

What governs choosing a laptop?

Price

Top priority is always the cost of the product. You must always determine how your "purse" is and how much you are willing to pay, usually the maximum amount to "buy" a laptop. Laptop prices have fallen a lot, on average a "popular" model costs around \$ 550, but high-end models also reach thousands of dollars.

Function

This is a heavy technical factor in product selection, but it is also not terrible.

The first thing to consider is the screen size. Popular laptop screens range from 11 to 17 inches (diagonal, 1 inch = 2.54 cm). New models all use widescreen - "widescreen". If the mobility is more important than a spacious workspace, the small screen will be the right choice, because the screen size is coupled with the weight of the machine. But keep in mind that small screens when working on your eyes and hands will not be comfortable but constrained by the "tightness". So, if possible, when buying a device, try it for a while to assess the comfort you need to use it for a long time.

With processors, RAM and hard drives, larger numbers will give better performance for laptops. However, there are exceptions. The clock speed of the dual-core processor may be lower but still perform faster than the higher clocked type but the single core. Best for common users are the models with minimal configuration, including 2 GHz clock processor, 1 GB RAM capacity, 160 GB HDD. Ordinary users are "defined" as laptop users primarily to surf the web, run common office applications, edit photos at the basic level, watch standard-form music videos or play 2D games lightly.

In addition, buyers can still choose lower or more configurations for these components, but must ensure that the desired use needs are met.

Battery life is also important. Laptop models with 3 to 5 hours of battery life are ideal. In addition, make sure the laptop you choose has the most common communication and communication ports, such as an optical drive, usually a DVD-RW burner, VGA output monitor, USB port, and connectivity. WIFI. Other features such as Bluetooth connectivity, firewire, eSata or newer HDMI ports are rarely used but will be a preparation for the future.

Operating system is not a problem when choosing a machine because there is a clear division with Apple laptops - all running Mac OS. The rest of the companies mostly use Microsoft Windows, the most common being Windows Vista alongside Windows SP3 less (mostly for netbooks). Very few laptops offer Linux operating system options.

Heavy subjectivity is the color and design of the laptop. These choices depend on personal preferences.

Trademark

This factor is more or less subjective, but it should not be taken lightly. Should choose products of famous brands such as Lenovo, Acer, Dell, Sony, HP, Panasonic, Toshiba, Apple, IBM, Asus, or Samsung . and many other reputable manufacturers. You should actively seek more information about the brand name as well as the

selected brand.

If your "purse" is strong then the balance between the above factors is not difficult, so choose a reputable brand, a higher machine configuration as possible, a beautiful and luxurious design model will also be very simple. If financial capacity is "tight", choosing a laptop will be more difficult because of the balance of factors.

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
