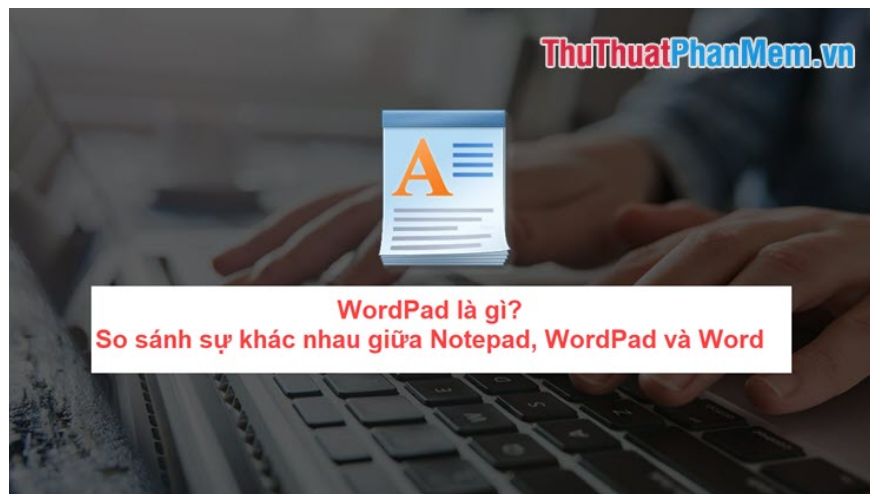


What is WordPad? Compare the differences between Notepad, WordPad and Word

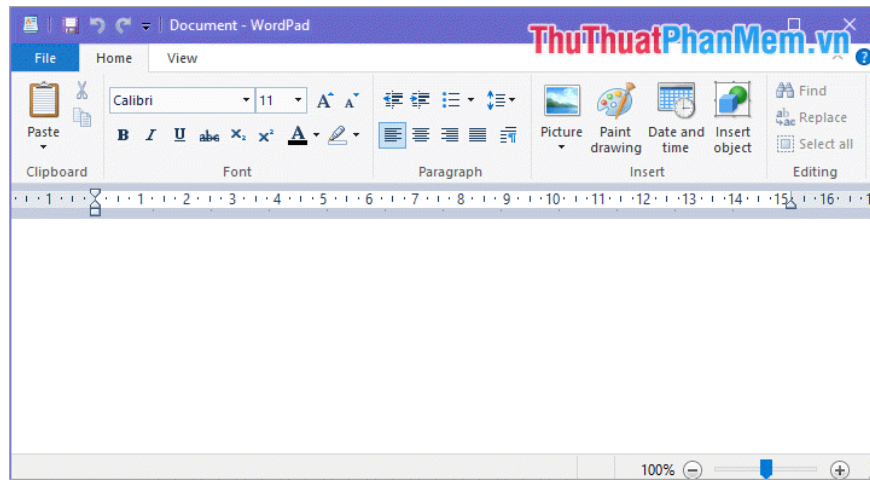

1. What is WordPad?

WordPad is a desktop writing software that has been introduced into Windows since very long versions of Windows 95. But people often hear about NotePad more often than they hear WordPad. WordPad is more integrated with features and aims to be a word processing software rather than a word processor. WordPad has an interface quite similar to Microsoft Word with the toolbars located on the top giving users the option.

WordPad possesses relatively simple features but is quite complete for users such as: Typography, font size, stabbing, italic, underline, inserting images (What NotePad can not do) and very Many other tools related to alignment, different text formats.



