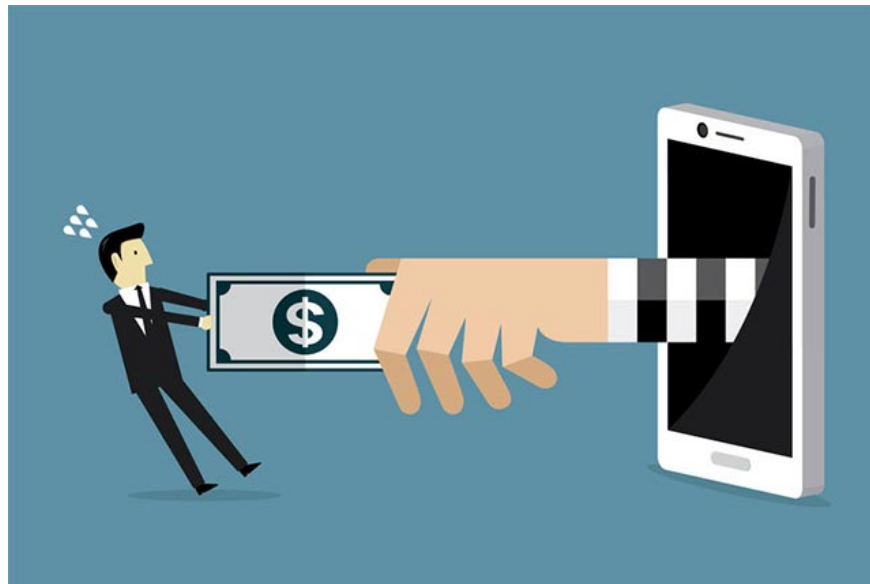


# Two college students allegedly cheated nearly \$ 1 million of Apple

National illegally. His colleague Quan Jiang, who is studying engineering at Linn Benton Community College (also in Oregon), shared an address with Zhou and will send a fake iPhone to an online service center. Apple, or directly to the company's warranty headquarters to request replacement to the new iPhone.

'After real iPhones were sent to China to make a profit, another partner would be tasked to transfer money to Jiang's mother, and she would then deposit money into a bank account that Jiang was using. in the US ', police representative explained.

According to complaints filed in federal courts, both Jiang and Zhou claimed that they were completely unaware of the phones sent from China as counterfeit goods. Both are currently bailed, but are subject to strict surveillance from the police. Currently, Zhou is accused of exporting illegal goods, while Jiang faces charges of illegally selling counterfeit goods and committing organized scams that have serious consequences.

An employee of the US Homeland Security Agent explained in complaints that this seemingly 'funny' and extremely simple plan could succeed and cause damage. so big mainly because Apple Store staff were unable, or incompetent, to verify the authenticity of the fake iPhone devices used in the mission because they could not turn on the power, and the Apple phone replacement process was activated during that time, because two Chinese men claimed they were entitled to product warranty benefits. Besides the lack of product validation, it is impossible not to mention some of the 'deadly' gaps in Apple's product warranty and return policy. Clearly, the company did not ask for proof of purchase before approving the product renewal request, which was exploited completely by Jiang and Zhou.

## **The Apple claims the scammer knows smuggled iPhones from China are 'fake'.**

Jiang allegedly sent a total of 3,069 warranty claims in return and as a result, Apple gave him 1,493 replacement iPhones, with an initial estimate of \$ 600 per phone. Thus, at first glance, Apple has lost nearly 900,000 dollars from this program. During the period from June to July 2017, Apple sent Jiang's 'dead' iPhones to Zhou's listed address, informing Jiang that Apple had a grasp of the fact that he was importing fake iPhones, However, Jiang did not respond to any announcements from this manufacturer.

In fact, this is not a fraudulent act of taking advantage of a warranty policy that causes great losses in general and foreigners in particular for US technology companies. Last year, a Chinese citizen who lived in New Jersey state on a student visa also guilty of selling fake iPhones and iPads to many customers in the United States, pocketing

all 1.1 million dollars - some money is not small at all. . And just last month, a Lithuanian man was accused of cheating on two giant tech companies, Google and Facebook, for nearly \$ 100 million, by sending it to Google and Facebook fake invoices via email and pretended to be employees of a Taiwanese hardware manufacturing company called Quanta Computer, currently a partner of the two software vendors.
