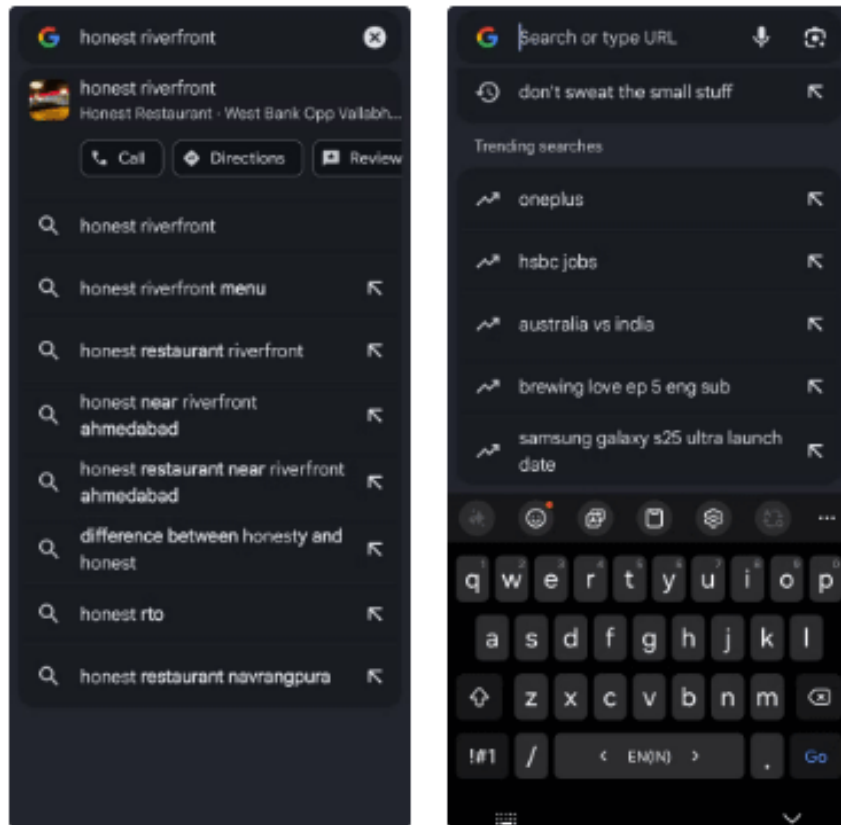
## 1. Cross-platform sync

## 2. Enhanced search and better integration with Google apps

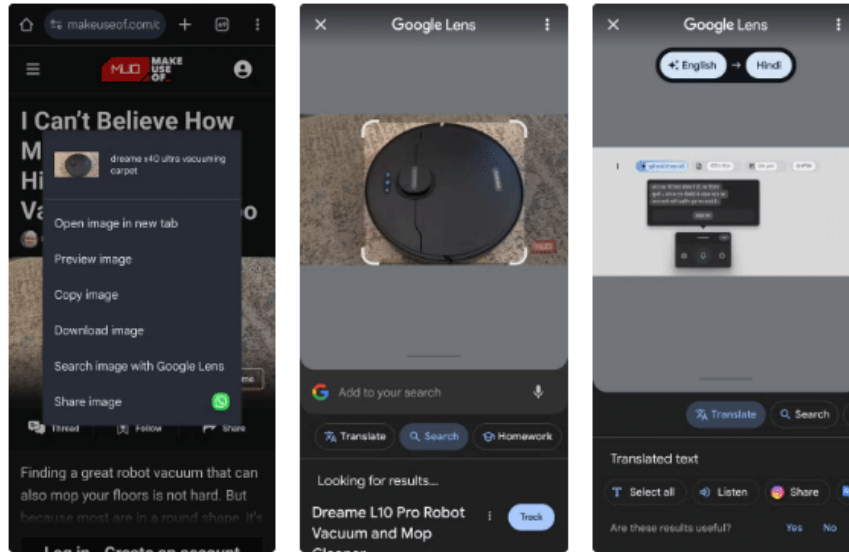

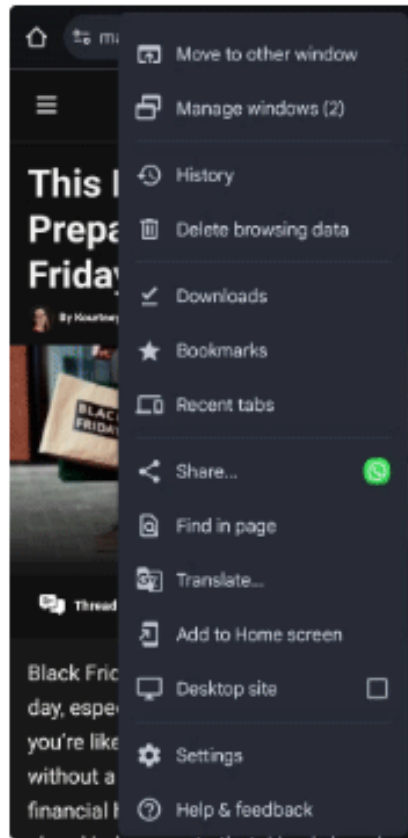
## 4. Superior browsing speed and performance

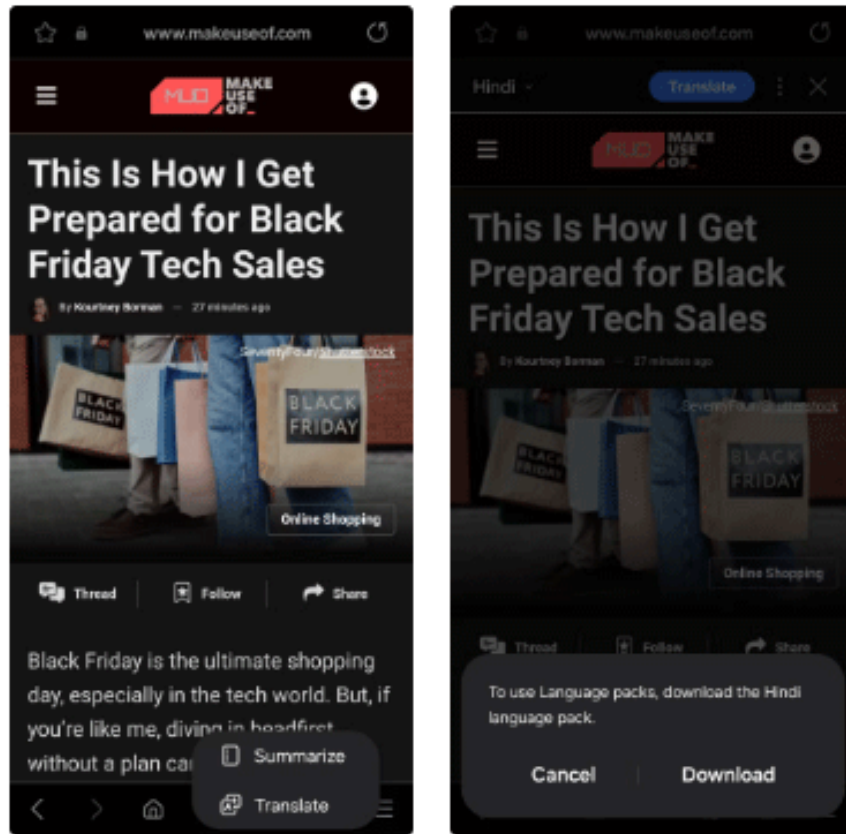
