

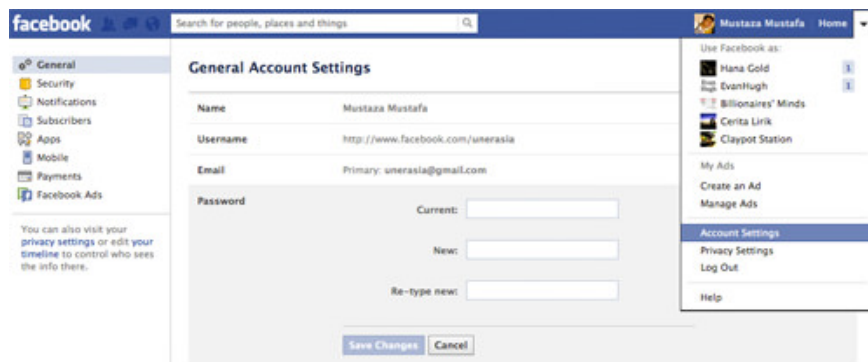
Why is Facebook account hacked? This is how to prevent that!

Do you know how to protect your Facebook account safely? Check out the following 8 useful tips of Network Administrator to protect your Facebook account as much as possible.

1. Create strong passwords



Password is the key for others to access and hack your Facebook account. Therefore you should create strong passwords that others cannot expect. Ideally, you should combine some special characters such as: @, !, ., letters, symbols .

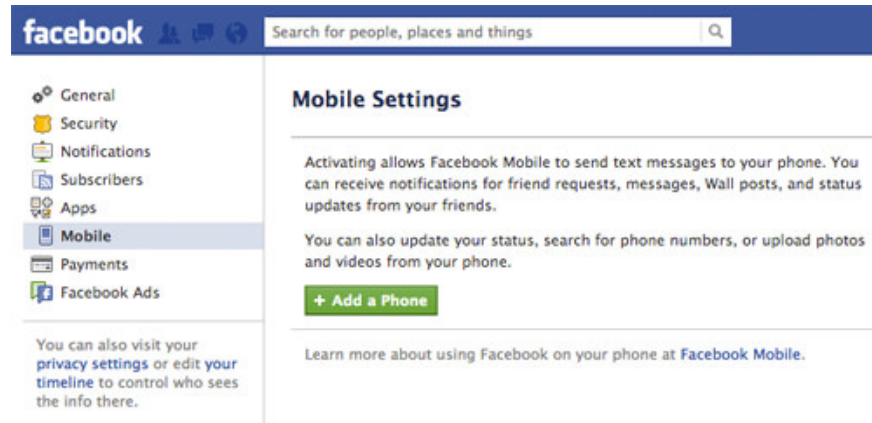
A small note for you is not to set a password that matches the name, age, year of birth, . or anything related to you.

To change the password, go to Account settings (Account Settings)> **General** (General)> **Password** (Password).

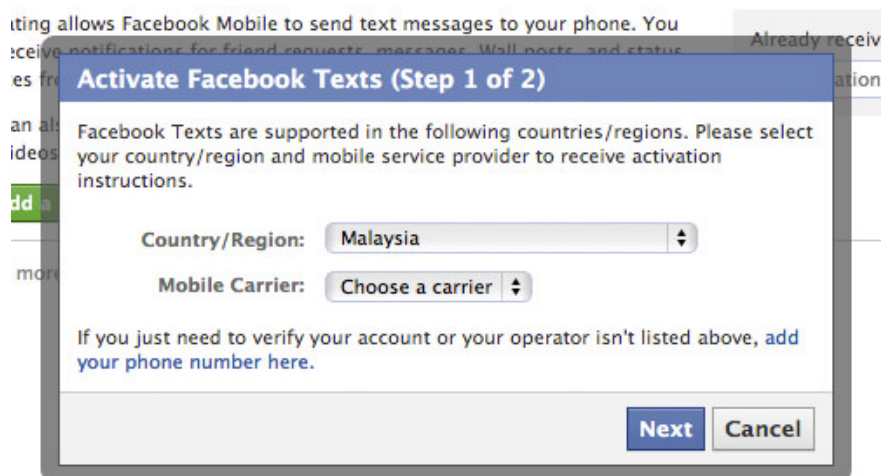
2. Confirm your phone number

Verifying phone numbers is one of the ways to protect your Facebook account safely and effectively. Even if you lose your account login password, Facebook will send you a new password via the phone number you confirmed.

