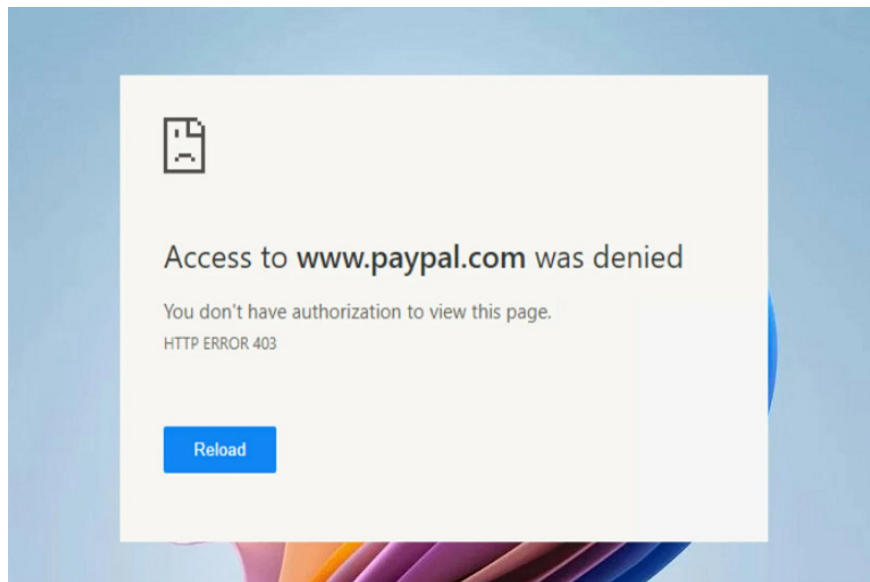

A 403 Forbidden error appears when a user tries to access a website, but the server denies the request for some specific reason. Here are some common causes of a 403 Forbidden error:

1. **Insufficient Access:** Most commonly, this error can be caused by the user not having sufficient access to the desired website. This can be due to server-side access restrictions or security configurations on the website.
2. **Security software:** Security software on a server or network can prohibit access to certain resources based on specific rules.



1. **Misconfiguration in file/folder access permissions:** If the access permissions of a file or folder are configured incorrectly, the server may deny access.
2. **Using an invalid URL:** If a user tries to access a non-existent or invalid URL, the server may reject the request and return a 403 error.
3. **Unstable internet connection:** Unstable internet connection can create an unpleasant network experience and cause difficulty in accessing websites, downloading data resulting in 403 Forbidden error.

Instructions on how to fix 403 Forbidden error fastest

Refresh page

Double check the website address

A common cause of Error 403 is mistyped web address. Make sure the address you enter points to a web page or file, not a directory. For example, a URL usually ends with ".com", ".php", ".org", ".html" or another extension. Conversely, a URL that points to a specific item usually ends with a "/".

