

Windows 11 will no longer have the 'blue screen of death' error

You will never experience the blue screen of death after upgrading to Windows 11 because Microsoft turns it into a black screen.

The Blue Screen of Death is a Windows message that indicates that your computer has encountered a serious error that cannot be fixed by normal means. This error usually occurs when the computer's hardware has a problem.

A problem has been detected and windows has been shut down to prevent damage
to your computer.

The problem seems to be caused by the following file: SPCMDCON.SYS

PAGE_FAULT_IN_NONPAGED_AREA

If this is the first time you've seen this stop error screen,
restart your computer. If this screen appears again, follow
these steps:

Check to make sure any new hardware or software is properly installed.
If this is a new installation, ask your hardware or software manufacturer
for any windows updates you might need.

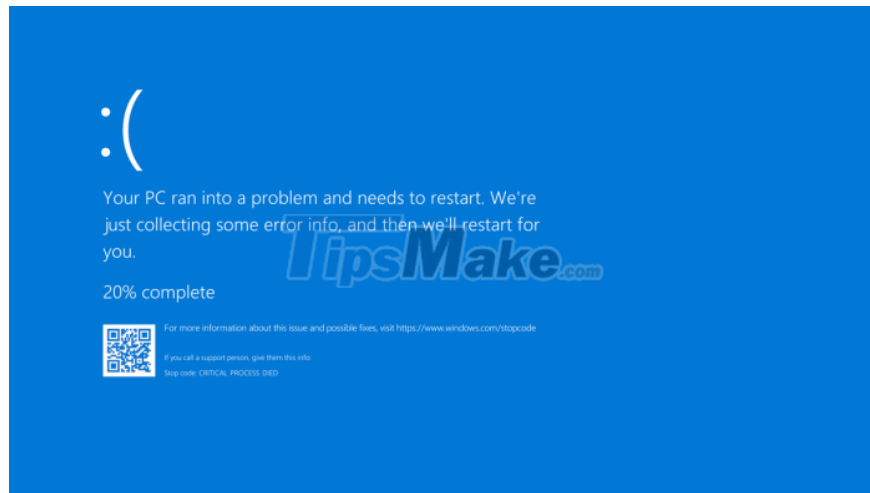
If problems continue, disable or remove any newly installed hardware
or software. Disable BIOS memory options such as caching or shadowing.
If you need to use Safe Mode to remove or disable components, restart
your computer, press F8 to select Advanced Startup options, and then
select Safe Mode.

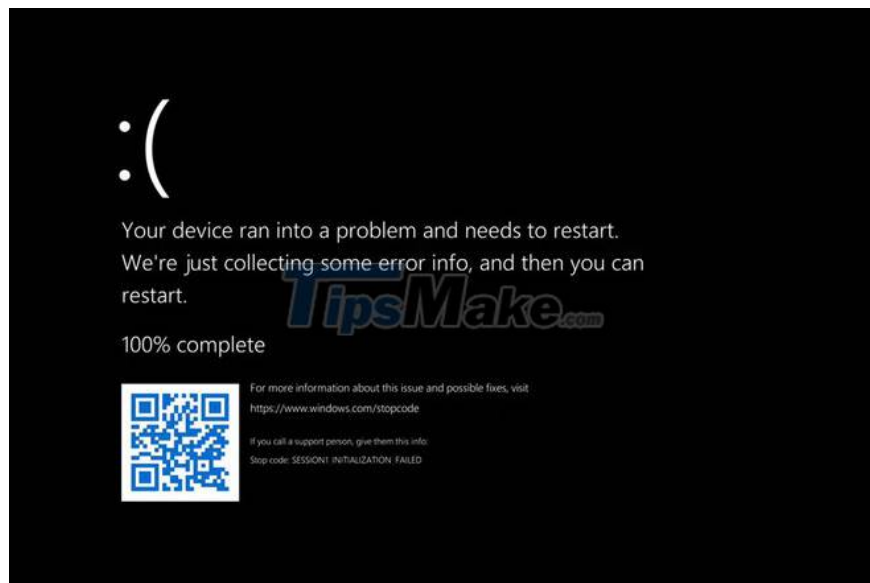

However, with Windows 11, you will never see the blue screen of death again because Microsoft turns it into a brand new black screen. The sad face will still appear with a QR code indicating the error so you can find out about the error online and fix it.



This is the first major change to the Windows BSOD screen since 2012 when Windows 8 added a sad character sidebar.



With this change, Windows 11 is being shown by Microsoft as a new operating system with many changes. It is expected that users will start updating Windows 11 through the Windows update mechanism in October.
