Windows 10 October 2018 update can be considered as the "most difficult child" of Microsoft when constantly encountering numerous problems since its launch, until the peak is when Microsoft was forced to revoke this update. Because users react violently to dozens of large and small errors, from system errors that cause data loss to security holes. Microsoft then stopped releasing Windows 10 October, fixed bugs and gradually deployed some additional patches. It seems that this painful 'journey' has finally come to an end, and Microsoft asserts that the 1809 build was once again ready to be widely deployed to all Windows 10 devices across world.

"Based on the data and feedback we have received from hundreds of thousands of users, OEMs, ISVs, as well as partners and commercial customers, Windows 10, version 1809 are ready to move to the stage. With this decision, the Windows 10 release page will now display the Semi-Annual Channel (SAC) for version 1809. We will continue to contact our partners to speed up. "The transition from a single-target release state to a wide-

ranging deployment," Microsoft Windows development team representative said in a statement.

Previously, Microsoft released Build 1809 for a small number of targeted devices to determine that the current problems were resolved and no new issues were raised on this build. This is also the reason why some Windows 10 users running on version 1803 complain that they have not been provided with update 1809.

Currently, Build 1809 is beginning to be widely deployed, it will be available to all Windows 10 users worldwide. If your computer is still not running on this version, try accessing Windows Update, checking for new updates to see if Build 1809 has been sent to your device.

Although Microsoft's announcement states that Microsoft's Windows 10 release page has been updated to show that version 1809 is categorized as 'Semi-Annual Channel', as shown in the image below. , but through actual testing, we still haven't seen this change.
