The next time you order drinks, try to observe these round holes to find your drink in many different cups!

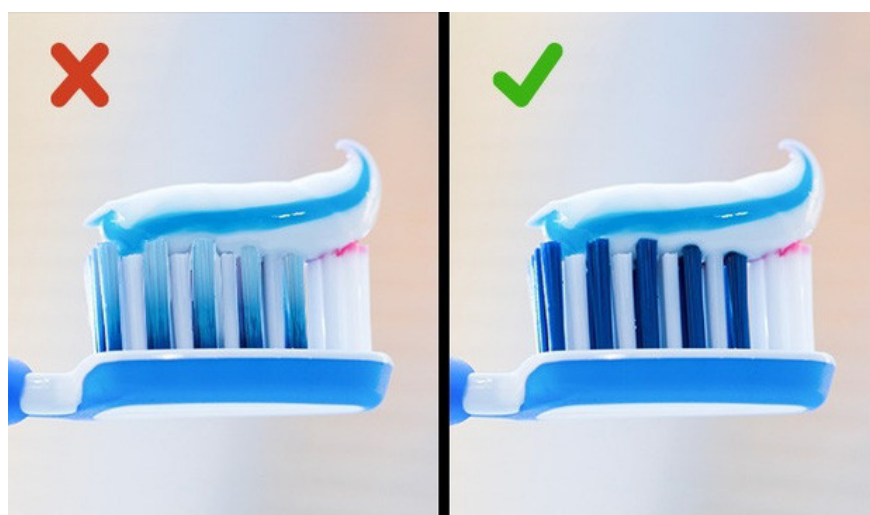
2. Suspended clothes made of pine tree wood

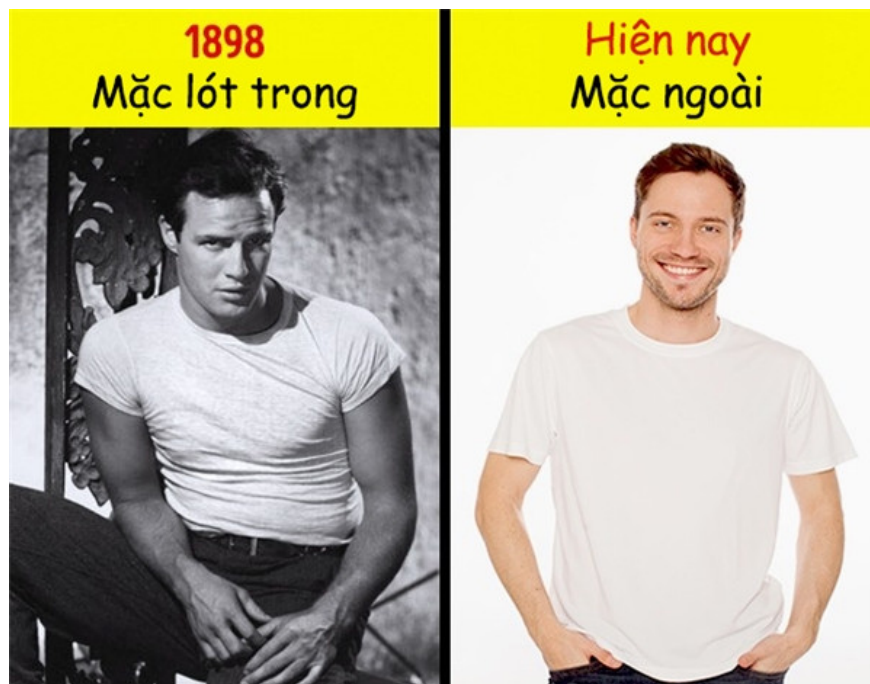
5. Sleeping pillow
