

Use Kaspersky Rescue Disk 10 from a USB Flash drive

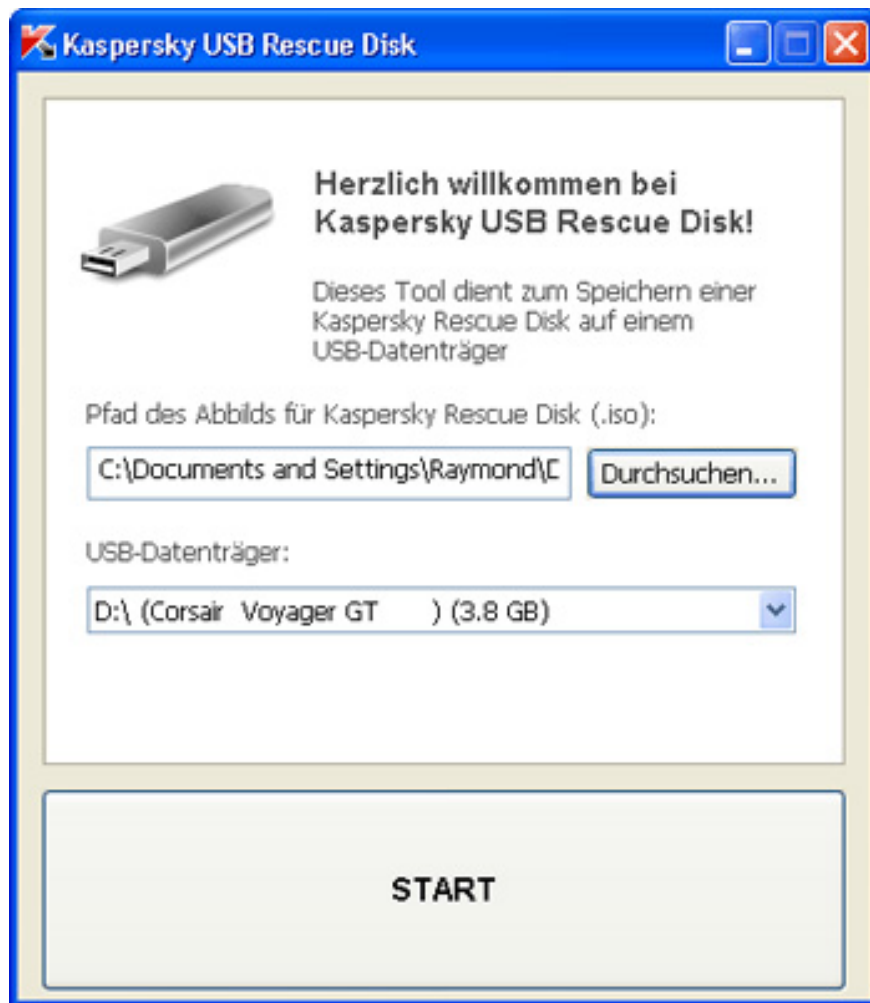


Designed and applied to scan, isolate computers using Windows x86 and x64 operating system platforms that have been infected by the virus. This tool proved to be really useful when the system was in a 'critical' situation and almost impossible to recover, then security programs and other support tools also proved helpless. . The main reason is that the operating system cannot control the control behavior and control when the file system is uploaded during the initial boot process. On the other hand, in emergency repair mode, users can only start the process of reviewing and updating the database but will then be returned to this process, and only the statistics

can be viewed. .

Kaspersky Rescue Disk 10 was developed and supplied in ISO format, so you can burn to any blank CD and boot the system with that disc. And with USB storage devices that have become so popular now, Kaspersky developers have released an additional support tool, Kaspersky Rescue Disk 10 to USB flash drive.

First, you need to download Kaspersky Rescue Disk 10 here and then Kaspersky USB Rescue Disk (RD2USB). Connect the USB to the computer and open the **rescue2usb_1.0.0.4.exe** program, select **Install** . Kaspersky USB Rescue Disk automatically recognizes USB devices on the computer:



Click the **Durchsuchen** button and point to the archive folder Kaspersky Rescue Disk 10 downloaded earlier. Then press **START** , the program will warn users to format the USB drive, then install **Grub loader** and copy the file Kaspersky Rescue Disk 10 ISO. When this process is finished, you can use this USB to boot the affected computers, infected by the virus.

One difference is that this tool can burn Rescue Disk file (ISO) to USB without KAV / KIS 2011 on the system. The current version of Kaspersky Rescue Disk v10.0.23.14 with the latest updated database as of July 22, 2010. If you want to update yourself, you can select **Start update** at the My Update Center work card with an average speed of about 30 KB / sec, and to complete this process will take about 5-7 minutes.
