Nile crocodile, scientific name *Crocodylus niloticus* is a species of crocodile in the Crocodylidae family. This species was first described by Laurenti in 1768.

According to a statistic, hippos kill about 500 people a year and some people think that the actual number must be nearly 3,000 people.