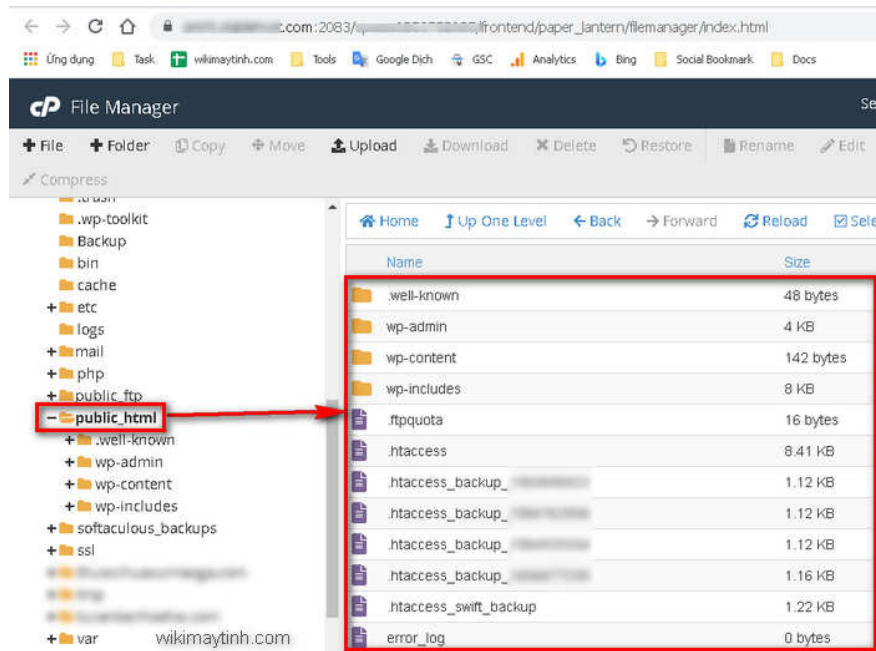


Disable WordPress plugins

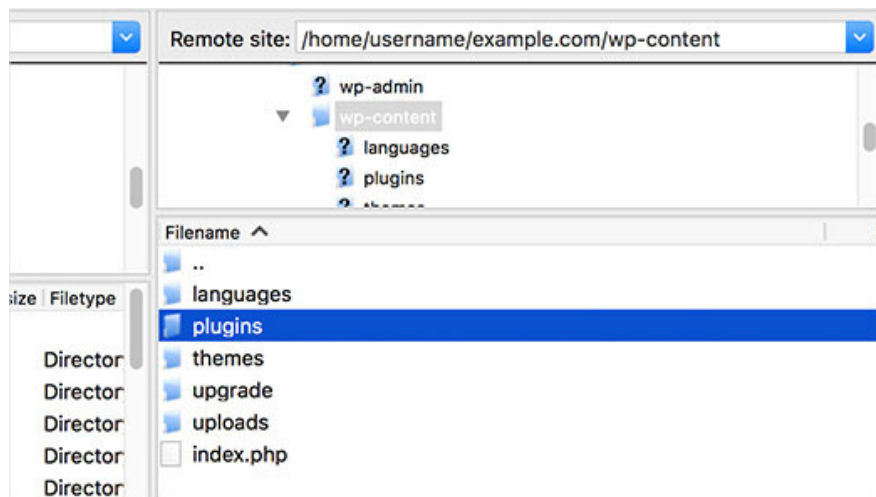
Disabling WordPress plugins is a useful way to determine if the 403 error issue is caused by one of them. Here is a detailed guide on how to safely disable and test plugins:

Step 1: Access your hosting account with FTP and find the public_html folder.

Step 2: In the public_html folder, find and select the wp-content folder.



Step 3: In the wp-content folder, you will see a 'plugins' folder. Rename this folder to something else, for example, 'disabled-plugins'. This will disable all plugins on your site.



Step 4: Check your site again. If you can access the site without getting a 403 error, this indicates that one or more plugins may be causing the problem.

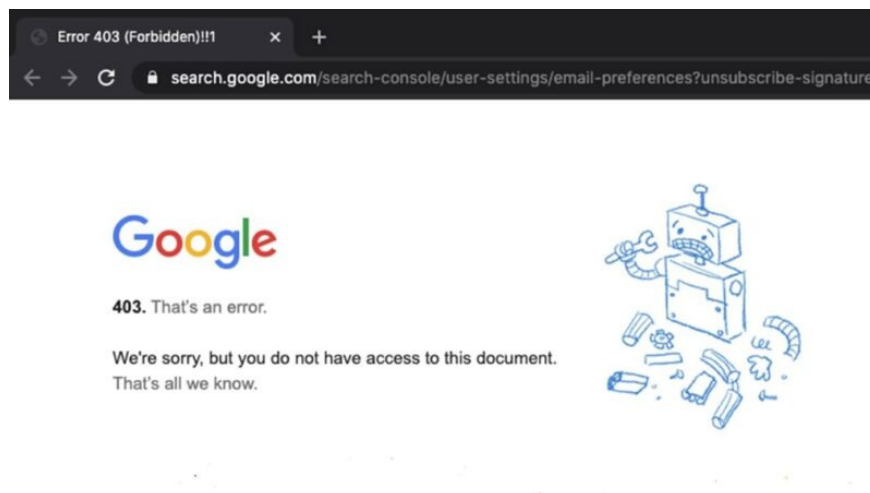
Step 5: To identify the specific plugin causing the error, reactivate each plugin one by one. Each time you reactivate a plugin, check your site to see if the 403 error appears. Repeat this process until you identify the plugin causing the problem.

Step 6: Once you have identified the plugin causing the error, you can choose to update or reinstall the plugin to ensure you are using the latest and most stable version of it.

Back to the website later
