7. You can use WordPress self-hosting to create online stores and sell digital or physical products, accept credit card payments and send / deliver directly from your website.

Disadvantages of WordPress.org

There are very few drawbacks when using self-hosted WordPress.org pages.

1. Like all websites, you will need web hosting. This is where files about your site are stored on the Internet. Initially, the cost is about 3 \$ -10 \$ / month. However when your site grows and receives more traffic, web hosting costs will increase gradually, but then you will earn enough money to cover this cost.
2. You are responsible for updating your website. You can easily update your WordPress website by simply clicking the update button (1 click), so it's not too complicated.
3. You must be responsible for backing up. Thankfully, there are many WordPress backup plugins that allow you to set up automatic backups.
4. The actual cost of the WordPress.org website changes based on what you are trying to build (simple blog, portfolio site, e-commerce store, member website, etc.). There are also other factors like free templates compared to high-end templates, free plugins compared to premium plugins, etc.

With a low budget, you can build your website for just \$ 46 per year. For 99% of users, the best suggestion is always to use WordPress.org.

WordPress.com

WordPress.com is a hosting service created by co-founder of WordPress, Matt Mullenweg. Because of the same founder, users often confuse WordPress.com with popular WordPress.org.

WordPress.com hosting service has 5 packages:

1. Free - Very limited
2. Personal - \$ 36 / year
3. Premium - \$ 99 / year
4. Business - \$ 299 / year
5. VIP - Starting at \$ 5,000 / month

Now, consider the pros and cons of WordPress.com.

Benefits of WordPress.com

Free WordPress.com platform is a good choice for bloggers and those who want to start a blog for their families. Here are some benefits of using WordPress.com:

1. This platform has a maximum capacity of 3GB. After that, you will have to switch to a paid plan to get more storage. The \$ 36-per-year Personal package gives you 6GB, and the \$ 99 Premium package per year gives you 13GB of storage or a \$ 299 Business package with unlimited storage.
2. You won't have to worry about updates or backups. WordPress.com will ensure that for you.

Disadvantages of WordPress.com

There are some limitations of WordPress.com for free compared to WordPress.org. Here are some disadvantages of using WordPress.com:

1. It places ads on all websites for free. So your users will see ads, but of course you will not be able to make money from that ad. If you do not want users to see Wordpress.com ads, then you can upgrade to a paid plan (starting at \$ 36 per year).
2. You are NOT allowed to sell ads on your site. If you run a high traffic page, you can sign up for an advertising program called WordAds, where you share revenue with Wordpress.com. Users of Premium and Business packages can use WordAds immediately.
3. You cannot upload the plugin. Users of the free package come with pre-activated JetPack features. Business package users can install from a collection of compatible plugins (\$ 299 / year). WordPress.com's VIP program allows you to install plugins, and it costs \$ 5000 per month.
4. You cannot upload custom themes. Users of free packages can only install from limited free theme collections. Users of Premium and Business packages can also choose premium themes. There are limited customization options for the free version. Premium and Business users can use custom CSS.
5. You are limited to Wordpress.com statistics. You cannot add Google Analytics or install any other powerful tracking platform. Business package users can install Google Analytics.
6. Wordpress.com may delete your site at any time, if it believes that the site violates Wordpress.com's terms of service.
7. Your website will display a link provided by WordPress.com. It can be removed by upgrading to the Business package.
8. WordPress.com does not provide any integrated e-commerce or payment gateway features.
9. You cannot build membership sites with WordPress.com.

As you can see, the WordPress.com hosting platform is quite limited when you use a free, personal or even premium package. To add some more advanced features, you must upgrade to Business package (\$ 299 / year) or VIP package (\$ 5000 / month).
