

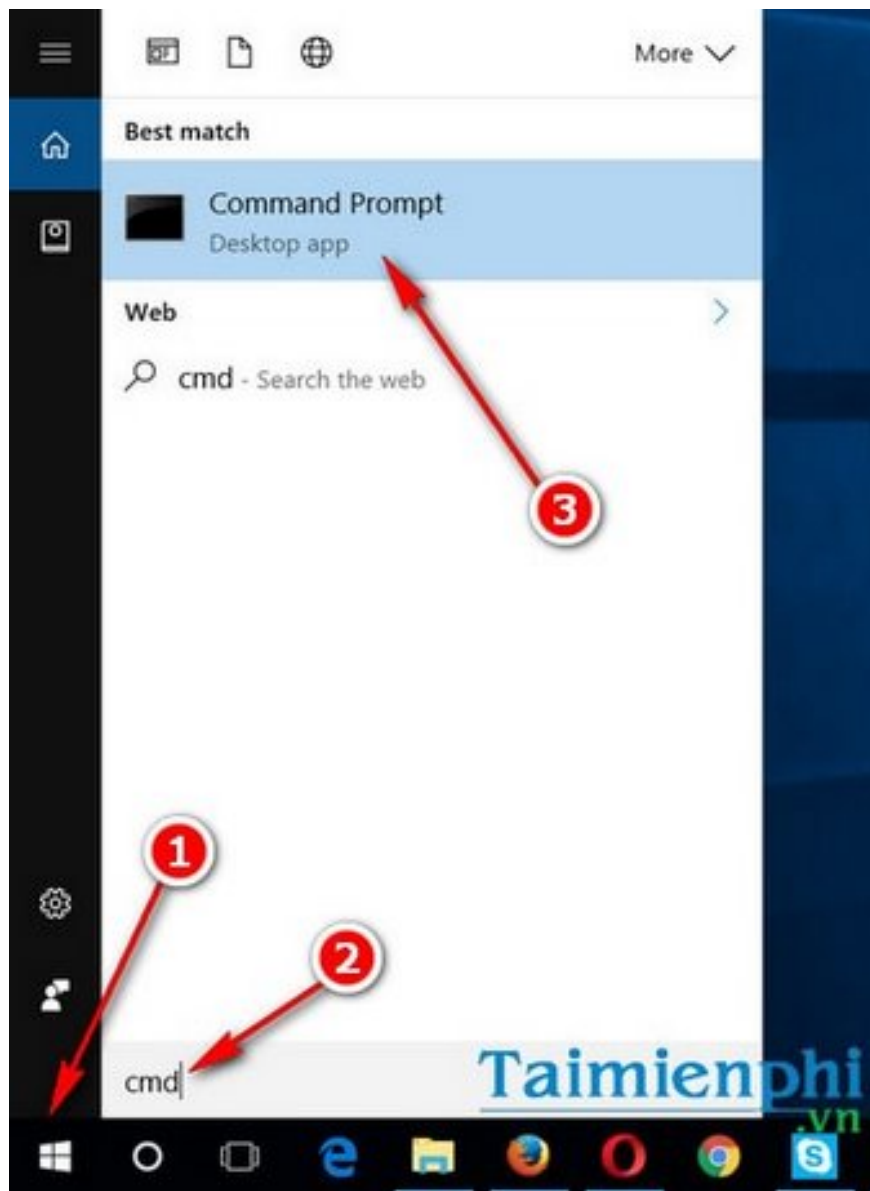
Using Command Prompt shortcuts on Windows 10

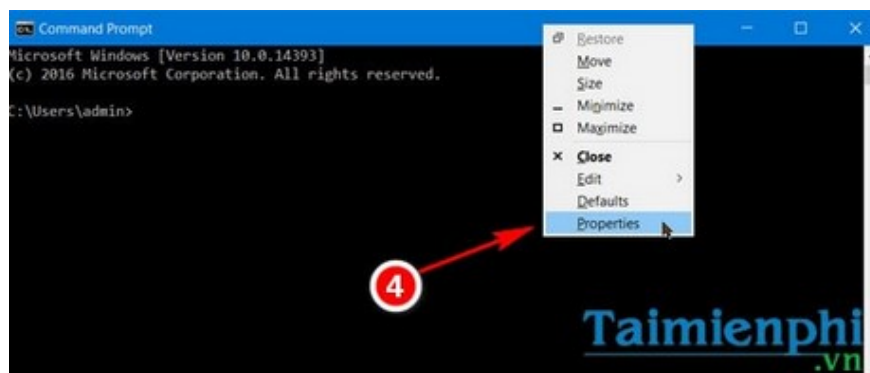
Command Prompt is a command-line interpreter application available in Windows operating systems. In Windows 10, Command Prompt has undergone many significant advancements and changes, especially the Command Prompt shortcut for interacting with applications. Knowing how to use Command Prompt shortcuts will not only allow you to easily customize the operating system but also participate in many other tricks, such as updating Windows 10 or checking hard drive health.

