

What will Microsoft 'kill' in Windows 10 Fall Creators Update update?

The next version of Windows in the Fall Creators Update update will bring a lot of changes, eliminating many things that are already very familiar.

In this update, Microsoft intends to erase many of the less-used or obsolete features. This makes it easy to maintain Windows, minimize the risks associated with security and also enable the development of new features.

However, when it is not supported, older software may have errors or cannot be used, many users will be sad when they are used to these features for many years.

Microsoft has listed a list of applications and features that they will not focus on (will not continue to evolve and may be removed during the next release) or actually remove it during the Fall Creators Update update. .

Some of you may not have heard of it before (eg TCP Offload) . The most outstanding thing to mention is the Paint application, the ability to support Screen Saver. It has been removed from themes and may be removed completely from Control Panel and Group Policy. This is probably because the company plans to use the lock screen instead of displaying the screen savers of the computer screen.



Many functions will be removed or not supported since Fall Creators Update

Some will soon be removed before there is an alternative feature, such as Reading List or Sync, though not many people use these features. Below is a list that helps users plan to adapt to changes if needed, this list may change.

Applications / features removed:

1. 3D Builder: no longer installed by default. Consider using Print 3D and Paint 3D instead. However, it can still be downloaded from the Windows Store.
2. Apndatabase.xml: see detailed information about alternative databases in this article. <https://msdn.microsoft.com/windows/hardware/drivers/mobilebroadband/planning-your-apn-database-submission>
3. Enhanced Mitigation Experience Toolkit (EMET): Will be blocked. Consider using Exploit Protection of Windows Defender Exploit Guard instead.
4. Microsoft Paint. Will be posted on the Windows Store for people to download for free in the future.
5. Outlook Express: remove this old source code.
6. Reader: the feature will be integrated into Microsoft Edge.
7. Reading List: the feature will be integrated into Microsoft Edge.
8. Syskey.exe: remove this no longer useful security feature. Encourage using BitLocker. For more information, read the Knowledge Base below. 4025993 Syskey.exe will not be supported on Windows 10 RS3 and Windows Server 2016 RS3. <https://support.microsoft.com/en-us/help/4025993/syskey-exe-utility-is-no-longer-supported-in-windows-10-rs3-and-window>
9. TCP Offload Engine: previously switched to Stack TCP. For more information, read the article below. <https://blogs.technet.microsoft.com/askpfeplat/2017/06/13/why-are-we-deprecating-network-performance-features-kb4014193/>
10. Tile Data Layer: Replace with Tile Store.
11. Trusted Platform Module (TPM) Owner PasswordManagement.

The features are no longer focused:

1. Ii6 Management Compatibility: encourages users to choose a replacement scripting tool and a new management console.
2. IIS Digest Authenticaiton: encourage the use of alternative authentication methods.
3. RSA / AES Encryption for IIS: encourage the use of CNG encryption provider.
4. Set up synchronization: the current synchronization process will be temporarily suspended. In the future, cloud storage systems to synchronize settings will be used for both Enterprise State Roaming users and other users. (Currently, these users are using different cloud storage systems.)
5. Trusted Platform Module (TPM): TPM.msc and TPM Remote Management: replace with the new user interface.
6. System Image Backup (SIB): Encourage using a solution to backup all drives from other units.
7. TLS RC4 Ciphers: default is off. For more information, read this article. <https://docs.microsoft.com/en-us/windows-server/security/tls/tls-schannel-ssp-changes-in-windows-10-and-windows-server-2016>
8. Trusted Platform Module (TPM) Remote Management: removed.
9. Windows Hello for Business uses System Center Configuration Manager
10. Windows Server 2016 Registration Authority (ADFS RA) is simpler and brings a better user experience.
11. Windows PowerShell 2.0: applications and components will be included in PowerShell 5.0+.
