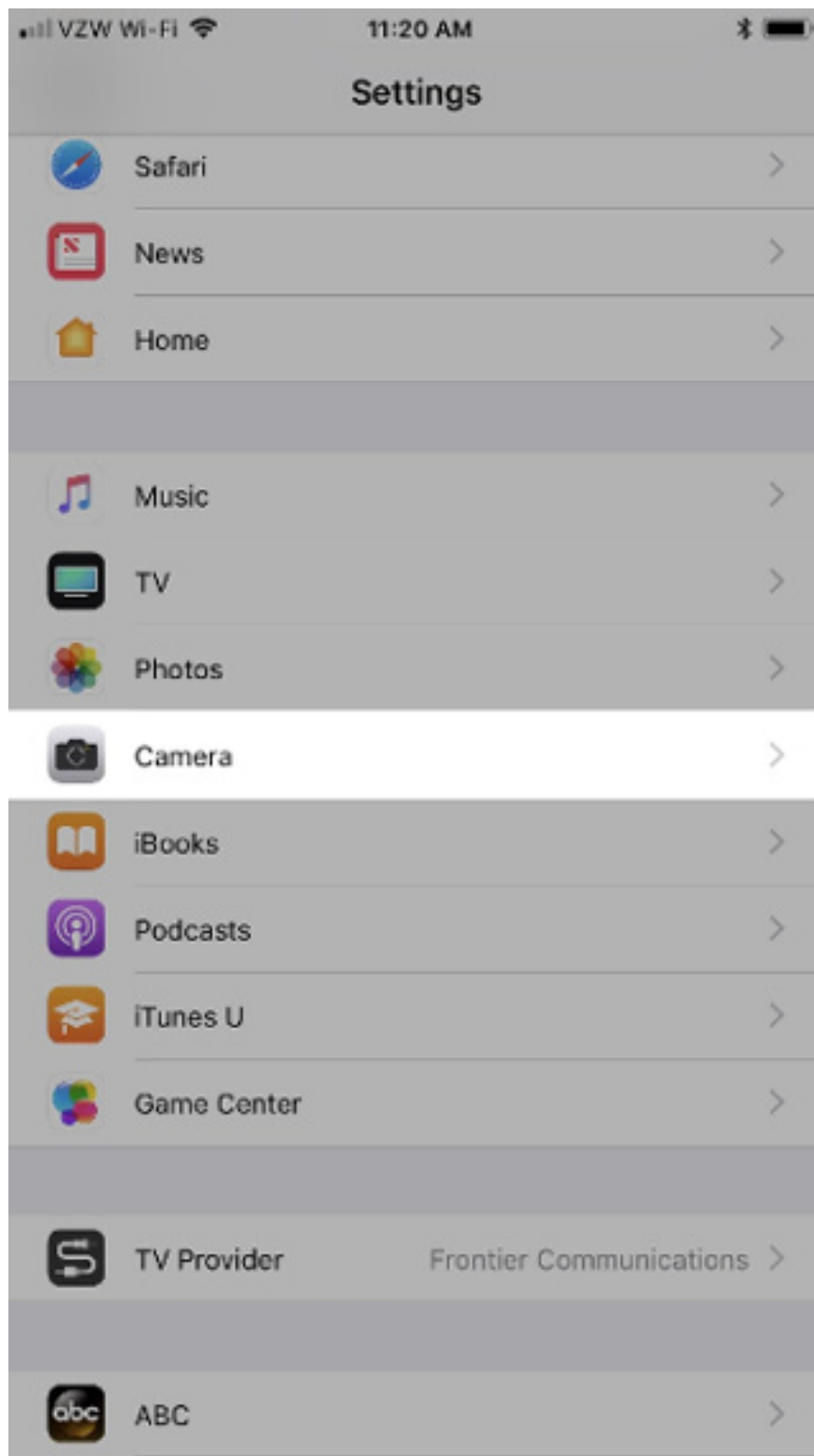
Turn on the secret feature of iPhone Camera on iOS 11

