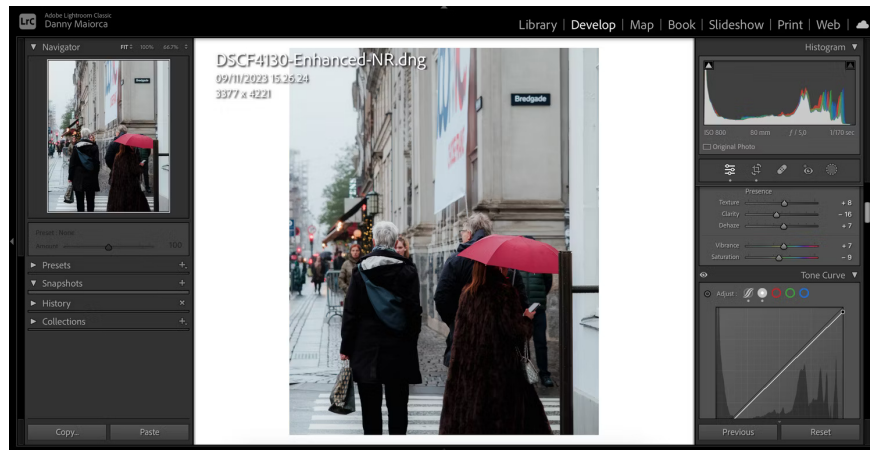


# Will manual photo editing become obsolete as AI advances?

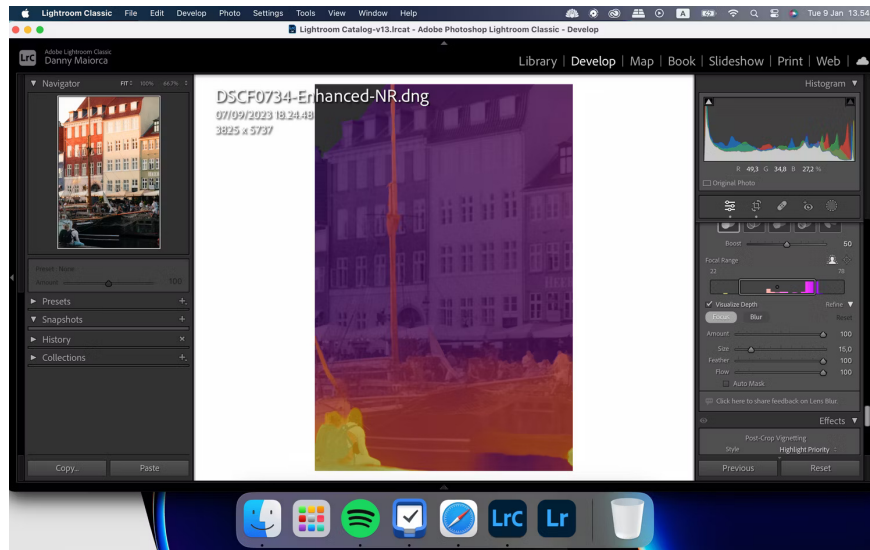
## 1. Photo editors will want to create their own style

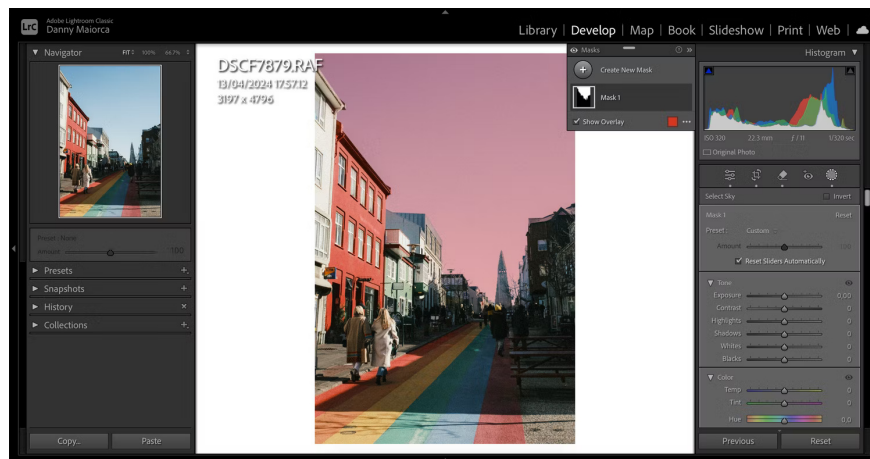
## 2. Not all AI edits are created equal

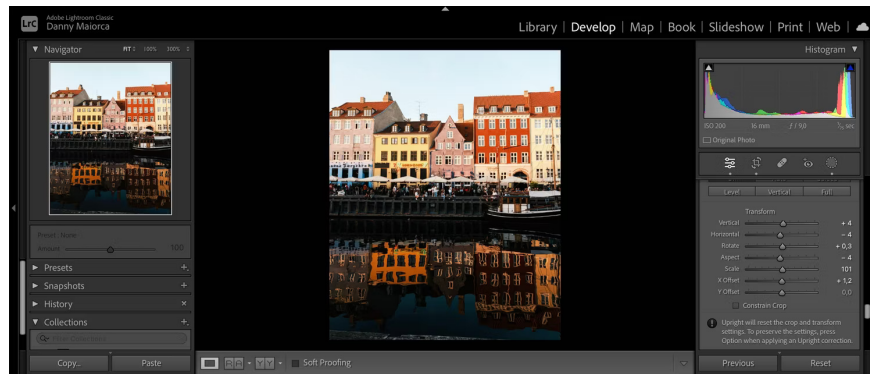
### 3. AI is easy to recognize if overused

There's no fixed rule about how much you should use, and even as AI evolves, this will always hold true. By adopting this mindset, you can benefit from AI as an artist.