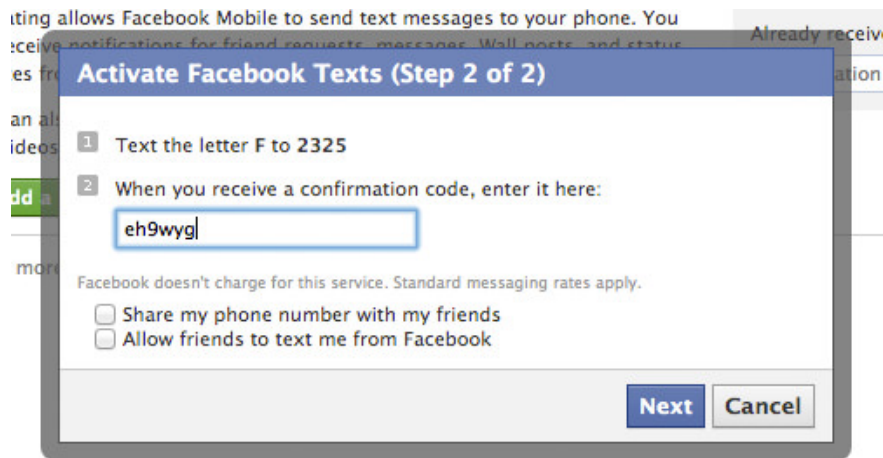
To add your phone number on Facebook, go to **Account Settings** (account settings)> **Mobile** then click **Add a Phone** (add phone number).



Select the country where you live and add your phone number, then click **Next** .



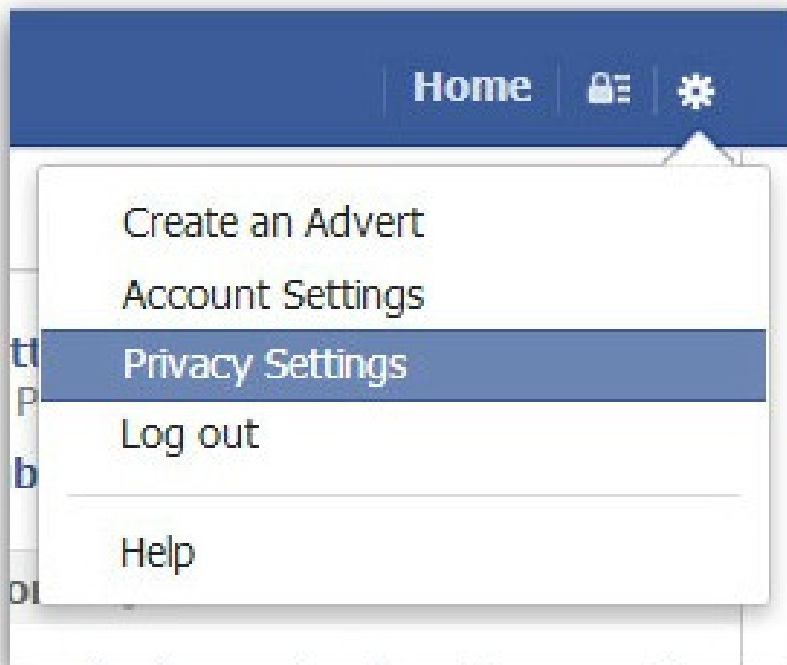
Follow the instructions for Facebook to send you the code via SMS. Then enter this code in the box, then click **Next** to complete the validation process.