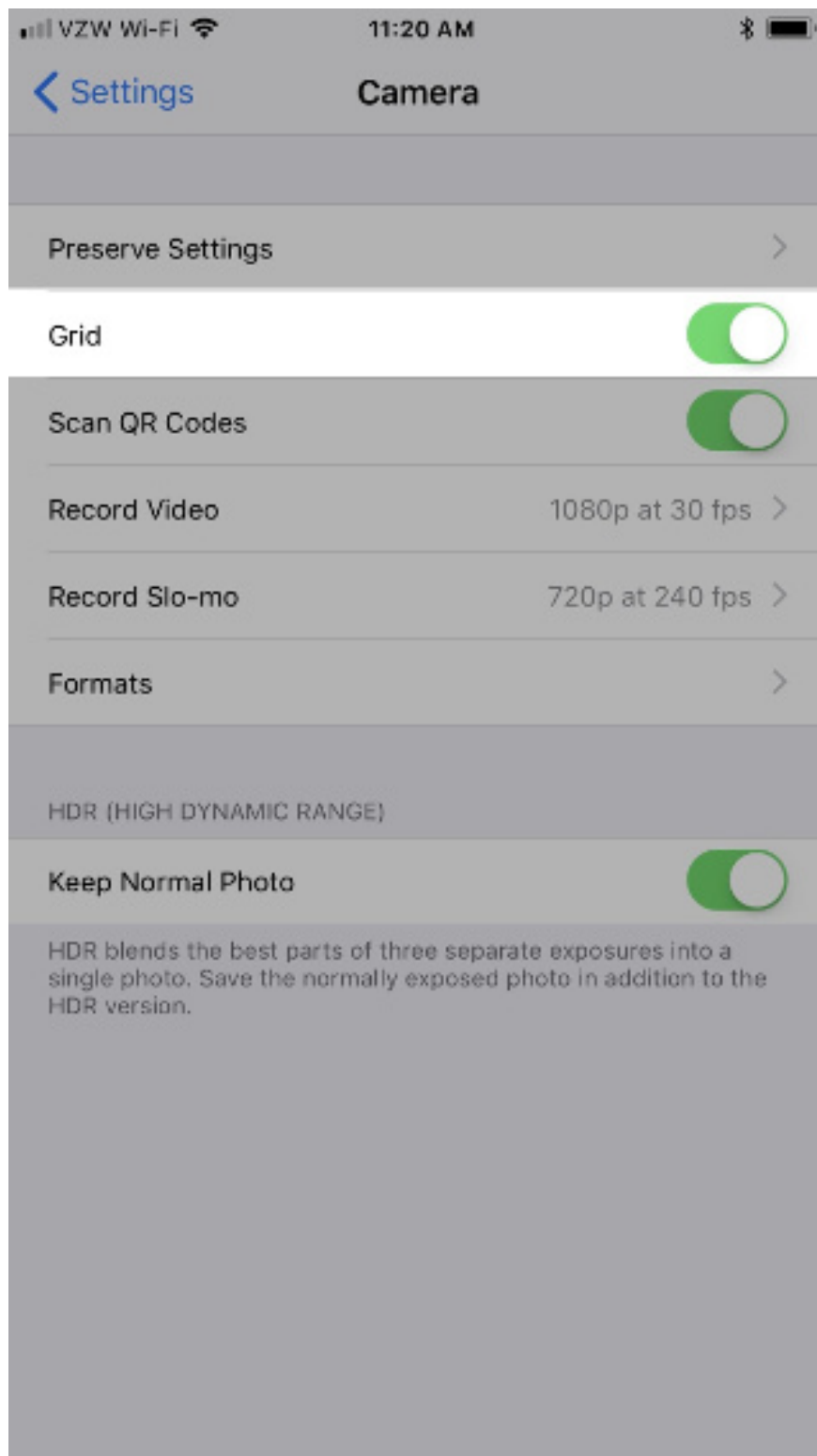

To unlock this new hidden feature of iPhone on iOS 11, simply go to the **Settings** app, then touch the **Camera** to see its settings. In previous versions of iOS, the Camera app was grouped with the **Photo** app's settings, so it was great when it was finally split.



In Camera settings, all you have to do is turn on the '**Grid**'. This will overlap a grid with four lines that make up the 9 cells equally on the viewfinder in the Camera app, helping you apply the 'third rule' in the image better to get balanced shots. than.



By turning on the "Grid" feature, it also displays a light yellow (crosshair) cross. This cross will turn into a dark yellow color when your iPhone is completely parallel to the ground or ceiling. This feature works in Photo, Time-lapse, Portrait and Square, but does not work in video options.
