

# Ways to fix the trackpad not working on MacBook

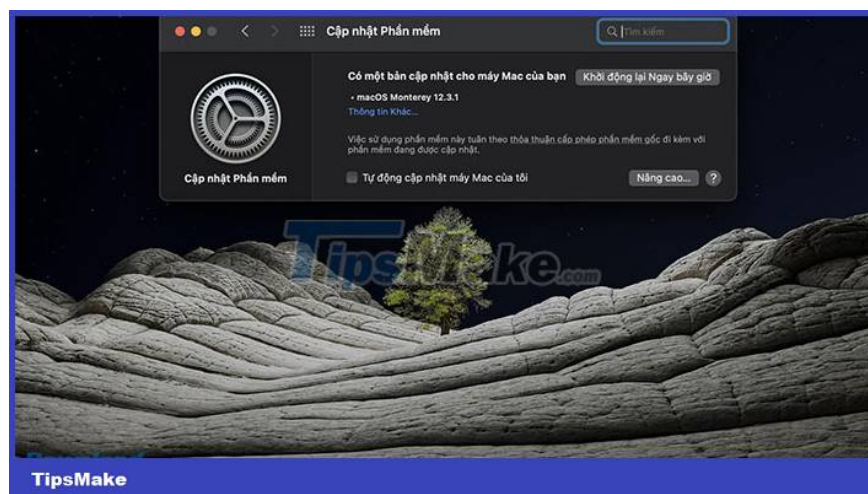
## Remove any connected peripherals

While it usually doesn't cause problems with the trackpad, removing the mouse that's connected to the MacBook is an easy first thing to do.

Please disconnect an external mouse. Next, restart the computer and see if the problem is fixed. If not, try the following methods.

## Check for software updates

The second factor to check is as simple as removing a mouse from the system. Software updates can resolve any touchpad problems within seconds. To do this, open System Preferences > Software Update.



This will automatically check for any available updates, and if there are any, simply click the Update now button to launch them.

Along with the computer's software, this can also entail firmware updates, which in turn fix trackpad issues.

## Check the relevant trackpad settings

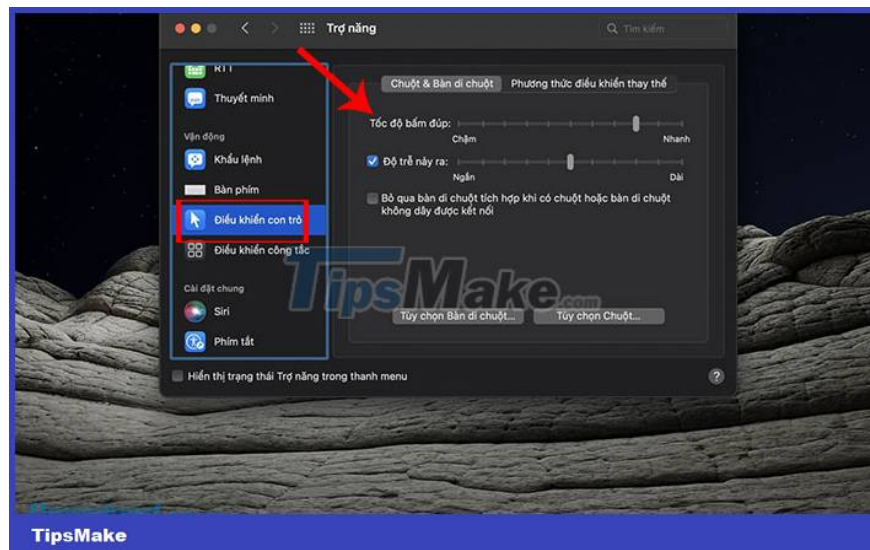
Assuming no updates are available (or they don't solve the problem), then the next destination MacBook users need to navigate to is the touchpad settings. People can fix many errors by tweaking some of the options here.

### Double click doesn't work

If the trackpad seems fully functional except for double-clicking, it's possible that the delay time for the gesture recognition system is being set too low.

