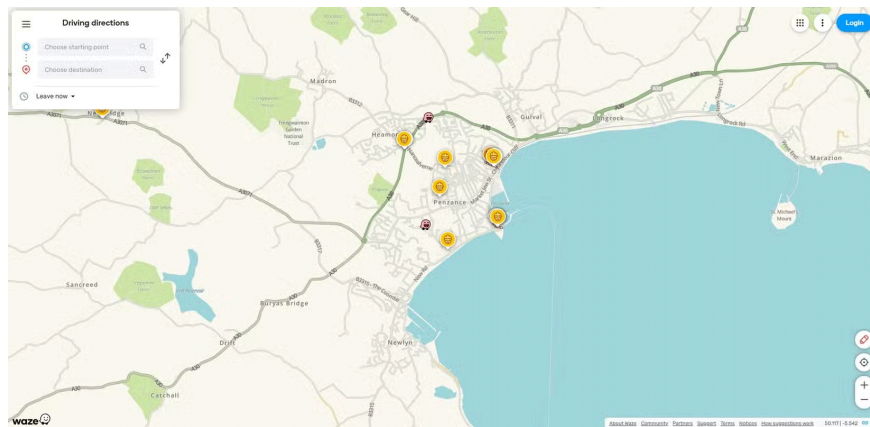


Why use Waze instead of Google Maps?

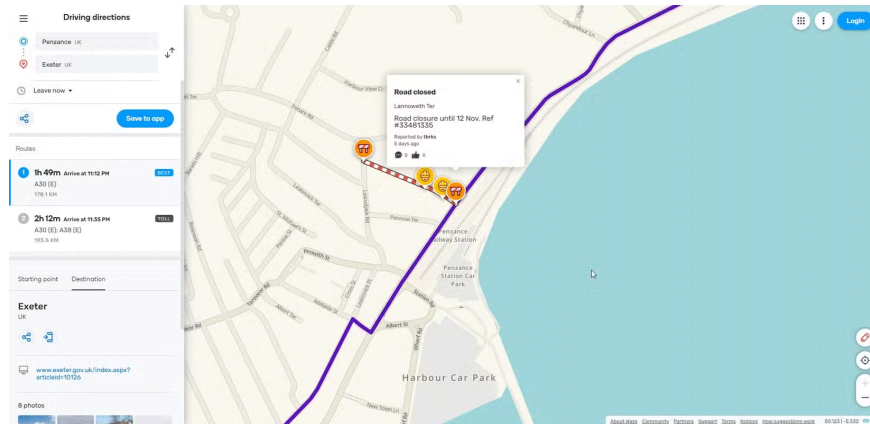
Key Features of Waze That Make a Difference
