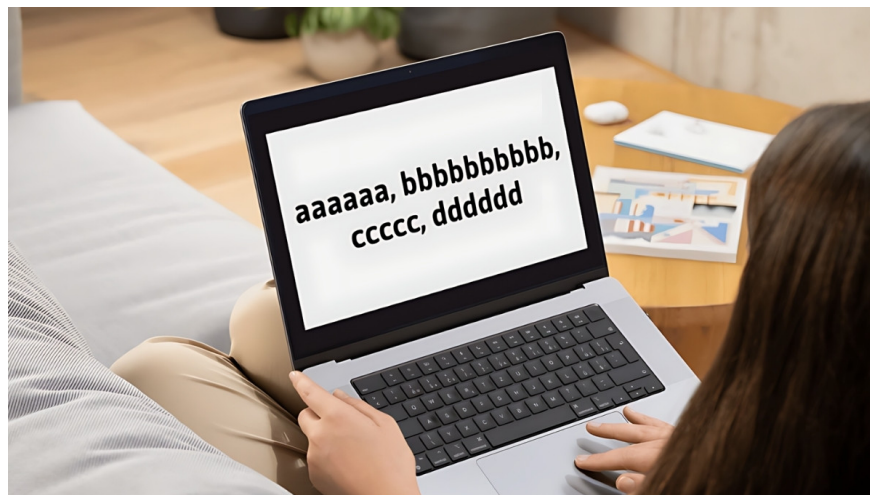

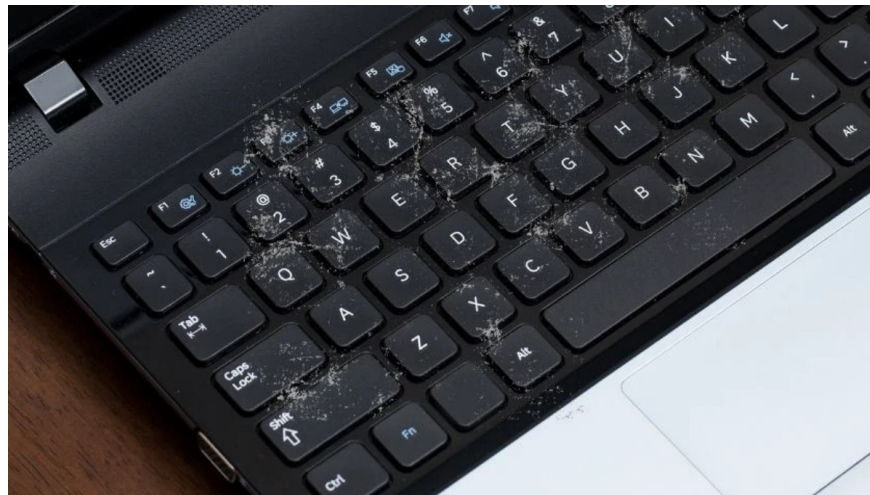

Reasons why laptop keys get stuck

Dirt accumulates

Keyboard driver error
