## Los Angeles air raid, USA

Los Angeles air strikes took place from the night of the 24th and the early morning of February 25, 1942 - just three months after Japan attacked Pearl Harbor.

## **Subhas Chandra Bose's mysterious death**



Subhas Chandra Bose is an Indian politician. During the Second World War, he was opposed to British rule and sought help from both Nazi Germany and Japan. Therefore, all allied countries regard Chandra Bose as an enemy.

On August 18, 1945, Japanese bombers carrying Chandra Bose and 12 passengers and crew took off from Tokyo after attending some secret meetings with fascist commanders. during World War II.

But after taking off not long, the plane suddenly crashed in Taiwan. After discovering the body, Chandra Bose's body was quickly found and taken to cremation. His ashes were taken to a temple in Tokyo.

However, it was later reported that Chandra Bos was alive and went to the Soviet Union. In 1946, one theory was that the Indian leader was Chinese.

One of the confidential documents published in 1999 revealed that Chandra Bose was secretly living in Bengal. Before those rumors, the Indian government remained silent without giving any comment, so the death of this Indian leader is still a secret.
