

# Turn Windows XP / Vista functions like Windows 7

If you like these features and want to include them in your existing Windows operating system version (XP or Vista), here are some applications that allow you to use it to turn your functions into Windows XP / Vista is like Windows 7.*

## Taskbar

In Windows 7, the new taskbar is represented by large icons so you can easily access your favorite applications. In Windows XP / Vista, you can also easily get that with Windows 7 Taskbar Iconizer. This is a simple program that you can use to convert the taskbar interface. No need to require any installation, you can easily switch back to the original interface.

Download Windows 7 Taskbar Iconizer.

Double-click the application to run the application.



Click on the image to the right of your iconized taskbar. Restart the computer for your changes to take effect.

## AeroPeek for Windows XP / Vista

Windows 7 with AeroPeek allows you to see the thumbnails of the opened windows, allowing you to quickly see the desktop above the lower right when you move the mouse and also mark the active window and make the Other windows are transparent.

To get those effects, we need to use the combination of AeroPeek utility and virtual task tips.

Download and install AeroPeek and virtual task tips. AeroPeek application requires .NET framework 3.5 to run. If you haven't already, download it here.

Start your computer. Run AeroPeek and virtual task tips through the Start menu. You can also get transparent window effects and thumbnails.



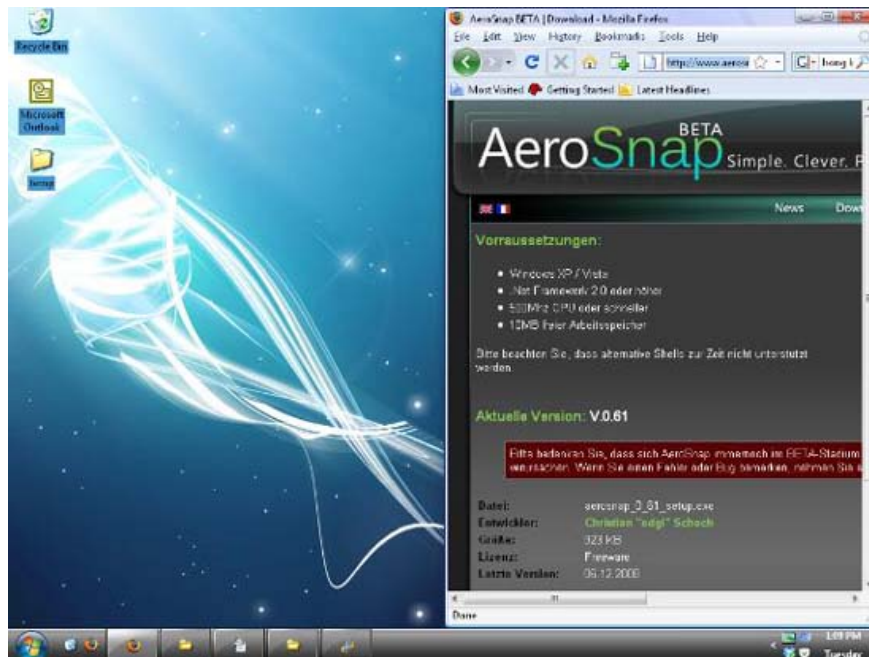
### **AeroSnap for Windows XP / Vista**

The feature automatically reduces the window size to half the screen size and aligns left when you drag the window to the sides. When you drag the window to the top of the screen, Window maximizes the entire screen.

In Windows XP / Vista, this feature can be achieved using AeroSnap.

Download and install AeroSnap.

Run AeroSnap via the Start menu. Now drag your window to the side and release, then you will see it will be resized and aligned to a certain edge. You can also drag the window to the top of the screen to enlarge it again.



Although it is difficult to display the entire effect of AeroSnap in some images above, you will find it quite interesting to try it.

### **AeroShake for Windows XP / Vista**

AeroShake is another feature of Windows 7 that allows you to minimize all windows except the window is active by shaking your windows with the mouse. In Windows XP / Vista, AeroShake application was developed using AutoHotKeys scripts.

Download AeroShake. No installation required. You just need to double-click the downloaded application to run them. Drag your active window with the mouse and shake it. You will then see all the above effects.