Using Command Prompt shortcuts on Windows 10

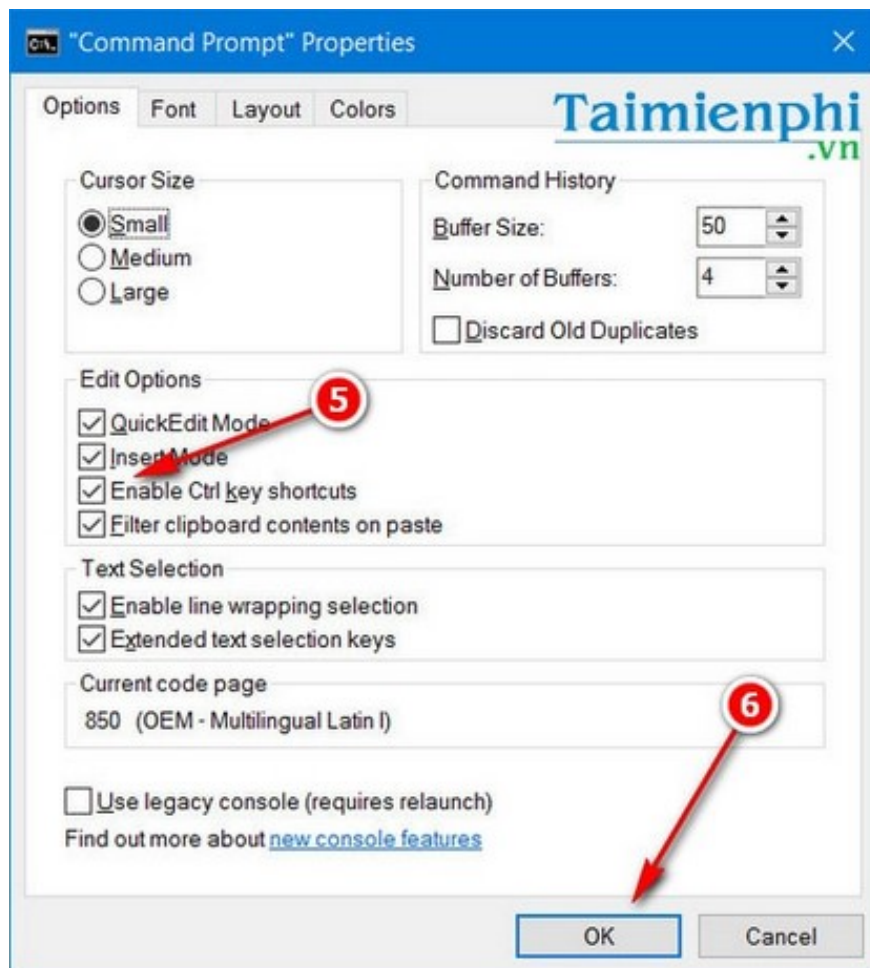
Step 1: Open Command Prompt on Windows 10 by pressing the Start Menu > typing **cmd** to open Command Prompt.



After opening the Command Prompt window, right-click on the title bar and select **Properties** .



Step 2: In the **Options** tab , check the box for **Enable Ctrl key shortcuts**. Click **OK** to complete and continue.



Below is a compilation of all Command Prompt keyboard shortcuts in Windows 8.

- + **Ctrl + A** : Selects all text in the current line of the cursor. If the current line is empty, it will select all text in the Command Prompt window.
- + **Ctrl + C** or **Ctrl + Insert** : Copy the selected text to memory.
- + **Ctrl + V** or **Shift + Insert** : Paste text from memory at the desired location.
- + **Shift + Up/Down/Left/Right** : Moves the cursor one character at a time in each of the four directions.
- + **Ctrl + Shift + Left/Right** : Select one word at a time with the cursor.
- + **Shift + Home/End** : Moves the cursor to the beginning or end of the line, and simultaneously selects the entire executed code segment.
- + **Shift + PageUp/PageDown** : Moves the cursor up or down on the screen, and the text is selected.
- + **Ctrl + Up/Down** : Move up or down one line in the command history.
- + **Ctrl + PageUp/PageDown** : Scroll up or down the typing history on the page.
- + **Ctrl + M** : Highlight the selected text.

+ **Ctrl + F** : Opens the search window in Command Prompt.

+ **Alt + F4** : Closes the Command Prompt window.

On Windows 10, Microsoft has released many new keyboard shortcuts to assist users in interacting with the operating system. While Windows 10 shortcuts are generally easy to access and use, not everyone knows how to choose the most useful shortcuts for their personal needs.

Similarly, with Command Prompt, users have many Command Prompt shortcuts to choose from and change. However, regardless of which Command Prompt shortcut you use, you need to understand the features of this tool, such as how to start Command Prompt on Windows 7 or Windows 10, or how to check your hard drive using Command Prompt. Hopefully, no matter which method you use **to start Command Prompt** , you will know how to effectively use Command Prompt on Windows 10 and other operating system versions.
