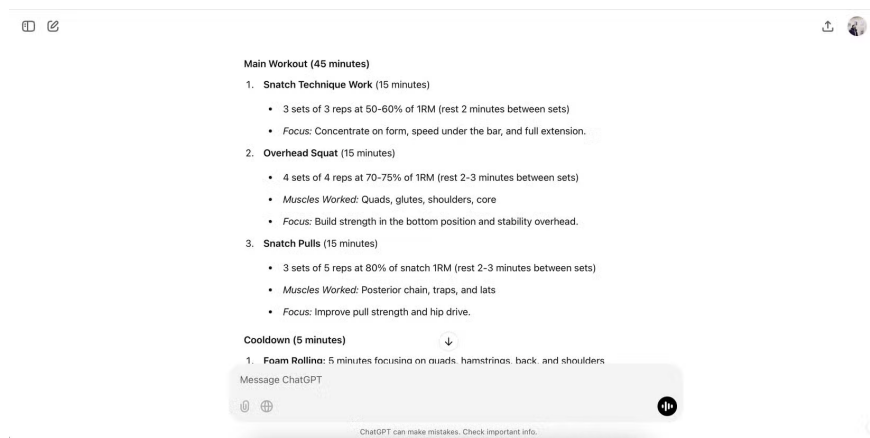

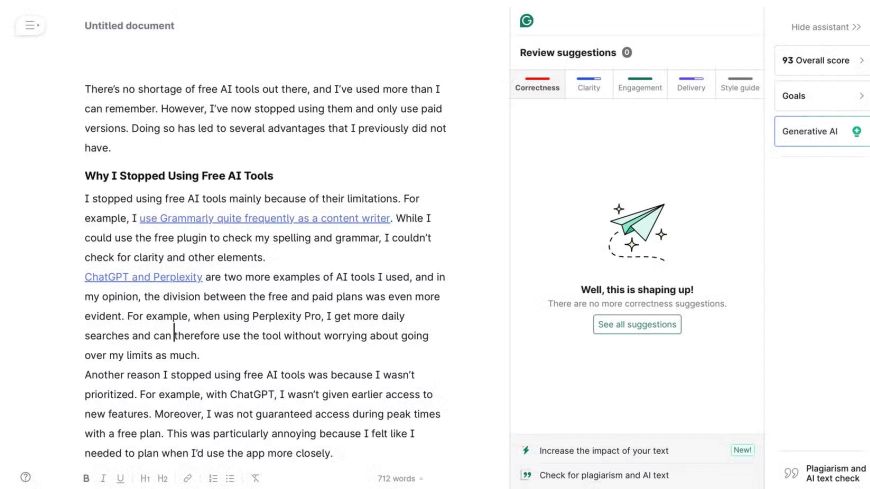

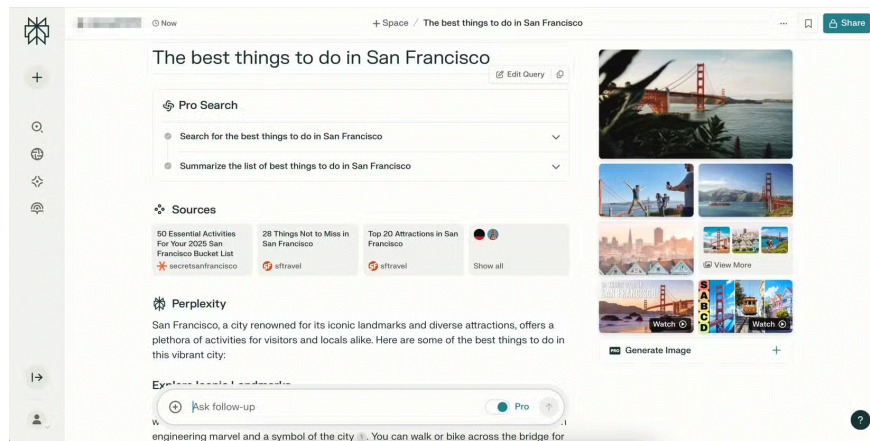
One of my favorite tools is the Clarity section, which helps me find out when I make too many mistakes. Another great thing is that Grammarly Pro helps me reshape my text when needed.

3. Perplexity Pro

The free version of Perplexity is highly rated, but you should upgrade to the \$20/month premium version for a larger limit. Once upgraded, you can search 300 times per day; while it would be best if there were no limit, it's still good enough for most cases.

Another feature of Perplexity Pro that's worth paying for is parsing different file types, like images and CSV files. Having access to better support is a plus. You may not need to use this feature, but it's nice to know it's there if you do.