If you're new to a trackpad (instead of a traditional mouse) or your gestures aren't as responsive as some, this could be a cause.

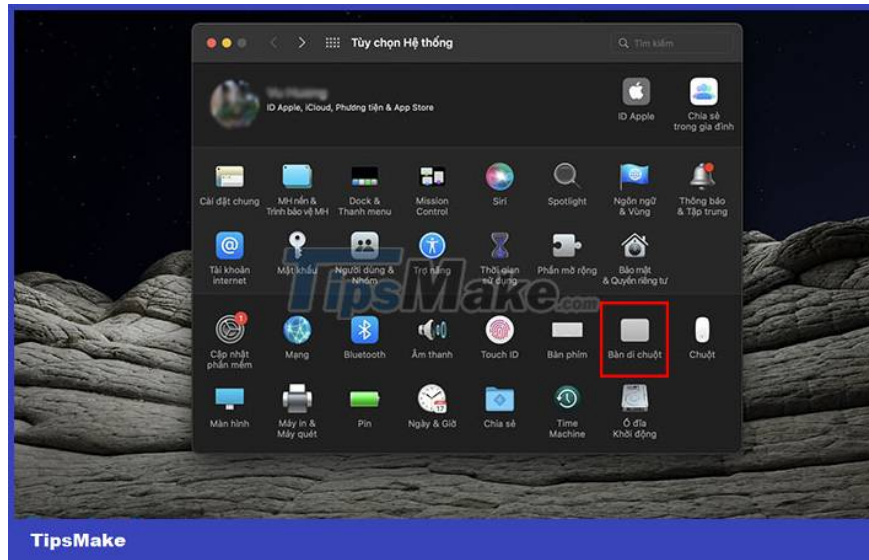
To access the double-click settings, go to System Preferences > Accessibility and scroll down the left sidebar until you see Pointer Controls.



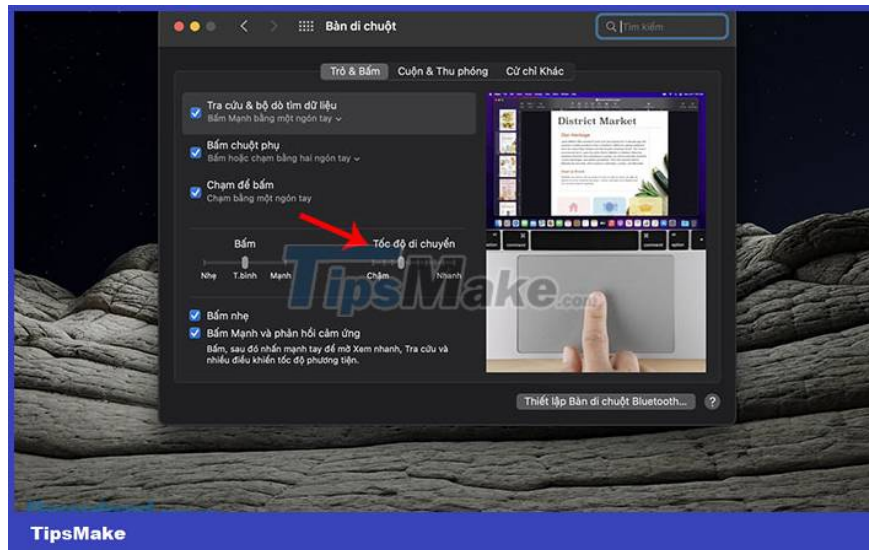
People will see a variety of options available, but the one to tweak here is Double Click Speed. Lower it from its current position, about the middle being adequate for most users.

### Cursor is hard to control

If you find the mouse pointer too sensitive, you can try adjusting the movement speed. Again, go to System Preferences > Trackpad.



Everyone will see a slider at the bottom of the window titled Movement Speed. Like above, a speed setting in the middle should be fine for most MacBook users.