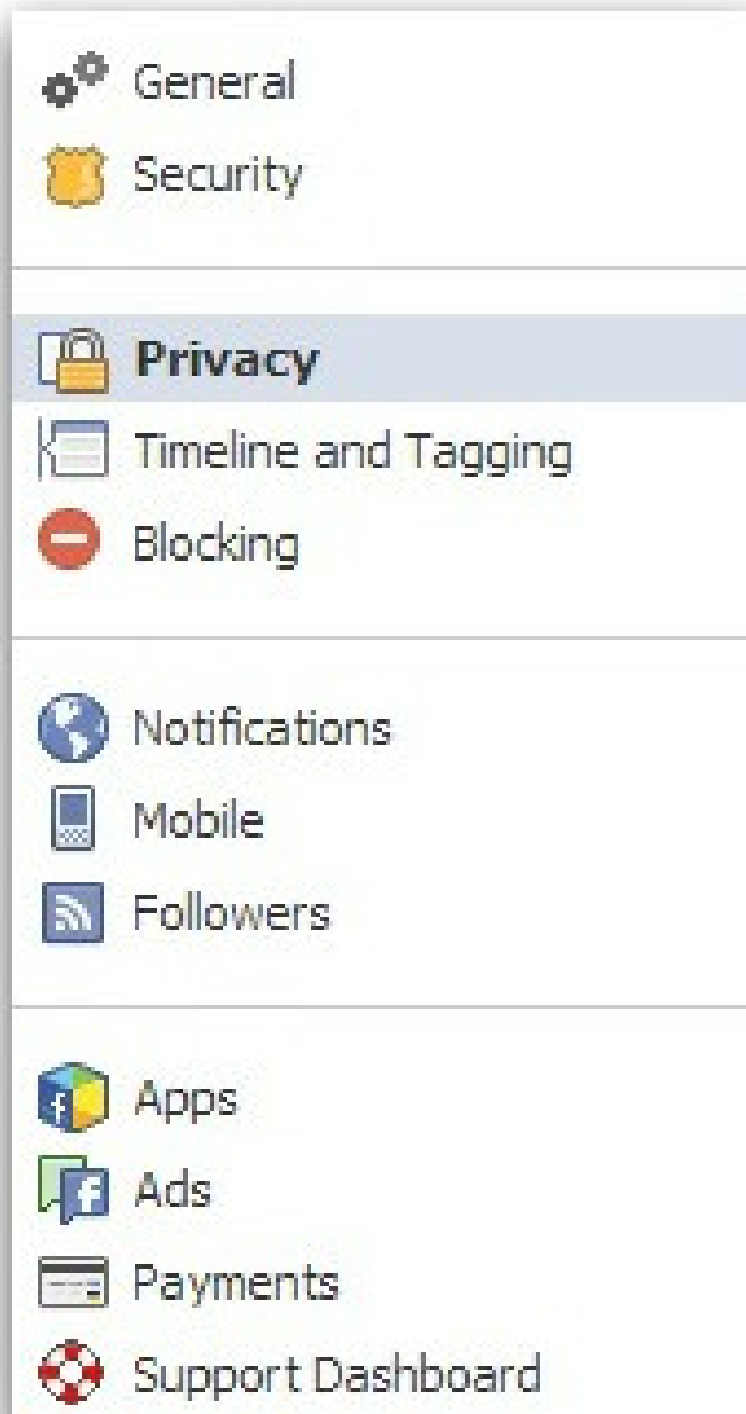
3. Set up mode only your friends can view your profile

Setting the mode only your friends can view your profile so that strangers cannot see any personal information or any content you have posted on your home wall.

To set this mode, first click the jagged icon in the right corner of the screen, then click **Privacy Settings** .



Select **Privacy** .



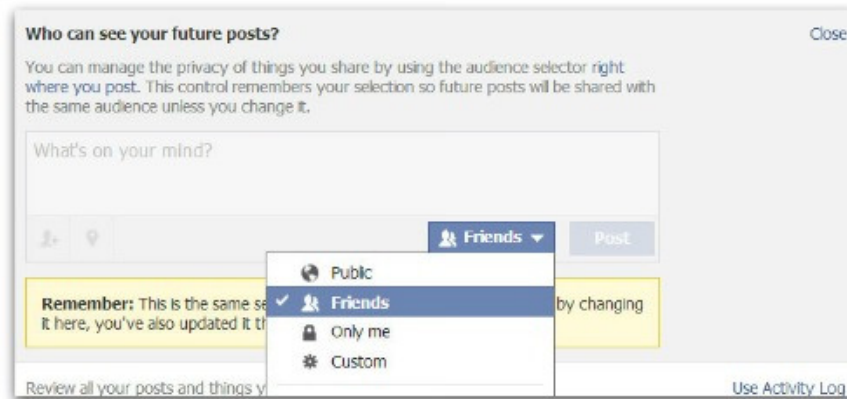
In the section **Who can see your future posts?** , there are options like:

