

# What changes does iPhone 15 have compared to iPhone 14?

## Design and display



Unfortunately, Apple hasn't made any major display changes to the standard iPhone since the iPhone 12. Aside from the iPhone 14 Pro's adoption of Dynamic Island, the iPhone 15 looks almost identical to its predecessor. .

Both models have the same size 6.1-inch Super Retina XDR display. However, the iPhone 15 can deliver a maximum brightness of 2,000 nits, while its predecessor only had 1,200 nits, making it better for outdoor use.

While both models have an aluminum frame and a glass back, the iPhone 15 ditches the glossy back in favor of a matte textured surface. It also has slightly rounded edges, making it more comfortable to hold.

## Camera configuration



iPhone 14 has a dual camera system, with a 12MP main camera and an ultra-wide lens. On the other hand, the main camera of the iPhone 15 has a leap forward because Apple increased the resolution to 48 megapixels. This means you can capture images with impeccable detail and more accurate and realistic colors, with the flexibility to shoot in both 24MP and 48MP.

However, the iPhone 15's 12MP ultra-wide camera remains unchanged compared to its predecessor. However, you can take great selfies with both devices as they both have the same 12MP selfie camera.

However, Apple introduced a next-generation portrait photography feature on the iPhone 15, allowing you to take portrait photos in the default camera mode that you can adjust later in the Photos app.

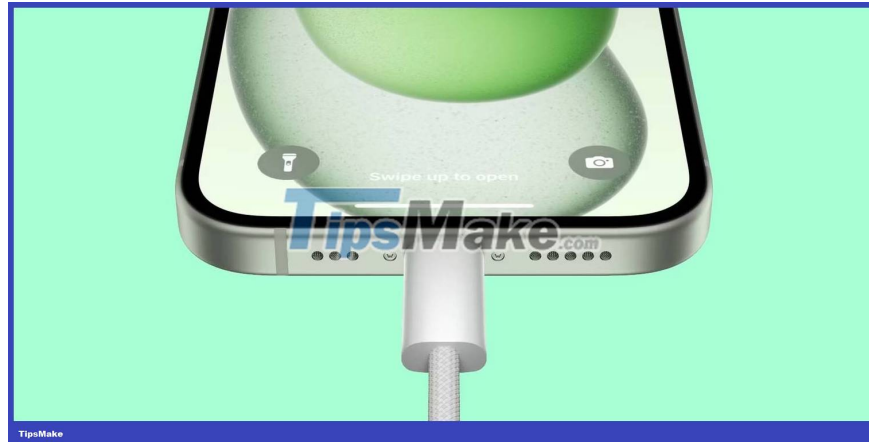
## Price, color and storage options



After launching the iPhone 15, Apple reduced the starting price of the iPhone 14 to \$699. The base 128GB model of the iPhone 15 retails for \$799, the same as the iPhone 14 at launch. Both models have 3 different storage options: 128GB, 256GB and 512GB.

iPhone 15 comes in 5 different colors: Yellow, Green, Blue, Black and Pink. On the other hand, iPhone 14 has 6 bright color options: Blue, Purple, Yellow, Midnight black, Starlight white and (PRODUCT)RED.

## Performance and battery life



iPhone 15 is equipped with an A16 Bionic chip, the same processor that comes with the iPhone 14 Pro models. On the other hand, the iPhone 14 has the same A15 Bionic chip that Apple introduced with the iPhone 13 Pro models. Apple claims the A16 chip consumes 20% less power than the A15.

With the 4nm architecture of the A16 chip, you can expect better performance than the 5nm A15 chip. Overall, the iPhone 14 is equipped with all the power you need for everyday use. However, upgrading to the iPhone 15 might be a good idea if you plan to use it for the next few years.

Apple has also ditched the Lightning port in favor of USB-C on the iPhone 15. While this change means you can use one cable to charge all your devices, there are no speed improvements. charging and data transmission.

When it comes to battery life, both devices offer up to 20 hours of video playback and 80 hours of audio playback, according to Apple's claims. This is surprising because the iPhone 15 has a slightly larger battery. Charging speeds remain the same for both devices - charge up to 50% within 30 minutes using a 20W adapter or higher.

Unless you want a slight performance advantage and all the perks that USB-C brings to the iPhone, you probably won't notice any improvement if you choose the iPhone 15 over its predecessor. .

## Is upgrading to iPhone 15 worth it?

You may be wondering whether the small design tweaks, similar battery life, and small performance improvements are worth upgrading to the iPhone 15. When deciding whether an upgrade is worth it, you must consider the specific features that are most important to you.

If you want a newer device that can support iOS updates a little longer, the iPhone 15 is a no-brainer. However, if you just need a device for daily use at a cheaper price, the iPhone 14 will not disappoint you.
