

What happens if you lose your Google account?

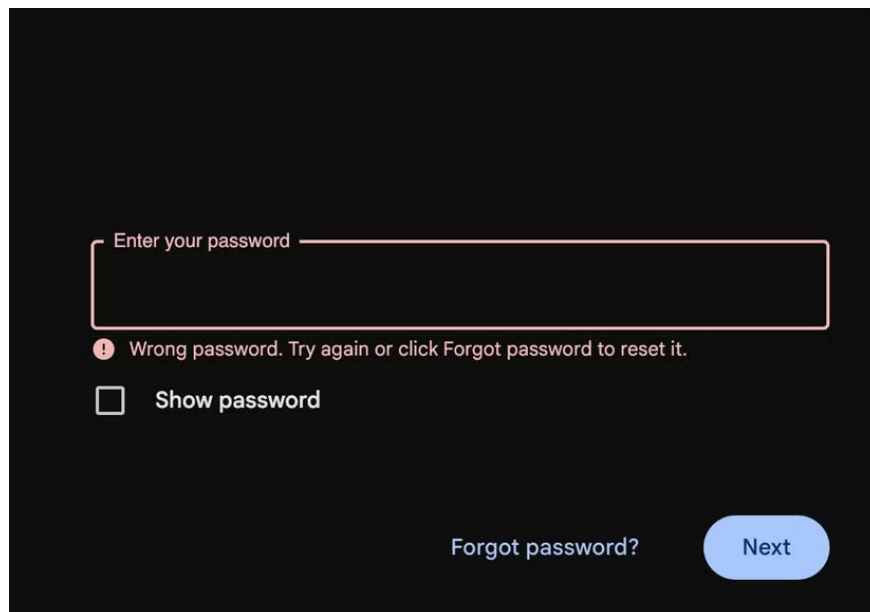
Losing access to your Google account can have serious consequences beyond not being able to send and receive email.

3. Third-party logins may be broken

Many people use their Google accounts to log in to third-party sites and apps because it's convenient. But those connected logins can stop working if you lose access to your Google account. In turn, this can lock you out of important apps you rely on.

How to secure your Google account

Losing access to your Google account can quickly become a major inconvenience. When that happens, it can be really difficult to regain access to your account. That's why it's important to take preventative steps to keep your account secure.

1. Use a digital password manager



Forgetting your password is one of the most common ways people lose access to their accounts. Password managers can prevent this by securely storing and managing your login information. There are many free and paid password managers available, so finding the right password manager for you and setting it up shouldn't be too difficult. Once set up, all you have to do is remember your master password and the password manager will take care of the rest, reducing the chances of you getting locked out of important accounts.

2. Add more recovery methods

Adding a recovery phone number or email address can help you reset your password if you accidentally forget it or get locked out of your Google account for another reason. While adding just one recovery method is usually good enough, it doesn't hurt to have multiple options set up. For example, if you change your phone number or lose access to your old email address, having a backup means you can regain access to your account.

3. Remember old password

You may be asked to enter your old password to verify your identity in order to regain access to your Google account. If you don't remember your old password and don't have any recovery methods set up, it can be difficult to prove that you're the rightful owner of the account. That's why it's smart to save your old password profile. If you reuse passwords, make sure to keep your old passwords in a safe place.

4. Back up your account regularly



Backing up important files is helpful in case the worst happens. It's important to back up your important files, including documents, email attachments, etc., along with any important files associated with your Google account.

If you've lost access to your Google account because you forgot your password or username or can't receive your verification code, there are still a few options for recovering your account.