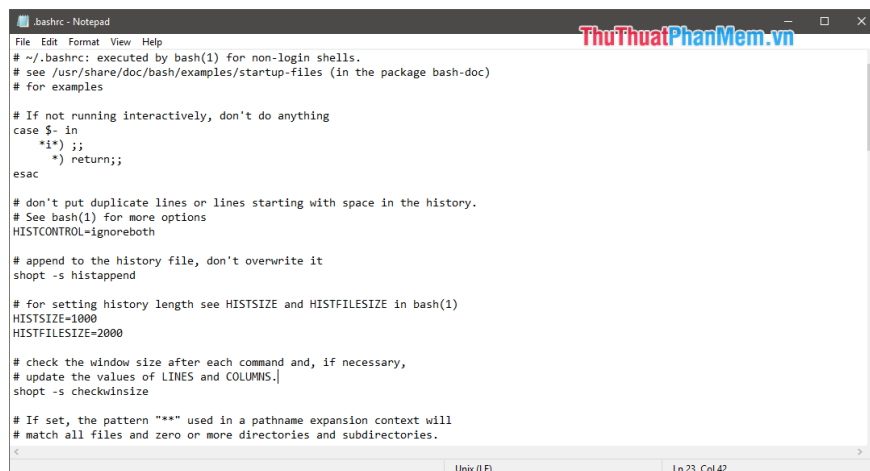
But WordPad is a relatively primitive version if we compare it with Microsoft Word. WordPad does not have handy features such as automatic word correction, spell checking, comments, page borders, table markings . Because of that, it is not popular.

A highlight on WordPad is that it is completely free on Windows for everyone to use without providing any extra cost. If you are a person on a tight budget, WordPad will probably be suitable for you although the toolkit is not very diverse.

WordPad has a nice feature that provides all kinds of formats when saving files. When WordPad saves the file, the default is RTF (Rich Text Format). This is a standard for saving common documents that contain formats such as: highlight, bold, italic, bullet, font, etc. (something Notepad can't have). If you want to share WordPad files, you can save them as Docx of Microsoft Word as well.

2. What is Notepad?

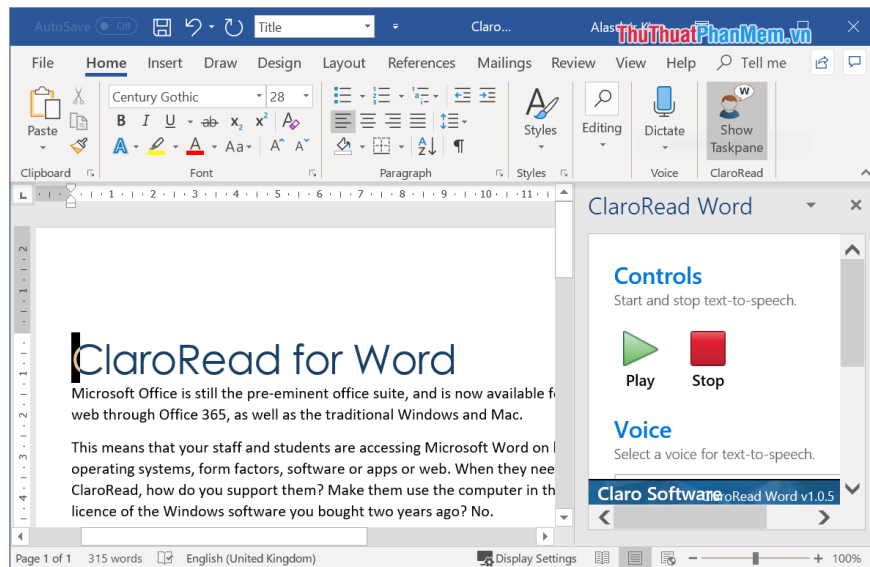
NotePad was born before Windows. When Windows was born, Microsoft also integrated NotePad into users. NotePad has the task that is a writing tool (Unlike Word and WordPad is a text-editing tool). So NotePad is much more primitive and mainly focused on drafting. NotePad does not have many options for users such as: Bold, italicized, insert picture, highlight line, align, . Say so surely you know NotePad is no different from notes, only typed only.



NotePad is not capable of saving in many different formats, it can only be saved as a plain text file (plain text). For files on Windows systems, the computer is mainly .txt (text format of NotePad) that users can edit and save. Windows uses mostly .Txt files because they are very small in size and can be edited quickly. If you are a Windows system tinkering, you must be very familiar with the Open With Notepad command to edit.

3. What is Word?

Word is the darling of Microsoft born in the Microsoft Office suite. Word is an important tool indispensable for those who edit - edit text. Being born after, being invested more and especially commercial business, Word is much more complete and highly effective. Typically, it is a series of modern features such as alignment, commenting, error correction, spelling, etc., which makes Word a "god" tool for office workers.



Word uses the .Docx format (from 2007 versions onwards). With Word, you can open the extension .txt, .html comfortably without encountering any errors at all.
