Stalk is a word that can be understood in many different ways depending on the context. So in what sense is Stalk and what is it commonly used?

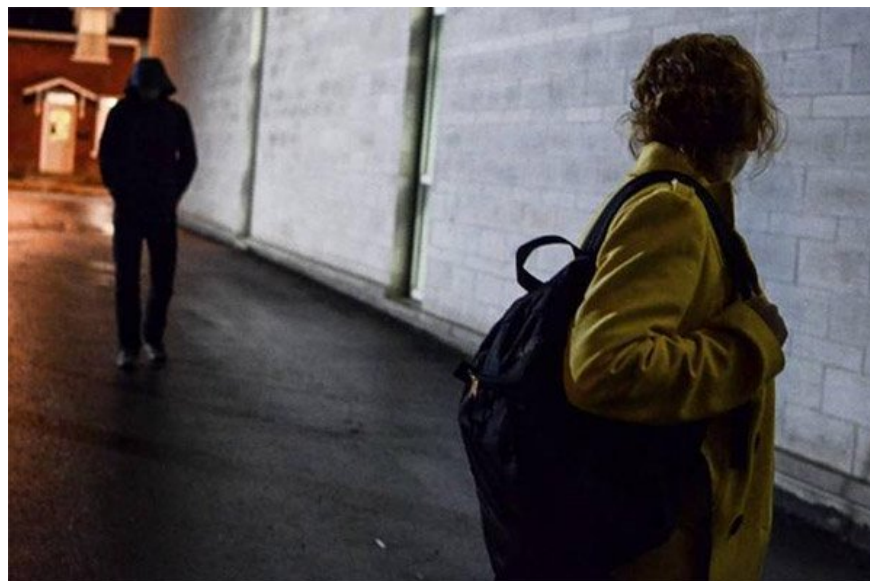

With a positive meaning, it will be for the police to follow the crime.
