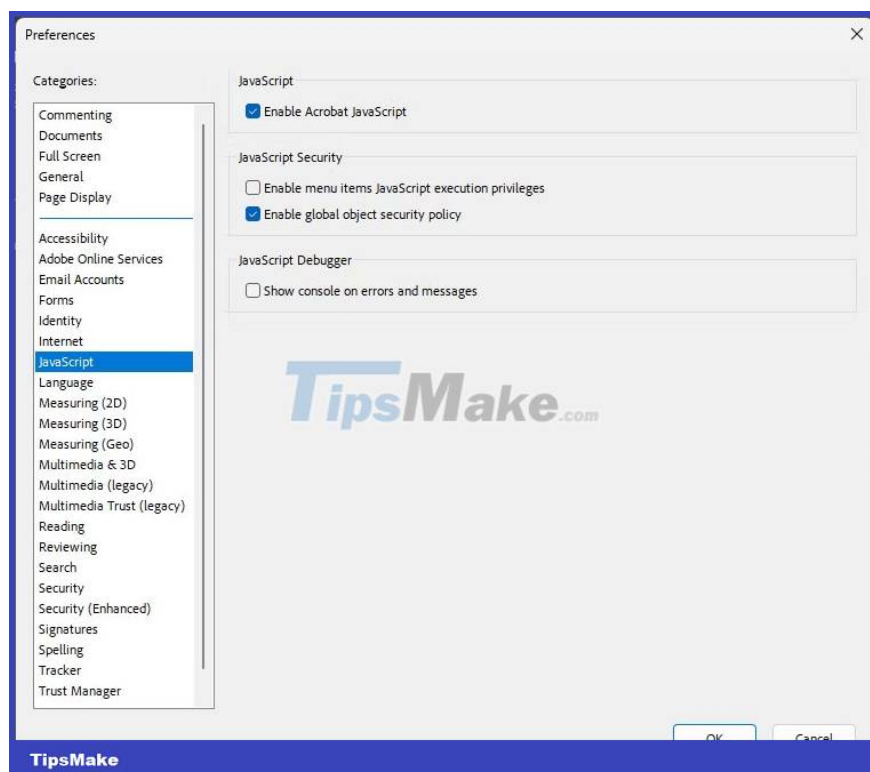

## Is Adobe Acrobat Reader safe?

Adobe Acrobat Reader also has a history of vulnerabilities. Security incidents in 2006, 2009, 2013, 2016, 2017 and 2018 required serious and immediate patching to eliminate critical vulnerabilities. Most of the vulnerabilities stem from a JavaScript vulnerability in Adobe Acrobat Reader, which allows attackers to exploit the program to gain access to the server and, in some cases, execute code remotely.

So is Adobe Acrobat Reader safe? If you keep Adobe Acrobat Reader up to date, you should be safe. Adobe pushes updates to its apps on the first Tuesday of each month. One thing you can do to increase security is to adjust the JavaScript settings of Adobe Acrobat Reader.



1. Go to **Menu > Preferences** . Alternatively, press **CTRL + K** on the Adobe Acrobat Reader home page.
2. Select **JavaScript** from **Categories**.
3. **In the JavaScript Security** window , edit the options for managing JavaScript.

If you want to disable JavaScript completely, uncheck **Enable Acrobat JavaScript** .

2. : Foxit Reader is one of the best Adobe Acrobat Reader alternatives, offering lots of features without the constraints. Some advanced features have migrated to its licensed tool over the years, but the intuitive toolbar interface remains, along with many other useful features.
3. : STDU Viewer can be used with many document formats, including , PDF, DjVu, XPS, JBIG2 and WWF. It also features tabbed browsing, bookmarks, highlights and split windows. One of the standout features of STDU Viewer is the option to invert the colors, which helps to reduce eye strain. While it has fewer features than some of its competitors, STDU Viewer is lightweight, making it a great tool for reading PDFs.