1. Public (public, anyone who visits your account can view the profile as well as the content you post on your profile).
1. Friends (your friends).

1. Only you (only you).

1. Customs - this option allows you to limit some of your friends who can view the content you post.

You choose **Friends**.

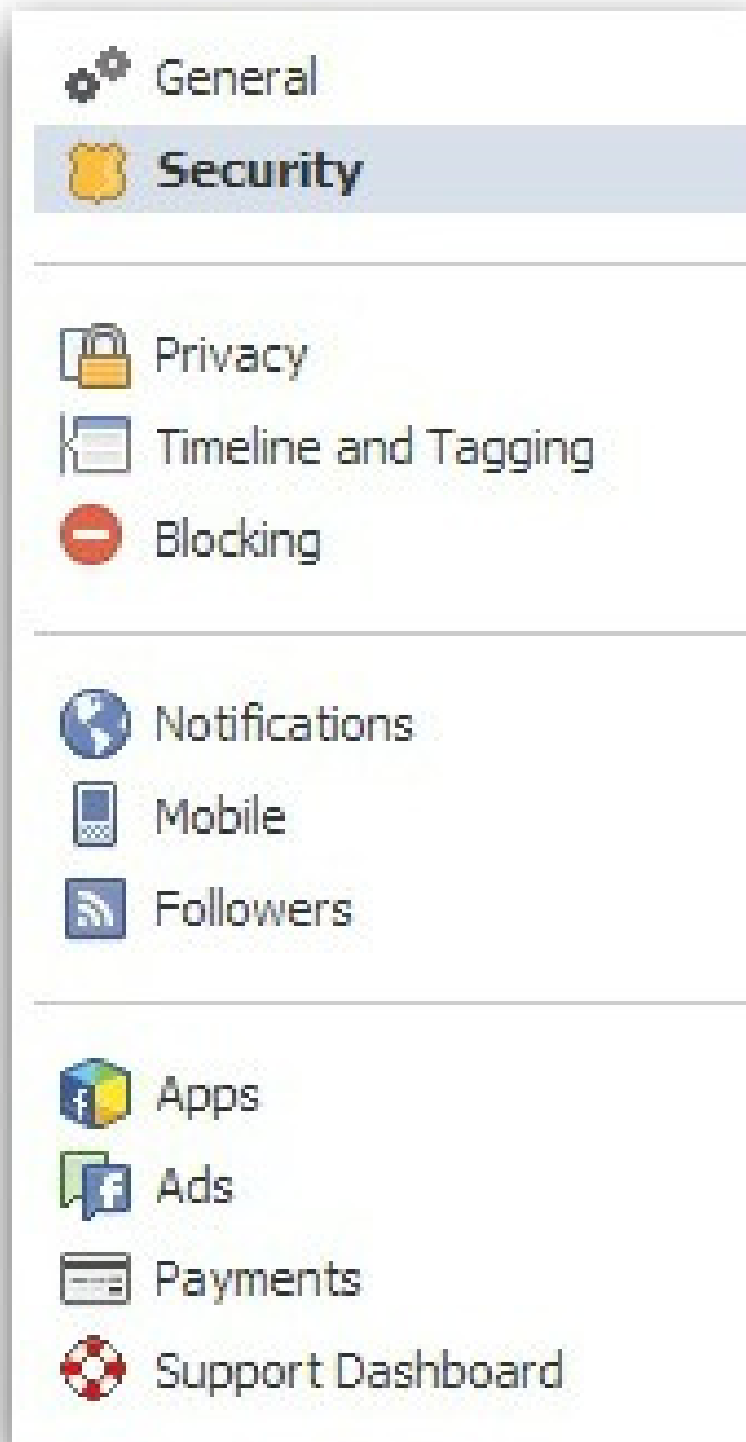


4. Set up notifications when a device is logged in

If you enable this function, when other people log into your Facebook account on another device such as phone, computer . Facebook will immediately send you a message to your phone or email.

