

Will the 'rabbit ears' smartphone disappear?

As expected, the 'rabbit ears' smartphone will appear less frequently in 2019 and instead new products will have a thinner border design than current phones.

After Apple launched the iPhone X with a 'rabbit ears' design, this design was immediately outdated, though, becoming a trend, many other phone manufacturers such as LG, Asus, Nokia, Xiaomi and Huawei. . all have the same products as Apple.

However, this "rabbit ears" trend may not be available in the near future. As expected, the 'rabbit ears' smartphone will appear less frequently in 2019 and instead new products will have a thinner border design than current phones.



In fact, despite running the "rabbit ears" trend, some smartphone manufacturers are trying to escape the Apple ball, creating products that don't have this detail and are more groundbreaking. It can be mentioned as Oppo with Find X with screen overflow border, camera cluster hidden inside the camera body. Or Vivo with a safer solution, only hides the front camera in the camera body and the rear camera is still on the back. Meanwhile, some other firms have not completely removed 'rabbit ears' but have tried to minimize this detail as the Oppo F9 only has a very small 'rabbit ears' on top of the camera.

According to the Electronic Times (South Korea) citing industry sources, Apple is also intending to give up "rabbit ears" on the iPhone in 2019. But there is no information on whether the company will switch the front camera and sensors. through any position.

"Rabbit ears" (notch - part containing the front camera and sensors) made its debut on Essential Phone but this detail wasn't much noticed until it appeared on the iPhone X and became the design trend of the year. 2018.
