The origin of wininit.exe:

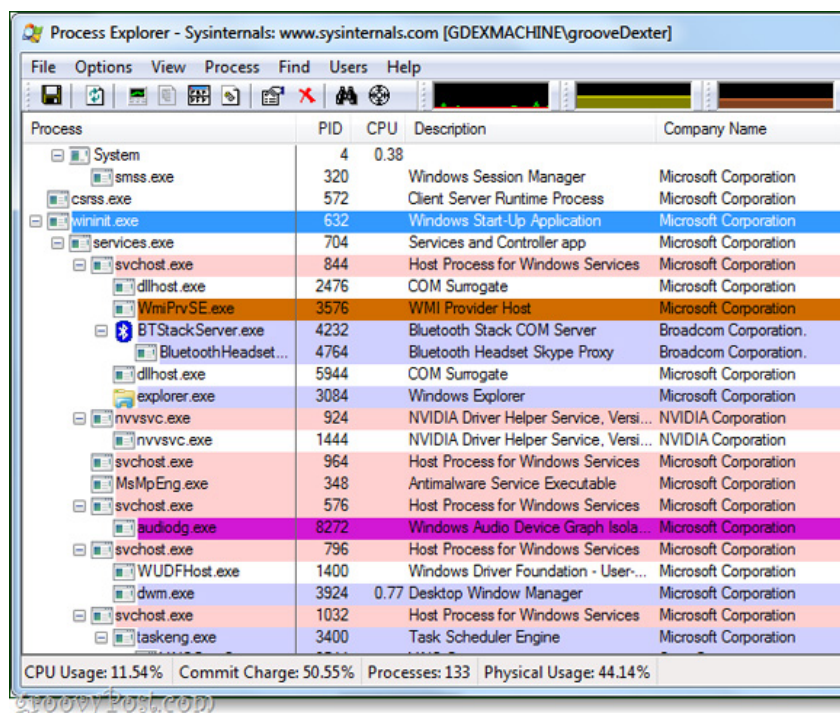
Winit.exe (Windows Initialize) was created by Microsoft, which is one of the 'core' processes for users to boot and log into user accounts, fixed in Windows XP, later versions. Next - Windows Vista and 7. At the same time, allowing the operation to remove the program and storing the command in the WinInit.ini file, you can also perform other actions when the system is booting. In Windows Vista and 7, this is the 'launcher' for other *background applications* to work.

Fixed position of this file at: *C: Windowssystem32wininit.exe*

If it detects that the file appears in any other location, it is definitely a virus that is disguising itself as a file system and renaming it to *wininit.exe*.

Should I turn off wininit.exe?

The answer here is definitely no, because without this process, Windows will not complete the boot process, which means you cannot log in to your user account. If you turn off this process, you will see a *critical system error message*, and you cannot do anything other than restart the computer. The screenshot below shows *wininit.exe* always appear on most Windows services, including svchost.exe:



wininit.exe is dangerous or not:

For computers using new operating systems, there is no problem, but there are systems that use for a long time, there are always dangers from many viruses that seek to infiltrate inside, fake into system files, and wininit.exe is a typical case. In case of a risk, you should equip yourself with security measures, and Microsoft Security Essentials is one of the options that can meet all your needs.