To activate this function, you need to follow the steps below:

First click on Settings.



Then click on Security, continue to select Login Notifications (Login Notifications).

Security Settings

Secure browsing Secure browsing is currently **enabled**.

Login notifications We can notify you when your account is accessed from a computer or mobile device that you haven't used before. Choose a notification method below:

Email

Text message/Push notification

Save Changes **Cancel**

Here you can select Email or Text message / Notification prompt or both then click **Save changes** (Save changes) is done.

5. Activate Login Approvals

Login Approvals Require a security code to access my account from unknown browsers [?]

Save Changes **Cancel**

Facebook's **Login Approvals** feature is optional but Facebook users should use it.

If you enable this feature, you will have to enter a code that Facebook sends you via SMS whenever you log in to your account on the new device.

If Facebook knows that you have logged in from a device you have not previously saved, it will send a notification for the next login.

To enable this option, go to Account settings (Account Settings), then click Security.

In the right pane, select **Login Approvals** and check the **Require a security code to access my account from unknown browsers**.

6. Do not "Maintain login"

All browsers support the "Stay logged in" feature, save your password when you sign in to Facebook or any other account (Instagram, Twitter .).

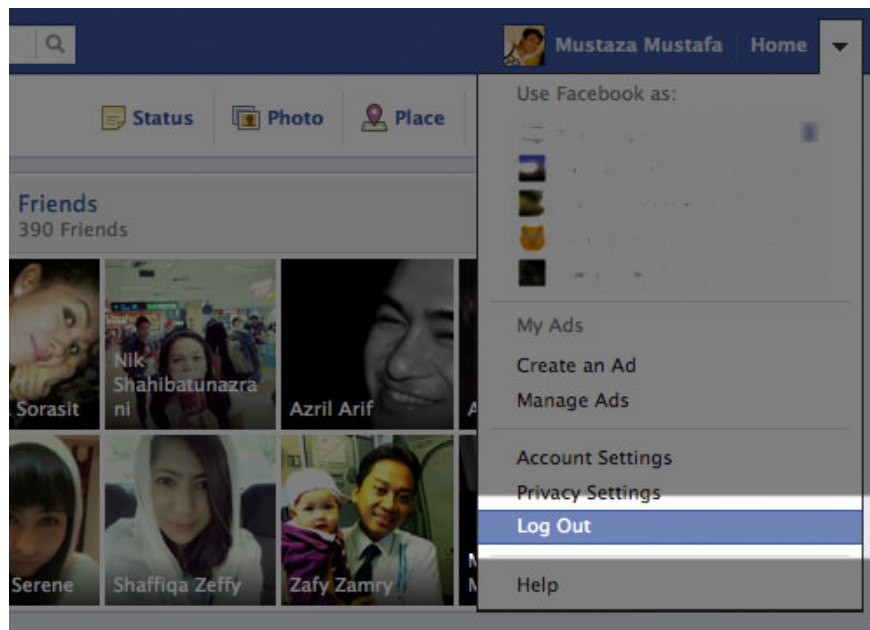
However, it is recommended that you do not use this feature to save your Facebook password for the next login. But suppose in case someone borrowed your computer, just a few taps, they know your Facebook password in the palm of your hand, maybe even change your password.

You just need to uncheck the Maintain login box.

7. Activate Private Browsing (Incognito Web browsing)

Another way to prevent others from accessing your Facebook account is to enable Private Browsing mode on your browser. All browsers have an anonymous browsing option. All your activities are not saved to the browsing history.

8. Log out of your account after use



After using, you should log out of your Facebook account. Suppose in case someone borrowed your phone or computer to log in to Facebook, it would not be possible to know your password to access.
